Putnam Early Voting Points to High Election Turnout

Predicting an outcome is easy when making like comparisons. Predicting election turnout for the Tuesday, November 5 General Election in Putnam County is not easy because like comparisons are not possible.

Early voting for this year's Presidential Election cannot be compared to early voting in the last Presidential Election. The 2020 election early voting and election day voting numbers were distorted by the large number of mail-in ballots. The 2020 General Election saw a large number of absentee ballots because of the COVID pandemic. The first five days of early voting this year's election cannot be compared to the same numbers which were registered in 2020.

That said, it is still possible to project a very high turnout on November 5 based upon the first five days of early voting (Oct. 23-26 and Oct. 28). Putnam County Clerk Brian Wood reported 6,921 early voters during the period. Wood stated that typically early voting is heaviest on the first day of the early voting period

and on the last three days of the period with the first five day totals and the second five day totals being about the same. In 2020, there were 11,328 early voters during the ten-day period. In 2020, there were around 5,000 mail-in ballots. This 5,000 consists approximately 4,200 voters who would have voted early or upon election day. The balance of in-person voting to early voting suggests that the 2020 early voting total was suppressed by 1,900. If 2020 had not been influenced by COVID, there would have been 13,228 early vote ballot cast in the ten-day period. The first five days of early voting for 2020 would have been half of that number, 6,614. The 6,912 which were recorded this year is 4.5% higher the projected 6,614 in 2020.

The turnout of registered voters in Putnam County in 2020 was 71.5%. The math, based upon 2020 numbers, projects a Putnam voter turnout of 74.7% on November 5. The 71.5% turnout in Putnam for the 2020 General Election is the highest in the modern era. We will know if 71.5% remains highest come November 6.

Greenlee, a memoir which was written in 1963 by a man from Mason County. In the story, the author wrote about his first trip to the county seat of Mason County, and all of the sights that he saw there.

Jaynetta Walden of Poca, a reenactor with an interest in early American history, wore a frontier era dress and discussed women's clothing of the 1700's.

Appalachian Power Issues Meeks Mountain Trails Update

Appalachian Power representatives are reviewing alternative solutions to rebuild 20 miles of transmission line as part of the Bancroft - Milton Transmission Line Rebuild Project in Cabell and Putnam counties.

The project team hosted two open houses in August to introduce proposed electrical upgrades and received extensive feedback from the community.

"Public involvement is a critical part of our line routing process. This process allowed our project team members to hear directly from landowners and community members about their specific concerns about their properties and the Meeks Mountain Trails," said George Porter, Appalachian Power spokesperson.

The project team continues to review input on all route options presented in August and develop new or modified line route options that avoid Meeks Mountain Trails. The line routing process requires a thorough review of several criteria, including community feedback, to develop viable solutions to meet the electrical need and mitigate community and landowner concerns.

Electrical upgrades in this area, including rebuilding 20 miles of the Bancroft - Milton transmission line and building a new substation in Hurricane, are critical to maintaining electric reliability in these rapidly growing communities. Before the project team can present the modified route options to the public, additional field studies and

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due diligence are needed to ensure options are viable and reflect the community's feedback.

The project team plans to host additional open houses in spring 2025 to collect input on the modified route options for the transmission line. Landowners along the modified route options and existing transmission line route can expect to receive more information about the open houses once the dates are confirmed. Community members who attended the previous open houses and provided an address to the project team can also expect to receive notification of the open houses.

"We appreciate the community's patience through this process," said Aaron Walker, Appalachian

Power President & COO." The Teays Valley area and surrounding communities have seen tremendous growth in recent years, and this project is necessary to deliver reliable power to our customers. We look forward to taking additional route options to the community, gathering more feedback, and finding the electrical solution that fits this community."



Grape and Brussels Sprout Slaw

Servings: 6

- 1 bag (12 ounces) shredded Brussels sprouts
- 2/3 cup finely shredded red cabbage
- 2 cups red Grapes from California, halved lengthwise
- 1/2 cup finely diced red onion
- 3 scallions, trimmed and thinly sliced
- 2 tablespoons rice vinegar
- 1 1/2 tablespoons honey
- 1 teaspoon fresh lemon or lime juice
- 1 teaspoon low-sodium soy sauce
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 tablespoon toasted (dark) sesame oil
- freshly ground black pepper, to taste
- 3 tablespoons toasted sesame seeds

In large mixing bowl, combine shredded sprouts, cabbage, grapes, onion and scallions.

In small bowl, whisk vinegar, honey, lemon or lime juice and soy sauce. Drizzle in olive and sesame oils while whisking. Toss well with slaw mixture. Chill 45 minutes to incorporate flavors. Season with pepper and sprinkle sesame seeds on top.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE: That at a duly held meeting, The Board of Education of the County of Putnam adopted and entered of record the following Bond Election Order:

BE IT ORDERED AND ENTERED OF RECORD BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE COUNTY OF PUTNAM:

It appears to The Board of Education of the County of Putnam (the "Board"), from the experience of the Board in operating the schools in the Putnam County School District (the "School District"), and after carefully reviewing and considering information available to the Board and the needs of the School District regarding the desire for an improved educational program and facilities, the Board does accordingly find, determine and order that:

1. Conditions now exist in the School District, including but not limited to inadequate, obsolete, and inefficient school buildings and related facilities, as well as excessive maintenance costs, that are impacting the proper and adequate education of students to prepare them for gainful employment or further education, and those adverse conditions, together with due regard for proper health and safety standards, make it necessary that the Board acquire, enlarge, equip, extend, furnish, improve, construct, and renovate certain school buildings and facilities, all as further described and shown below (collectively, the "Projects"); and such conditions and requirements have been found and are hereby determined to exist, pursuant to investigation caused to be made by this Board.

2. The funds derived from current levies which this Board is now authorized by law to lay, after providing for administration of the affairs of the Board and meeting the current expenses thereof required by law, are insufficient to finance the Projects and, therefore, bonds should be issued to provide funds for such Projects.

3. To obtain the required funds for the Projects, it will be necessary to incur debt and issue bonds for the construction, acquisition, improvement, equipping and furnishing of the Projects. Information provided to the Board, including estimates of engineers engaged by the Board, show that the School District must spend at least the sum of Seventy Four Million Eight Hundred and Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$74,870,000) for such purposes, including the proceeds of the sale of the general obligation bonds hereinafter referenced (the "Bonds") in the amount not to exceed Forty Nine Million Eight Hundred and Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$49,870,000), all for the general purposes of providing adequate, safe, efficient and convenient educational facilities for the School District, including costs of issuance and sale of the Bonds, all as further described below.

4. As of the date hereof, the current aggregate valuation of the taxable property in the School District, as shown by the last assessment thereof for State and County taxation purposes, is \$4,123,728,624 and valuation of each class of property within the School District is as follows:

5. As of the date hereof, the Board and the School District have outstanding bonded indebtedness in the aggregate principal amount of \$1,450,000, for which taxes have been levied, and outstanding unbonded indebtedness in the aggregate principal amount of \$2,690,000. The maximum bonded indebtedness the Board may incur is \$206,186,431. Accordingly, Bonds in the amount of \$49,870,000, being less than five percent (5%) of the value of such taxable property as ascertained by the last assessments thereof for State and County taxes, may be issued and sold without violating any constitutional or statutory provision.

6. Bonds in the denomination of \$5,000.00 each, or integral multiples thereof, aggregating up to an amount not to exceed \$49,870,000 should be issued and sold, the proceeds of which shall be used for the Projects in the manner hereinafter described; provided, however, that in the event that any part of the Bond proceeds should not be needed for completion of the Projects, such unneeded funds shall be deposited with the Municipal Bond Commission of West Virginia to be used solely for the purchase of any Bonds of this issue outstanding at not more than the par value thereof plus accrued interest to date of purchase or for the payment of such Bonds and the interest thereon at the maturities thereof. The proceeds of sale of the Bonds will not be used except as herein specified; provided, that the Board shall have the authority to pay matured interest and the principal amount of any matured Bonds from Bond proceeds until levy money is available to pay the same and thereafter, the Bond proceeds expended for this purpose shall be reimbursed from levy money collected.

7. The question of incurring said debt and issuing said Bonds and all other questions properly connected therewith shall be submitted to the voters of the School District at the general election to be held on Tuesday, November 5, 2024, and the commissioners and clerks for holding said election, at each of the legally established voting precincts in Putnam County, West Virginia, shall be those commissioners and clerks designated, appointed and certified by the County Commission of Putnam County, West Virginia in connection with said general election.

8. The Bonds shall bear interest at a rate or rates not exceeding the rate of six percent (6.00%) per annum, with interest payable semiannually and principal payable annually, but it is hoped that the best bid for the Bonds will provide a lower interest rate (which could result in somewhat lower levy rates needed to pay the Bonds and the interest thereon); and the Bonds shall be payable for a maximum term of fifteen and one-half (15.5) years from the date thereof.

9. The Bonds shall be issued only in book entry or registered form as to principal and interest in compliance with the United States Internal Revenue Code Sections 103 and 149 (26 USCA 103 and 149), as amended, and as authorized by the West Virginia Public Obligations Registration Act, Article 2F, Chapter 13 of the Code of West Virginia of 1931, as amended (the "Code").

10. The proceeds of the Bonds, if authorized by the voters, including any grant or grants from the School Building Authority of West Virginia and/or other Federal, State, local, lease purchase, and/or private funds, are to be expended on the following Projects: [See the table on the following page.]

Notwithstanding any provision of this Order to the contrary, the issuance of the Bonds (i) is subject to (a) the School Building Authority of West Virginia's timely award or commitment of funds to the Board in amounts sufficient, in the Board's reasonable discretion, to undertake and complete the Projects and/or (b) the availability of other funds to the Board (including federal, state, local, lease purchase proceeds and/or private funds from any source or any combination thereof), in amounts sufficient, in the Board's reasonable discretion, to undertake and complete the Projects, and (ii) is further subject to any and all other necessary actions, approvals and consents required by applicable law. If the voters of the School District approve the incurring of said debt and the issuance of said Bonds, the Board will lay annually upon the assessed valuation of all the taxable property within the School District an additional levy sufficient to provide funds for the payment of the annual interest upon the Bonds as such interest accrues semiannually and the principal of the Bonds at maturity, for which purposes a levy upon each \$100 valuation, based upon the last assessment of such property for State and County purposes, will be required as follows:

For the avoidance of doubt, the levy rates set forth above are in addition to any other levies currently in place in the School District.

13. In the laying of said levy, the assessment levy authorized to be laid by said Board by the Constitution of West Virginia and the statutes enacted pursuant thereto shall not be exceeded; provided, however, that said rates hereinabove set forth may, whenever necessary, be exceeded in making the annual levy for interest and principal of said Bonds within statutory and constitutional limitations; and that in the levy, collection and disbursement of taxes within constitutional and statutory limitations, this levy for interest and principal shall have preference over all other taxes collected by said School District for any purpose whatsoever, except the payment of the interest and sinking fund requirements on any other bond issue or issues which lawfully have been authorized heretofore or which may be authorized hereafter.

14. If the debt represented by this Bond issue shall be approved by the voters, such Bonds, together with all existing bonded indebtedness heretofore incurred under Section 1, Article X, of the Constitution, will not exceed in the aggregate five percent (5%) of the taxable property in the School District ascertained in accordance with Sections 8 and 10, Article X, of the Constitution of this State and will be payable from a direct annual tax levied and collected in each year on all taxable property in said School District, sufficient to pay the principal and interest maturing on said Bonds in each year, which maximum rates are provided for tax levies for school districts on the several classes of property in Section 1, Article X of the Constitution, but in the same proportions as such maximum rates are levied outside the limits fixed by Section 1, Article X of the Constitution.

15. If the debt and Bonds submitted to the voters shall be approved, by virtue of Section 8, Article X of the Constitution, known as the "School Bond Amendment," and the enabling legislation enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia Regular Session, 1951, amending and reenacting Sections 3 and 4, Article 1, Chapter 13, of the Code, and the enabling legislation enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia, Regular Session, 1959, amending and reenacting Section 4 and adding Section 34, Article 1, Chapter 13, of the Code, levies hereinbefore provided will not violate any constitutional or statutory provisions of this State establishing maximum levies, said levies herein provided shall be levied and allocated each year for the purposes of discharging the interest and principal of the Bonds to be authorized, and for such purposes shall be laid separate and apart from all other levies made for all other purposes of the School District, and the Board does further find that after laying and allocating said special levies for payment of principal and interest requirements of said Bonds, there will be, out of the levies authorized by law and apportioned for current expenses, a sufficient levy authorized by law which, when added to other income, will be sufficient to carry out the proper requisite functions of said Board and of said School District.

Notice of this question shall be given by publication of this Order at least once each week for two (2) successive weeks before the election and within fourteen (14) consecutive days next preceding such general election in The Hurricane Breeze, a qualified newspaper of primary circulation in the School District as certified by the Secretary of State of the State of West Virginia.
