Long known for providing the get-up-and-go for many of Toyota's most popular vehicles, Toyota West Virginia (TMMWV) announced on Thursday, November 11, a new \$240 million investment to add a dedicated production line of hybrid transaxles.

The new hybrid transaxle line investment will provide new equipment and

operational upgrades to modernize the facility. One important result of the new line is that it will allow TMMWV team members to diversify their skillset and play a larger role in Toyota's future producing electric vehicles in North America.

“Toyota West Virginia

is preparing for future market needs as demand increases in the area of vehicle electrification,” said Srini Matam, president of TMMWV. “The investment will fund targeted improvements that will increase our flexibility and competitiveness, allowing

us to be in a better position to directly respond to shifting customer demand for higher efficiency vehicles."

Hybrid vehicle systems combine two separate sources of propulsion or motive power, such as an internal combustion

to four lanes has been an ongoing project since the collapse of the Silver Bridge over the Ohio River at Point Pleasant in 1968. Before the bridge fell, U.S. 35 carried traffic through Mason and Putnam counties on what is now State Route 62.

“Route 35 has been a major infrastructure priority for me since I was

first elected to the House of Representatives, so I'm elated to see it finally come to completion," Senator Capito said. "This project is the culmination of years of federal, state, and local teamwork."

Senator Capito has personally secured \$105 million in congressionally directed spending for

The Centennial History of Hurricane

Meet Some of Hurricane's Oldest Families

In 1988, The Centennial History of Hurricane, WV was published to commemorate the town's 100th anniversary. Since the Centennial History is now out of print, the Breeze is reprinting articles from the book as space allows. This week's selection will be the 219th installment of the Centennial History.

Andrew Van Spurlock was born July 12, 1849, at Griffithsville, West Virginia. He enlisted in the Confederate Army in 1862 at the age of 13, along with two of his brothers, John Henry (age 15) and Thomas (age 14). When the quartermaster was about to shorten their uniforms with scissors, young Thomas was said to have interrupted, saying, "Never mind the alterations. I plan to stay in the Army till this

Take the Best Shot at Preventing Accidental Poisonings While Hunting

When the fall chill hits the air, hunters take to the woods for hunting season. The West Virginia Poison Center recommends these safety tips for hunters and their families.

Gun maintenance
Gun cleaning products can be dangerous if swallowed. Liquid gun blue products are particularly harmful as they can cause serious burns and life threatening injury. Store all gun related products in locked cabinets up, away, and out of sight of children and pets. When products are out and in use, keep children and pets away to prevent accidental exposure while the user is busy. Adults can avoid injury while using these products by wearing protective gloves and washing their hands after use. Make sure to get rid of used bottles and cleaning rags in a place where children and pets cannot get them. Even a small amount can cause harm.

Ammunition
Swallowing lead bullets could put a person at risk for lead poisoning. Keep all ammunition, guns, and reloading supplies locked up, away, and out of sight when not in use. Wash hands after handling all supplies.

Waterproofing supplies
Waterproofing supplies can cause breathing difficulties if used incorrectly and can be toxic if swallowed. Use waterproofing products in well ventilated areas away from children and pets. Make sure the item is completely dry before storing inside an enclosed

space.
Carbon monoxide
Carbon monoxide is an invisible killer. Hunters can be exposed to carbon monoxide if they are using generators, heating products, or cooking devices in enclosed or unventilated spaces, like a tent. To prevent carbon monoxide poisoning, follow product directions for use in well ventilated areas.

Game handling
After killing wild game, properly field dress and cool the meat as soon as possible to decrease the risk of food poisoning. Be sure to cook all game meat thoroughly and do not allow it to sit for prolonged periods without proper storage.

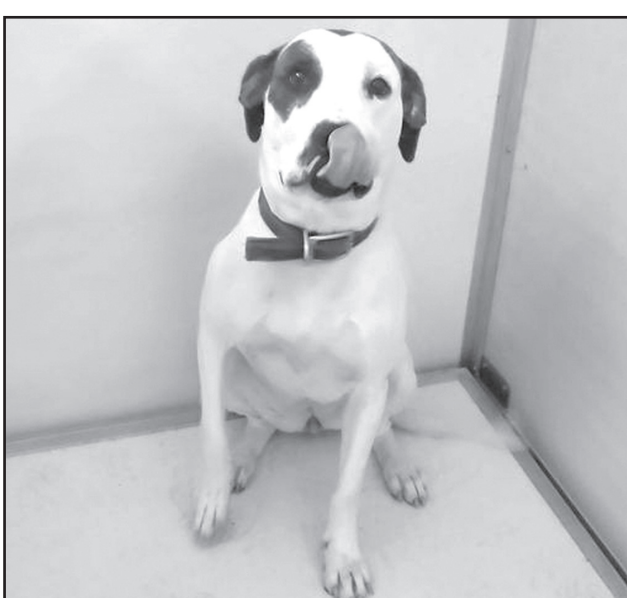

trouble ends, so I’ll just grow into the uniform.” Andrew was captured in 1864 near Lexington, Virginia, and later released.

When the Civil War ended, Andrew returned to Griffithsville where he married Minerva Hager. To this union were born four sons and five daughters: Belva Dora (1869-1871), Leora (1871-1954), Rachel (1874-1890), William Leander (1878- 1966), Victor (1881- 1943), Emma Jane (1885- 1952), Benjamin Franklin (1886-1970), Froude Homer (1889-1964), and Margie (1894-1960).

About 1900, Andrew moved from the Trace Fork area to Putnam to Hurricane, where he practiced his trade as a black smith. Sometime prior to World War I, he purchased and moved to a large farm about two miles east of Hurricane which surrounded the intersection of what are now U.S Route 60 and WV Route 34. He continued to blacksmith till he was past 80 years old and died in 1939. His son, Frank operated the farm.

Frank Spurlock married Tressa Holcomb in 1915. They were blessed with two sons and two daughters, all of whom are now living: Inez Victoria (1916), Wendell Esmond (1918), Wanda Adele (1923), and Eldon Franklin (1926). Frank operated the farm, a trucking business, and later a general store and service station. He died in 1970 at the age of 84. Tressa Spurlock died in 1981 at the age of 90.

Inez Spurlock married Harold Willis and they were the parents of one daughter, Joyce Ann. They operated a construction equipment and supply business in Tucson, Arizona, where Inez, now a widow, resides.

Esmond (Bud) Spurlock married Delores Westfall and to them

were born three sons and four daughters: Robert, Joseph, David, Mary, Deborah, Susan, and Jeannie. Bud served in the U.S. Army Air Force in World War II and was critically injured in a plane crash. He worked in various industrial plants and later operated furniture stores in several locations in the western states. He now resides in Clearlake Oaks, California, with his wife the former Donna Musselman, who is retired from the Bell Telephone System. Wanda Spurlock married Harry Suttle and to them were born one son, James Harry, and two daughters, Marilyn Jan and Teresa Jill. Wanda is an accountant and has been office manager for Landers Chevrolet in Hurricane for over 25 years. Harry was a barber and operated shops in St. Albans for over 35 years. He is retired and they reside in St. Albans.

Franklin Spurlock married Elene Gothard and to them were born one son, Samuel Stephan, and one daughter, Margaret Elene. Franklin served in the U.S. Navy in World War II at three Naval Air Stations and aboard the light cruiser USS Oklahoma City. He retired in 1986 as Area Director for the U.S. Department of Labor, where he had jurisdiction over West Virginia and part of Virginia. Elene was employed by the WV Department of Natural Resources. They now reside in Huntington.

Toyota Announces \$240 Million Investment at Buffalo Plant

engine and an electric motor, to take advantage of their respective benefits while also compensating for their respective limitations. While a hybrid system adds vehicle mass with the addition of components and is more complex than a conventional vehicle, the same system allows the vehicle to be more efficient and a hybrid transaxle can effectively transfer power seamlessly between the engine, electric motor and wheels in any number of combinations.

Toyota has committed to offering an electrified option across its entire lineup of both Toyota and Lexus vehicles by 2025. Advancing its production of electrified vehicles and their components, such as these hybrid transaxles, plays a part in helping Toyota to achieve its goals for carbon neutrality.

In fact, alternative-powered vehicles (APVs) – made up of hybrids, plug-ins, fuel cells and batteries – are nothing new for Toyota, as the company has put more electrified powertrains on U.S. roads than all other automakers combined and has remained the leading manufacturer and seller of APVs for 21 consecutive years.

Toyota’s West Virginia team has and continues to play an active and important role in Toyota’s manufacturing operations in the U.S., through a series of expansions and updates since it was established.

“This project is more than just a new product. It demonstrates the need for TMMWV and our path forward as we increase our powertrain capabilities to better support Toyota Motor North America’s growing manufacturing footprint by building vehicles where we sell,” adds Matam.

the Route 35 project and supported well over \$500 million in federal highway funding for the project. The final stretch of Route 35 includes eight new bridges, a new interchange, and 73,568 tons of asphalt.

Over the last 36 months, West Virginia has received 20 times more discretionary highway funds than it did during the prior five years. That funding includes a \$20 million discretionary grant for widening the I-64 Nitro-St. Albans Bridge.

“What you see here today is a tremendous

achievement,” Gov. Justice said. “I thank everybody that put into licks to make this a reality; to make all this goodness happen.”

The grand opening ceremony featured musical performances by General Admission, the Winfield High School Show Choir; the Black Knight Marching Band from Point Pleasant High School; and the Marching Generals from Winfield High School.

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
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

In small microwaveable bowl, microwave water on high 2 minutes, or until boiling. Add peanut butter and honey, stirring until mixture is smooth.



Judgment on the Rebellion

Numbers 16:23-35

Korah’s rebellion ended with the deaths of Korah and all who supported his efforts to replace Moses (God’s chosen leader)and Aaron (God’s chosen high priest).

In the text before us, we see the deaths of Korah, Dathan, Abiram and their families, and the deaths of the two hundred and fifty men of renown who offered up incense to the Lord. The manner of their deaths cannot be classified as common.

In verses 29 and 30, the Lord made it known through the words of Moses that Korah, Dathan and Abiram and all that pertained to them would be swallowed up by the earth. Immediately following their deaths, a fire from the Lord consumed the two hundred and fifty men who offered incense to the Lord (v. 35).

Moses told the people that Korah, Dathan and Abiram would be swallowed up by the earth because “these men” had provoked the Lord. The Lord was also provoked by the two hundred and fifty who offered incense before Him.

New Testament believers know why the Lord was provoked. New Testament believers know the reason that Korah, Dathan and Abiram and the two hundred and fifty gathered themselves against Moses was because they did not believe the words that Moses spoke to be of God. Evidence of their unbelief is found in their words and actions.

Note first the deaths of Dathan, Abiram, and all who appertain to Korah. In verse 26, Moses went to Dathan and Abiram and declared that those who stood with them would be consumed. On the previous day, Moses had sent word to Dathan and Abiram to come to the tabernacle of the Lord. They refused to come. They did not believe that the Lord had raised up Moses to lead the children of Israel and they did not obey. Upon hearing Moses say that the Lord would cause the earth to open up and swallow them, they stood their ground. They believed not and were swallowed up.

The unbelief of the two hundred and fifty is also evident in their actions. Korah and the two hundred and fifty were chosen by the Lord to serve in the tabernacle and to minister to all who came there to worship (see v. 9). Korah and the Levites who followed him did not believe the word of the Lord which Moses had delivered to them and to all the people. They did not believe that priestly service to the Lord was for reserved for Aaron and his sons alone. Their unbelief, however, was different from that of Dathan and Abiram.

On the previous day, Moses told Korah and the two hundred and fifty to come to the tabernacle of the Lord and to place fire upon their censers and burn incense before the Lord. They did as Moses had said to do. Unlike Dathan and Abiram, they obeyed the command of the Lord. They obeyed but, nonetheless, died an uncommon death. Why?

Why were Dathan and Abiram swallowed up by the earth while the two hundred and fifty consumed by fire? The difference in the manner of their deaths reveals a difference in the Lord’s judgment.


The two hundred and fifty placed fire upon their censers and burned incense to the Lord believing that they possessed a righteousness which they did not possess. On the previous day Moses had stated that the Lord would show them the man of His choosing and the man who shall be holy (v. 7). They heard Moses say, “ye take too much upon you, ye sons of Levi” but they believed not.

The two hundred and fifty offered up their incense (their sweet smelling righteousness) believing that their righteousness qualified them to stand before God. The Lord did as Moses said. The Lord revealed that every man among the two hundred and fifty assumed a righteousness which they did not possess. All were consumed by fire.

The word of God declares: “There is none righteous, no, not one” (Rom. 3:10). The righteousness of the two hundred and fifty was revealed by fire. All were consumed. The two hundred and fifty all believed in themselves. They did not know that their righteousness was as filthy rags.

New Testament believers, like the two hundred and fifty Levites, shall stand before our Lord and Savior. At that time, “Every man’s work shall be made manifest: for the day shall declare it, because it shall be revealed by fire; and the fire shall try every man’s work of what sort it is” (I Cor. 3:13). All that is not built upon the foundation of Jesus Christ shall be burned. Let no man be wise in this world because it is foolishness with God (I Cor. 3:19).

Let us declare the name of Him who is of the Father, the name of Him who is holy.

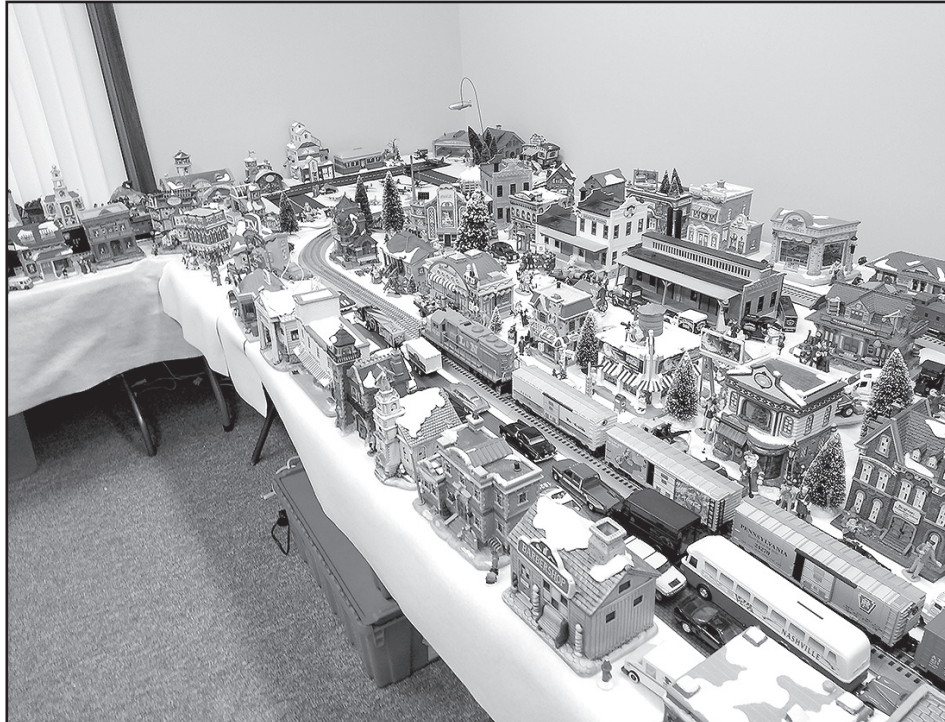
