Hurricane City Council Meeting Previews Independence Day Celebration

The monthly Hurricane City Council meeting was not business as usual. Usual is the routine of approving minutes, budget revisions, and payment of bills, followed by reports from department heads and city officials and conduct of news business. The June 1st meeting served as a venue for eight members of the Hurricane Independence Day Celebration Royalty to introduce themselves to the council and to attendees present. The Royalty will ride in Hurricane's 4th of July Parade and participate in activities at Bridge Park following the parade. Attendees included members of Hurricane Middle School Baseball and Track teams and

Hurricane High School Girl's Track team who won State Championship honors in the Shot Put and the 4x800 relay. The Hurricane Middle Baseball team was honored for an incredible season in which they posted an 18-0 record on their way to the MVAC championship title. The team's pitching and hitting dominated opponents. HMS pitchers allowed just 15 runs on the season and the hitters producing enough runs to end 13 of the 18 games early via the ten-run mercy rule. The Hurricane Middle Track team was recognized for its MVAC championship. The Hurricane High Girl's track team set records at the State Meet with Jenna Geter winning the shot put and

the team of Ella Dye, Ella Sturm, Francy Tidd, and Sofie Zappitelli winning the 4x800m Relay. During regular business, Police chief Mike Mullins reported seizure of \$4,043 in cash and 112 gram of Fentanyl. Mayor Edwards said that the Fentanyl seizure was of sufficient quantity to kill more than one thousand individuals. City Manager Andy Skidmore reported that total expenditure for the recent street paving was about \$800,000. The council held the second reading of an ordinance which will reduce Business and Occupation Taxes. Edwards stated that the city has been able to decrease the B&O tax by small amounts in each of the last three years. Continued to Page 3

Fearing Data Center Fear

Fear of the Google Data Center which is planned for Putnam County was much on display at the May 26 Putnam County Commission meeting. Close to a dozen individuals, armed with information related to other data centers, confronted the commission with their concerns. The commission has heard expressions of opposition to the data center at Buffalo at nearly every meeting since the plan became public knowledge but has refrained from taking any action. The commission's hesitancy to act is, in my

opinion, wise. My reason is simple. The data centers of the future will house the computers of tomorrow. The cooling requirements of the quantum computers of the future will be far less than the requirements of today's computers. The cooling requirements of today's computers are orders of magnitude less than that needed just ten or 15 years ago. Fear of technology is not a good reason to continue in the status quo. Technology allows a newspaper to be produced with less than two hundredths of the man-hours needed fifty years ago. Technology can and does produce new problems but any technology which does not serve the interests of its users is doomed for extinction. Fear of the future is not good reason to dwell in the caves of the past.

Bruce McGrew Named Superintendent of Schools

The Putnam County Board of Education voted unanimously during a special meeting on Wednesday, May 27, to approve Bruce McGrew as the county's next superintendent. McGrew is currently Assistant Superintendent for Administrative Services of Putnam County Schools. His contract as Superintendent extends from July 1, 2026 to June 30, 2030. McGrew has 34 years employment with Putnam County Schools and is a graduate of Poca High School. He has been a head football coach, athletic director and principal before moving into the central office. During his employment, Putnam schools have risen academically to become among the tops in the State. Board president Chuck Hatfield said that the board was fortunate to have someone of McGrew's caliber and experience in Putnam County. Under McGrew's leadership, the county is positioned to move forward with the construction of the new Hurricane Middle School and the upgrades to athletic facilities made possible by the recent school bond passage without missing a beat.

Marshall to Host Summer Science Camps

Marshall University's College of Science will again be offering summer science camps for students in kindergarten through eighth grade in June and July. There are all-day camps for middle-schoolers and half-day camps for elementary school students.

Middle School Camps

The middle school camps go on from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and are for students in fifth through eighth grades. They're offered in partnership with the National Youth Science Academy. In other business, council approved the appointments of Jonathan Wright to the Municipal Planning Commission;

Scott Ashworth to the Building Commission; and Roger Hughes, Zachary Lauffer, Brad Ballard, Brian Linville, and Jonathan Clark to the Board of Zoning Appeals. Mayor Edwards

announced that city offices will be closed on June 19 in observance of West Virginia Day and on July 3 for Independence Day.

The following events happened on these dates in West Virginia history. To read more, go to e-WV: The West Virginia Encyclopedia at www.wvencyclopedia.org.

June 4, 1971: A former Boone County coal miner hijacked a plane from Charleston and demanded to be flown to Israel. At Dulles Airport near Washington, he allowed the passengers and flight attendant to disembark but held the pilots and flight engineer at gunpoint for hours before they disarmed him. It is West Virginia's only documented hijacking.

June 4, 1975: Clark Kessinger died in St. Albans, Kanawha County.

June 5, 1859: A great frost killed crops in Preston County. The fields were replanted with hardy buckwheat, which became a staple crop, celebrated in the annual Buckwheat Festival in Kingwood.

June 5, 1915: Four young people were killed at Rock Springs in Hancock County when the Old Mill ride caught fire.

June 6, 1919: Historian Otis Rice was born in Hugheston, Kanawha County. Rice was named West Virginia's first Historian Laureate in 2003.

June 6, 1954: Award-winning children's author Cynthia Rylant was born

in Hopewell, Virginia, but spent much of her youth in Raleigh County and earned degrees from Morris Harvey College (now University of Charleston) and Marshall University. Her first book, *When I Was Young in the Mountains* (1982), is about growing up in southern West Virginia.

June 6, 1979: One of the oddest events in state history occurred when an old Douglas DC-6 cargo plane carrying 12 tons of marijuana plummeted over a hillside at Kanawha (now Yeager) Airport in Charleston. Hundreds of bales of marijuana spewed from the plane before it caught fire. Onlookers looted much of the marijuana before law enforcement officials could dispose of it.

June 6, 1989: During the Pittston strike, about 60 miners embarked on a four-day march from Logan County to Charleston, following the reverse path of the 1921 Armed March.

June 7, 1899: Congresswoman Elizabeth

Kee was born in Radford, Virginia. In 1951, she became West Virginia's first female member of Congress.

June 7, 1905: Fiddler David Frank "French" Carpenter was born in Clay County. A notable member of a famous musical family, he learned most of his music directly from his father, Tom, the "fiddling preacher." He influenced the great fiddler and fellow Clay Countian Wilson Douglas.

June 7, 1926: An explosion at a sand mining operation in Morgan County killed six men. Their deaths were the inspiration for the ballad "The Miner's Doom."

June 9, 1915: Storyteller Bonnie Starkey (Collins) was born in Doddridge County. In her 50s and 60s, the "Belle of Doddridge County" honed her storytelling skills and became a popular entertainer at the Morris Family Old-Time Festival, Stonewall Jackson Jubilee, state Folk Festival, Mountain State Art &

Craft Fair, and Vandalia Gathering.

June 9, 1927: Karl Dewey Myers was named the state's first poet laureate by Governor Howard Mason Gore. Myers held the post for 10 years.

June 10, 1775: The Berkeley County Riflemen were organized by Capt. Hugh Stephenson of Shepherdstown, in response to a call for Revolutionary War soldiers by Gen. George Washington.

June 10, 1921: Labor leader Daniel Vincent

Maroney was born on Cabin Creek, Kanawha County. Maroney served as international president of the Amalgamated Transit Union from 1973 to 1981.

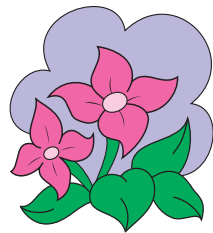

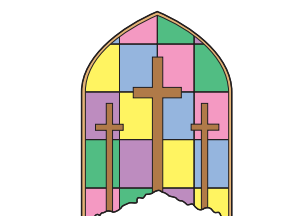

- 1 cup Dandy celery, julienned

- 1/2 medium English cucumber, thinly sliced
- 1/4 cup unsalted roasted peanuts, coarsely chopped
- lime wedges, for serving

To prepare peanut sauce: In small bowl, whisk soy sauce, lime juice, rice vinegar and honey. Add peanut butter and sesame oil. Whisk vigorously until sauce is completely smooth and creamy. Set aside.

To prepare bowls: In nonstick 12-inch skillet over medium-high heat, heat olive oil until simmering. Add shredded chicken and about 3 tablespoons peanut sauce. Stir constantly to coat chicken and heat through, about 3 minutes. Remove from heat and set aside.

- 2 large grilled chicken breasts (about 6 ounces each), sliced
- 1/2 cup hummus

To make celery tzatziki: Mix yogurt, celery, olive oil, lemon juice, garlic and walnuts, if desired. Season with salt and pepper, to taste. Stir well. Chill.

To assemble bowls: In two bowls, layer greens and cooked quinoa evenly. Top with grilled chicken.

Spoon 1/4 cup hummus on side of each bowl. Add olives, 2-3 tablespoons tzatziki and drizzle with olive oil. Sprinkle with fresh herbs.

Moses Prays for Mercy

Numbers 14:11-24

“And the Lord said unto Moses, How long will this people provoke me? and how long will . . .” (v. 11). The Lord’s questions were expressions of His anger, not questions which demanded answers. God was provoked. God’s anger was sparked because the children of Israel sought to rebel against Moses and sought to return to the land of Egypt. The twelve spies had just returned from the land of Canaan with their report. The land was filled with abundance and . . . giants. “I will smite them . . . and will make of thee a greater nation” (v. 12). This is not the first occasion on which the Lord proposed destroying Israel and making a great nation of Moses. When Israel turned from the Lord at the mount in Sinai to create and worship the golden calf (Ex. 32:10), the Lord stated that He would make a great nation of Moses. At that time, Moses asked the Lord to turn from His anger. Moses said that the Egyptians would think that He had led Israel out of the land to slay them. Moses asked the Lord to remember His promise to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob (Ex. 32:13). That which takes place in the text before us mirrors that which occurred in Exodus 32. In both Exodus 32 and Numbers 14, we see the person of Moses. Through Moses, we also see the Prophet who would be like unto Moses (Deut. 18:15).

In verses 14-16, Moses stated that the nations who witnessed the Lord’s power and presence as a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night would attribute the death of the children of Israel (the Lord’s people) to His failure to deliver upon His promise to bring them into the land that He had promised to the seed of Abraham.

Moses asked the Lord to pardon the iniquity of the people. He implored the Lord to let His long-suffering and mercy be seen. Moses challenged God to show His greatness by continuing to forgive the children of Israel (v. 19).

Why? Why did Moses petition the Lord as he did? It was not for personal gain. The Lord had stated that He would make of Moses a nation greater than the two million individuals whom He had led out of Egypt. Moses did not harbor doubt of the Lord’s power to fulfill His word. The Lord had repeatedly spoken to Moses in a direct manner and Moses had seen all that the Lord had said come to pass. Moses knew with certainty that the Lord could make a greater nation of him than the multitude which passed through the waters of the sea.

Moses did not want God to smite the people because he feared that the Egyptians and others would interpret the demise of Israel as the Lord’s inability to do that which He had promised. Moses wanted all people to know that the Lord God of Israel is a keeper of His promises and the God above all gods. Moses wanted all people to revere God because He is the one God. Moses desired that the Lord’s name be lifted up. His heart’s desire was Lord-directed, not self-directed.

These things are recorded such that believers might know the Lord in a more perfect way. The Lord’s promise of the land of Canaan to Abraham’s seed was not dependent upon His long-suffering and mercy. Moses was of Abraham’s seed. The Lord could have fulfilled His promise to Abraham through Moses. These things are recorded such that men might recognize the Prophet like unto Moses and do according to the words which the Prophet should speak.

In verse 20, we see God’s long-suffering and mercy with clarity. The Lord pardoned Israel as Moses had asked. Moses had asked the Lord to forgive the iniquity of the people as He had done from the coming out of Egypt until now (v. 19). The Lord’s forgiveness is not one-and-done. The Lord is a giver of second chances. New Testament believers, like the children of Israel, fail to love Him as He loves us. We rejoice in that God gave His only begotten Son upon the cross as payment for our every sin. We rejoice in that He is faithful and just to forgive our sins and clean us from all unrighteousness when we confess our iniquities (I Jn. 1:9).

In verse 21, the Lord swore to Moses that as surely as He is, the earth shall be filled with His glory. New Testament believers have been called to make His glory known. We are to go, and to teach, and to baptize in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit (Matt. 28:19).

While the Lord pardoned and forgave the people as Moses had petitioned, there would be everlasting consequences for failing to trust in Him, the Lord God. All who had seen the Lord’s glory and miracles and tested His long-suffering and mercy would not see the land which He had promised Abraham, Isaac and Jacob (v. 22). Only two of all of adult age, Caleb and Joshua, would see the land.

“But my servant Caleb, because he had another spirit with him, and hath followed me fully, him will I bring into the land whereinto he went; and his seed shall possess it” (v. 24). The spirit which was in Caleb that was absent in the others was the spirit of belief. Caleb believed that the Lord had given the land to the children of Israel. Caleb acted upon his belief. He urged the people to go into the land and possess it (Num. 13:30). Caleb’s belief would be rewarded. The seed of Caleb would possess the land because God is a rewarder of those who believe Him.

New Testament believers have come to God, believing that He is, and that He is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him (Heb. 11:6). Let us diligently follow our calling. Let us declare His glory to all.

What Can We Learn from the Crucified Body of Jesus?

“If someone poked me with a spear, I’d be mad,” says Jake, 8. “Jesus just let them do it. That’s amazing.”

Jake is right. What happened to Jesus’ body after he died on the cross reveals not just his suffering, but the depth of his love and the truth of who he is. In John 19:31-37, we read how Roman soldiers came to break the legs of the crucified men so they would die faster. But when they came to Jesus, they saw he was already dead. So instead, one soldier pierced his side with a spear.

The request to break their legs came from the Jewish religious leaders. They didn’t want the crucified bodies left on the cross during Passover, so they asked Pilate to speed up their deaths. Their cruelty wasn’t just physical; it was spiritual blindness. In trying to protect their religious holiday, they were killing the very one the holiday pointed to.

“Jesus was already dead because he chose to give up his life,” says Clara, 10. “He was in control the whole time.”

When the soldier pierced Jesus’ side, blood and water flowed out. This wasn’t just a random event. It showed that Jesus was really dead, not just passed out or pretending. Some doctors say the blood and water could be signs that Jesus died from a broken heart, which is a real physical event caused by intense emotional and physical stress.

“When Jesus’ side was pierced, it showed that God’s promises were coming true,” says Leo, 10.

John tells us that all of this happened to fulfill Scripture. “Not one of his bones shall be broken” and “They shall look on him whom they pierced.” God had already written this story through the Old Testament, and Jesus fulfilled every detail. The unbroken bones point to the Passover

lamb, whose bones were not to be broken. Jesus is the true Passover Lamb.

And the piercing? It reminds us of Zechariah 12:10, where God says his people will look on the one they pierced and mourn. That moment came for some like the Apostle Paul, who later realized Jesus is the promised Messiah who allowed himself to be sacrificed for our sins.

“The crucified body of Jesus proves he really died for us,” says Ava, 12. “It wasn’t a trick. He gave everything.”

Some people try to explain away the resurrection by saying Jesus didn’t actually die. But John, who was there, makes it clear: Jesus died. He saw the blood and water. He saw the spear. He saw it all, and he wrote it down so that we would believe.

The crucified body of Jesus also shows us the seriousness of sin. If sin were no big deal, Jesus wouldn’t have gone through such pain. But because God is just, sin had to be paid for. Jesus took that payment on himself.

“Jesus didn’t just take my place,” says Natalie, 11. “He took my punishment.”

That’s why Christians look to the cross not with sadness, but with thankfulness. The cross shows us the cost of our salvation and the love of the one who paid it.

Think About This: The crucified body of Jesus shows his power, his love, and his complete obedience to the Father’s plan. It’s not just history. It’s the center of our hope.

Memorize This Truth: “But one of the soldiers pierced His side with a spear, and immediately blood and water came out” (John 19:34).

Ask This Question: When you picture Jesus’ crucified body, do you see the depth of your sin or the greater depth of his love for you?
