Community Live Nativity at Take the Best Shot at **Preventing Accidental** Word of Light Poisonings While Hunting

When the fall chill hits the air, hunters take to the woods for hunting season. The West Virginia Poison Center recommends these safety tips for hunters and their families.

Gun maintenance Gun cleaning products can be dangerous if swallowed. Liquid gun blue products are particularly harmful as they can cause serious burns and life threatening injury. Store all gun related products in locked cabinets up, away, and out of sight of children and pets. When products are out and in use, keep children and pets away to prevent accidental exposure while the user is busy. Adults can avoid injury while using these products by wearing protective gloves and washing their hands after use. Make sure to get rid of used bottles and cleaning rags in a place where children and pets cannot get them. Even a small amount can cause harm.

Ammunition

Swallowing lead bullets could put a person at risk for lead poisoning. Keep all ammunition, guns, and reloading supplies locked up, away, and out of sight when not in use. Wash hands after handling all supplies.

Waterproofing supplies Waterproofing supplies can cause breathing difficulties if used incorrectly and can be toxic if swallowed. Use waterproofing products in well ventilated areas away from children and pets. Make sure the item is completely dry before storing inside an enclosed

About 1900, Andrew moved from the Trace Fork area to Putnam to Hurricane, where he practiced his trade as a black smith. Sometime prior to World War I, he purchased and moved to a large farm about two miles east of Hurricane which surrounded the intersection of what are now U.S Route 60 and WV Route 34. He continued to blacksmith till he was past 80 years old and died in 1939. His son, Frank operated the farm. Frank Spurlock married Tressa Holcomb in 1915. They were blessed with two sons and two daughters, all of whom are now living: Inez Victoria (1916), Wendell Esmond (1918), Wanda Adele (1923), and Eldon Franklin (1926). Frank operated the farm, a trucking business, and later a general store and service station. He died in 1970 at the age of 84. Tressa Spurlock died in 1981 at the age of 90. Inez Spurlock married Harold Willis and they were the parents of daughter, Joyce one Ann. They operated a construction equipment and supply business in Tucson, Arizona, where a widow, Inez, now resides.



Apple Nachos

Servings: 6

- 1/3 cup dried unsweetened cranberries or raisins
- 1/4 cup sliced unsalted almonds
- 2 tablespoons unsalted shelled sunflower seeds

3 medium green or red apples, cored and thinly sliced into 12 wedges ach, divided

- 1-2 teaspoons fresh lemon juice
- 2 tablespoons water
- 1/4 cup smooth low-sodium peanut butter
- 1 tablespoon honey

In small bowl, stir cranberries, almonds and sunflower seeds.

Layer 18 apple wedges on large plate or platter. Sprinkle with lemon juice to keep apples from browning.

In small microwaveable bowl, microwave water on high 2 minutes, or until boiling. Add peanut butter and honey, stirring until mixture is smooth.

Using spoon, drizzle half peanut butter mixture over apple wedges. Sprinkle with half cranberry mixture. Layer remaining apples over cranberry mixture. Drizzle with remaining peanut butter mixture. Sprinkle remaining cranberry mixture over top.

to Korah. In verse 26, Moses went to Dathan and Abiram and declared that those who stood with them would be consumed. On the previous day, Moses had sent word to Dathan and Abiram to come to the tabernacle of the Lord. They refused to come. They did not believe that the Lord had raised up Moses to lead the children of Israel and they did not obey. Upon hearing Moses say that the Lord would cause the earth to open up and swallow them, they stood their ground. They believed not and were swallowed up.

The unbelief of the two hundred and fifty is also evident in their actions. Korah and the two hundred and fifty were chosen by the Lord to serve in the tabernacle and to minister to all who came there to worship (see v. 9). Korah and the Levites who followed him did not believe the word of the Lord which Moses had delivered to them and to all the people. They did not believe that priestly service to the Lord was for reserved for Aaron and his sons alone. Their unbelief, however, was different from that of Dathan and Abiram.

On the previous day, Moses told Korah and the two hundred and fifty to come to the tabernacle of the Lord and to place fire upon their censers and burn incense before the Lord. They did as Moses had said to do. Unlike Dathan and Abiram, they obeyed the command of the Lord. They obeyed but, nonetheless, died an uncommon death. Why?

Why were Dathan and Abiram swallowed up by the earth while the two hundred and fifty consumed by fire? The difference in the manner of their deaths reveals a difference in the Lord's judgment.

The two hundred and fifty placed fire upon their censers and burned incense to the Lord believing that they possessed a righteousness which they did not possess. On the previous day Moses had stated that the Lord would show them the man of His choosing and the man who shall be holy (v. 7). They heard Moses say, "ye take too much upon you, ye sons of Levi" but they believed not.

The two hundred and fifty offered up their incense (their sweet smelling righteousness) believing that their righteousness qualified them to stand before God. The Lord did as Moses said. The Lord revealed that every man among the two hundred and fifty assumed a righteousness which they did not possess. All were consumed by fire.

The word of God declares: "There is none righteous, no, not one" (Rom. 3:10). The righteousness of the two hundred and fifty was revealed by fire. All were consumed. The two hundred and fifty all believed in themselves. They did not know that their righteousness was as filthy rags.

New Testament believers, like the two hundred and fifty Levites, shall stand before our Lord and Savior. At that time, "Every man's work shall be made manifest: for the day shall declare it, because it shall be revealed by fire; and the fire shall try every man's work of what sort it is" (I Cor. 3:13). All that is not built upon the foundation of Jesus Christ shall be burned. Let no man be wise in this world because it is foolishness with God (I Cor. 3:19).

Let us declare the name of Him who is of the Father, the name of Him who is holy.


