## WV American Water Files for \$59 Million Rate Increase

West Virginia American Water Company has asked the Public Service Commission of West Virginia to approve a 2-part water service increase to its 172,000 customers in Putnam and 21 other counties.

If approved, the proposed increase will become effective March 1, 2026. The water company proposes \$46,376,033 in additional annual net water revenues over present rate revenues, or an overall increase in revenues of approximately 22.0 percent. The \$46,376,033 increase in annual net water revenues consists of an increase in base rates of \$58,935,579 and a decrease in distribution system improvement charges of \$12,559,546 in annual revenue.

The utility proposes implementing the increase

in two steps with first step rates effective on March 1, 2026, and the second step rates effective on March 1, 2027. The step 1 increase is approximately 15.1 percent over present rate revenues. The step 2 increase for water service is approximately 5.7 percent.

WV-American is further proposing a Universal Affordability Discount Tariff for water that includes multiple tiers of discounts based on different levels of household income stated as multiples of Federal Poverty Level ("FPL"). The driving principle behind the Company's proposed Universal Affordability Discount Tariff is to provide all participating customers discounts such that the expected bill for basic water service will be no more than 3% of

## WVDNR Urges Public to Leave Young Wildlife Alone

The West Virginia Division of Natural Resources (WVDNR) today reminded members of the public to leave young wildlife alone, noting that handling wild animals often harms the animal, spreads disease and, when done without a permit, breaks the law.

"Watching wildlife is one of the many joys of being outdoors in West Virginia," said WVDNR Director Brett McMillion. "But for the safety of everyone and the preservation of our natural resources, it's always best to leave young wildlife alone."

Touching, picking up or even approaching young animals can leave behind a human scent, which may attract predators and put the animal at risk. Contact with wildlife also increases the chance of spreading diseases and parasites such as rabies, ticks, Lyme disease and roundworms.

"We get a lot of calls this time of year about fawns, birds and baby rabbits that people think are abandoned or injured," said Vinnie Johnson, WVDNR wildlife biologist. "Most of the time, those animals are doing exactly what nature intended."

For example, does often leave fawns hidden for eight hours or longer while they search for food. These fawns rely on their camouflaged coats and

their annual household income. The maximum discount would be 60% for households earning 50% or less than the Federal Poverty Level. Households with income 50%-100% of the FPL would receive 40% discounts. Discount of 30% and 15% would be available to households with incomes 100%-150% and 150%-200% of the

FPL. The proposed rate increase could impact the City of Hurricane as the city has a purchase contract with West Virginia American. Anyone desiring to intervene should file on or before August 3, 2025 a Petition to Intervene complying with the PSC's rules on intervention in the Rules of Practice and Procedure. Anyone

desiring to protest is advised to file a written protest as soon as possible. All written protests should briefly state the reason for the protest. All protests and Petitions to Intervene should be addressed to Karen Buckley, Executive Secretary, Public Service Commission of West Virginia, P.O. Box 812, Charleston, West Virginia 25323.

Since most people don't like to mow their yard, why do they fertilize it?


Since we are a state in need of medical help, why are all the cereals filled with sugar?

### Learn from Good Examples

Hebrews 11:1-2, 4-13

Hebrews 11 opens with a definition of faith: "Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." This definition was not produced by the human mind. This definition is from the Holy Spirit of God. It is a definition, authored by God and given to us by Him with the intent that we should reflect upon these words and be moved to act upon His word.

Faith is the substance of things hoped for. Faith is characterized by substance. Faith is not an illusion. It is not virtual reality. Faith has substance and that substance consists of things hoped for. Understood of the things hoped for is the source. It is God. The faith that has substance in things hoped for is rooted in God's promises. For the elders, the patriarchs of Israel, a good report was found in believing God's promises (v. 2). God counted Abraham's faith for righteousness (Gen. 15:6, Rom. 4:5).

The second part of this definition of faith is that it is evidence of things not seen. Verse 3 explains the role of faith. Things not seen exist. Things not seen are part of human understanding. Human understanding is built upon faith. Through faith, one understands that the things which we see can be explained by things which we cannot see. It is through faith that we know that for every effect that we observe, there is a cause. It is through faith (evidence of things not seen) that we know that all that has happened was shaped by God. God (unseen) is the cause of all things seen. It is through faith that God speaks to us. The things we see are evidence of things unseen.

In the text before us we see both that which was hoped for and evidence of that which is unseen in the lives of Abel, Enoch, Noah, Abraham, and Sara.

By faith, Abel made a more excellent offering. Abel gave the firstlings of his flock and the fat thereof (Gen. 4:4). Abel gave of the first of that which he had to give. Abel gave, hoping that the firstlings of his flock would be sufficient. The excellence of Abel's offering, while not being seen by men (his brother Cain thought his own offering to be more excellent), was seen by God (v. 4). God sees the widow's mite, the offering of the heart (Lk. 21:1-4).

By faith, Enoch pleased God. Enoch possessed a testimony which pleased God (v. 5). The scripture is silent upon Enoch's testimony. Enoch pleased God by that which is only seen by Him (I Sam. 16:7, Jer. 17:10). Again, Enoch pleased God by faith.

Faith is key in one's relationship with God (v. 6). God has given all men faith (evidence of things not seen) for purpose: that we might believe that He has shaped, continues to shape, and will shape (past, present and future) all things. Through faith, men know God and know that He is a rewarder of them who diligently seek Him. Enoch most certainly possessed a testimony of diligently seeking God. Without faith, it is impossible to please God.

Noah became the heir of righteousness which is by faith (v. 7). Noah pleased God because he believed God's warning of that which would come. Because Noah acted upon God's word (evidence of things never before seen), he became an heir to the righteousness which is of God. Noah believed God's word and acted upon it.

Abraham demonstrated the substance of things hoped for and the evidence of things not seen in two differing manners. First, he acted upon God's call to go to a place that God would show him. On the second, he waited in, without receiving, the land of promise. Abraham believed God would fulfill His promise of the land to his (Abraham's) yet to be born seed.

Sara, too, believed God would fulfill His promise. Sara laughed with skepticism when she, being ninety years old, heard that she would bear the promised seed. When reminded that nothing is too hard for the Lord, she was strengthened. She bore Isaac and lived for thirty-seven more years (Gen. 18:12-14, 23:1). Sara believed that nothing is too hard for the Lord. When one believes that nothing is too hard for the Lord, one possesses the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.

"Therefore sprang . . ." (v. 12). Because of faith, because of the substance of things hoped for and the evidence of things not seen, the number of heirs of Abraham who should receive the promise is beyond a number which can be counted.

In verse 13, the writer of Hebrews was moved by the Holy Spirit to state that this number which was too great to count died in faith. They died, not having received the promises that they had seen far off.

When one dies in faith, one dies with substance — the substance of things hoped for, the substance of things seen far off. When one dies in faith, one dies persuaded of that which God has promised. When one dies in faith, one dies embarrassing that which God has promised. When one dies in faith, one dies confessing that one is a stranger and pilgrim upon the earth. When one dies in faith, one dies believing God is and God is the keeper of the promises which He has spoken.

God desires that all men should die in faith and not perish. He would have all men repent of their ways and seek Him (II Pet. 3:9). God has revealed through Abel, Enoch, Noah, Abraham, and Sara the faith which pleases Him, the faith that He counts for righteousness. God would have all men look upon themselves and see themselves by His measure.

We now see through a glass, darkly; but the day shall come, when face to face, we shall know with certainty beyond all certainty (I Cor. 13:12).

**KIDS TALK ABOUT GOD**

*Why Did The Devil Tempt Jesus?*

"The problem with opportunity is that it only knocks," writes author Michael Hodgkin. "Temptation kicks the door in."

Of course, the wily devil failed in his cunning attempt to kick down the one who said, "I am the door." But the question remains. Why did he even bother to tempt Jesus?

Satan tempted Jesus because "he wanted to take over," says Sam, 7. "The devil wanted to be the boss," says Bianca, 10. "He was jealous because Jesus was a higher boss."

After the mother of two of his disciples asked Jesus for choice seats in his kingdom for her sons, Jesus said, "Whoever desires to be great among you, let him be your servant."

Even Jesus' disciples weren't beyond grasping for power. Jesus told them he didn't come to be served, but "to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many" (Mark 10:45).

The desire to have control and boss people around is more popular than ever. If you enjoy being bossy, remember the way up in God's kingdom is the way down. Jesus washed his disciples' filthy feet.

"The devil tempted Jesus so he would depart from God," says Marci, 9. "Jesus did the right thing by quoting Scripture. The devil can't stand words from God."

Marci, you hit the mark on two counts. First, "Satan's aim was to entice Jesus to use powers rightly his, but which he had voluntarily abandoned to carry out the Father's mission," writes Bible scholar D. A. Carson. Second, Satan tempted Jesus three times, and Jesus resisted temptation three times by quoting the Bible.

"Satan tempted Jesus because he still thought he was better than God," says Valerie, 8. "The devil thought he was No. 1," adds Peyton.

Pride, pure and simple, is at the heart of the devil's fall and the temptation of Jesus. Actually, there's nothing pure and simple about pride. It's impure and complex.

The prophet Isaiah described Lucifer's fall from heaven when he quoted him as saying: "I will exalt my throne above the stars of God" and "I will be like the Most High" (Isaiah 14:13-14).

What do you do for an encore after exalting yourself above God? Act stupid, says Hill, age unknown: "In all the devil's stupidity, he kept on tempting Jesus even though he knew he would not sin."

Pride always produces stupidity because no one can carry the load of being God, except God. We're created to depend on God and to worship him.

"Satan tempted Jesus to make bread from stone, and he was very bad," says Hina, 7.

Jesus hadn't eaten for 40 days. What's wrong with turning a few stones into bread? Everything, when you've left heaven on a mission to live in total dependence on God the Father.

Satan's temptation began with a taunt, "If you are the Son of God" (Matthew 4:3). Jesus heard this same taunt during his crucifixion: "If you are the Son of God, come down from the cross" (Matthew 27:40).

The difference between testing and temptation is that the one testing you wants you to pass the test, but the one tempting you wants you to fail. God tests. Satan tempts.

Think about this: Jesus resisted Satan's temptation to turn stones into bread so that he could be the Bread of Life for all who believe in him.

Memorize this truth: "I am the living bread which came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever" (John 6:51).

Ask this question: Are you hungry for the Bread of Life?

This filing is a replacement of Case No. 24-0669-E-42T that was dismissed by the Commission on September 18, 2024. The rates, tolls, and charges proposed in this filing are in lieu of, and NOT in addition to, those proposed in the dismissed Case No. 24-0669-E-42T.

The proposed increased rates and charges were suspended by the Public Service Commission through August 28, 2025, in an Order entered on November 21, 2024. **WVDNR Announces Changes to Hunting Regulations**

The West Virginia Division of Natural Resources (WVDNR) today announced that changes to coyote, waterfowl and youth hunting regulations went into effect on May 19.

These changes, which were approved by the West Virginia Legislature during the 2025 regular session, include removing maximum caliber restrictions for night coyote hunting, increasing youth waterfowl hunter maximum age limits and providing clarification on adult supervision during special youth hunting seasons.

Small game hunters who hunt coyotes at night will no longer have a maximum caliber restriction. The WVDNR reminds hunters to always hunt safely and be aware of their target's location and what lies beyond. A safe backstop is important to avoid unintended injury to people and property.

The youth waterfowl season is now open to hunters 17 years of age or younger, expanding the previous age limit of 15 and under. The legislature also approved a change to make it clear an adult assisting a youth hunter during any special youth season may handle the hunter's firearm to provide safe handling advice and help. When assisting a youth hunter during a special youth season, the accompanying adult is still prohibited from carrying a firearm for the purpose of taking wildlife.

Youth hunters under the age of 15 who are not hunting on their own land or are participating in a special youth season must still be accompanied by a licensed adult who is 18 years of age or older.
