Waiting on the Judge

Valley began selling firearms at its location at 3034 Mount Vernon Road in Hurricane sometime during June of this year and is continuing to sell firearms.

Before January firearms in any zoned unincorporated area in Putnam County was not allowed. The 3034 Mount Vernon Road is zoned C-1. After January 12, firearms sales in C-1 zoned areas was made possible contingent upon a business applying for and being granted a Special Permit.

Special Permits are granted after the Putnam Commission County determines that $_{
m the}$ issuance of a Special Permit is in the best Putnam interests of The County County. Commission does not act upon a Special Permit application unless it is first approved by the Board of Zoning Appeals

Valley Outdoors applied for a Special Permit. On May 27, 2021, the Putnam County *Meeting* Commission Planning notified the public through a legal advertisement that on July 1, 2021.

required Special Permit.

On July 1, the BZA Outdoors rejected the Special Permit request. The Putnam County Commission has never considered a Special Permit to allow firearms sales by Valley Outdoors or by any other business.

Following the BZA 12, 2021, the sale of ruling, Valley Outdoors appealed the BZA ruling in circuit court and was granted a stay which allowed it to continue firearms sales.

How does it happen that a business can continue to sell that which it never had a permit to sell? Maybe the circuit court judge who ordered the stay can explain it.

The sale of firearms in zoned unincorporated areas of Putnam County was made possible by a change in the county's zoning laws. Here is how the law was changed.

Putnam Records First Covid Deaths in Three Months

The DHHR reported Monday, August 9, that two Putnam residents COVID died infection in the most period. recent 7-day The two deaths are the first coronavirus deaths to be reported in the county since May 17. The deceased were females, ages 64 and 90. The DHHR did not disclose the vaccination status of the two individuals.

While vaccination is not 100% effective preventing Covid in infections, it is 100% effective in reducing the severity of the disease. Nearly 60% of the eligible (12 years and older) of the county's population have been vaccinated for the virus. While Putnam's vaccination is rate high (only five counties have a higher rate), the active Covid cases have increased 400% in the last 30 days. The DHHR only reports statewide hospitalization numbers. Hospitalizations throughout the state have

rocketed from 19 on June

30 to 101 on August 9, a

432% increase.

The vaccination rate in Putnam among the most vulnerable, the 65 years and older group, is 89.8%. The vaccination rate for the 12-18 year old population is 32.8%. The severity of the virus is reduced for children under 12 and vaccinations are not recommended. The much advertised

Delta variant first showed up in Putnam on July 29 when the DHHR reported 3 cases. The DHHR does not routinely test for Covid variants. There were 76 new cases of the corona virus in the 7-day period ending on August 6. The DHHR reported new four variant test results during that period. To date, only 24 variant tests have been conducted on Putnam residents. Twenty tested positive for the Alpha (United Kingdom) variant and four for Delta (India) variant.

individuals Many have chosen not to be vaccinated. DHHR data reveals that 97 residents per day chose to be vaccinated between May 12 and July 1. Between July 1 and August 10, the daily average was only 28.

Second Friday The Way We Were, The Way We Are Gospel Concert By Brenda Burke

And all because two $people\ met...\ one\ day...\ a$ long time ago... and they lived happily ever after... for a long time...

At the turn of the 20th Century, in 1920, a young man was born in Putnam County. He met a young woman eventually... from that union, there are ten children (and spouses), twenty-one grandchildren (and spouses), and forty-eight great grandchildren with eleven great greats... too many for me to try to count. All because at one moment in time, two people fell in love, and the rest, as we know it was (is) history...

Mack Carylsle Searls was born on Turkey Creek, out the road from Hurricane, in August of 1920. I can't imagine what that must have been like because, thankfully, I wasn't born yet. There would have been so much going on in the world outside of Turkey Creek. One important event was that the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution was passed during the month Mack was born... giving every citizen the right to vote. That was an important time in America, but I am sure nothing was as important as the birth of

that son. The population of our country was 106, 021, 5376... one more in the Searls family, a dynasty somewhat in West Virginia, Putnam County, Hurricane... and then there were more... many more... the U. S. population would grow in some part due to this young man.

On Clymer's Creek, nine years later, a little baby girl made her entrance into this world... almost a decade after Mack Searls. Annie Bell Bird was born May 19, 1909. She would grow up to meet and marry the Searls' boy, and together, they would make a life... together... until death did part them... Clymer's Creek joins with Turkey Creek... two of my favorite places... two of my favorite people.

My friend, Linda, (these are her parents) is not positive, but she believes her parents met at Mt. Moriah Church... awww... one of my favorites... Mt. Moriah Church and a young couple. They married in March of 1927 and began their life together. Mr. and Mrs. Mack

Searls had six sons, died in April of 2000. Mack Jr., Leslie, Melvin, I have to wonder what Randy. Their daughters (four) Kathelene, Merdith, Phyllis, and Linda. All of the kids graduated from in the Hurricane area.

Mack worked at Carbide and worked a 77 acre farm just outside of Hurricane, on Rt. 34. The Searls' family raised a huge garden (feeding a huge family) of vegetables, crops of field corn, strawberries, and of course, they raised tobacco. Mack's pride and joy came from raising purebred Hereford cattle. He always had a team of fine work horses. He worked at the plant, came home and worked the farm... I am sure his children were helping

Annie's pride and joy came from being a children maintain to this delicious pies and cakes, were welcome... I know this personally, and I sat at her kitchen table many times and enjoyed the best pinto beans, corn bread, and fried potatoes. As Linda and Phyllis have told me often, "she was a wonderful mother, a peacemaker with ten fell in love, married, children—she had to be... a nurturer and loving..."


The girls remember there being company often, aunts, uncles, and cousins... friends... she made butterscotch pies... her chocolate pies wonderful... her cakes were, of course, made from scratch... ahhh... the memories...

Saturdays were spent shopping at Sumner's Department Store in town... I remember seeing the family there when my mother and I went shopping also on Saturdays... Main Street... Hurricane, West Virginia. The Searls family depended on local merchants to feed and clothe their family. We all did that. This is a valiant

family. Junior served in the Korean War; Robert was a Vietnam Veteran; Leslie was in the National Guard and went to Washington for Bay of Pigs... all of the Searls' siblings contributed to the world... making it a better place... they come from good stock... Mack

and Annie... a love story. Mack Searls died in

August of 1975; Annie



BASIC BIBLE

Jesus Corrects and Commends John Matthew 11:1-15

In verse 1, Matthew writes that Jesus made an end of commanding His disciples and began to teach and preach in their cities. The disciples were drawn to Jesus because they believed that He was the Promised One. The disciples were called for a specific purpose: they were to deliver the gospel to all who would believe. That which Jesus said in the verses before us was spoken to a much larger audience than His disciples. It is addressed to an audience that included those who had heard the message of John the Baptist and had been baptized by him.

This larger audience heard the inquiry made of Jesus by two of John's disciples. They heard John's disciples ask, "Art thou he that should come, or do we look for another?

John's question would seem to fly in the face of that which John said when he baptized Jesus (Matt. 3:3). At Jesus' baptism, John was certain that Jesus was the Messiah whose coming he was called to declare. John, now in prison and having heard the works which Jesus had done, now wondered if he should look for one other than Jesus.

Jesus' answer is for both John and the audience which heard John's question. Jesus said, "Go and show John again those things which ye do hear and see" (v. 4). Why was there need for John to be told those things a second time? When one takes a second look, one is forced to consider information that was not fully considered previously.

Jesus made the things that John had not fully considered known in verse 5. John knew that Jesus had caused the blind to see, the lame to walk, lepers to be healed, the deaf to hear, and the dead to be raised up. He knew that Jesus had preached good news to the poor (see Matt. 5:3). He knew these things but he thought Jesus might not be the Messiah. Isaiah prophesied that the Messiah would do these things (see Isa. 29:18, 61:1). It would appear that John was looking for a Messiah who would rule with a strong hand (see Isa. 40:10). There were many in the audience who looked for a Messiah who would be their king, a king who would expunge Judea of Roman rule. They, like John, needed to consider the things which Jesus had done in a different light.

In verse 6, Jesus said that those who would not be offended because of Him would be blessed. Believers are not offended. We are blessed. This is not the case, however, for those who do not believe. One is offended by that which is contrary to one's values and beliefs. Many scribes and Pharisees were offended when Jesus said that their righteousness was insufficient to enter the kingdom of heaven (Matt. 5:20).

After John's two disciples departed. Jesus addressed the audience who had heard Him say that John needed to rethink that which he had heard. As noted earlier, this audience included many who held John in high regard and were among those baptized by him. Those holding John in high regard might be offended by that which Jesus had just said.

Jesus asked the multitude why that they had been drawn to John and then supplied the answer. They believed that John was a prophet. They were drawn to John because he declared words given to him by God.

Jesus declared that John was, in deed, a prophet. Jesus then added that John was more than a prophet. John was more than a prophet because he was a prophet whose coming had been declared by Isaiah. God, through Isaiah, said "Behold, I send my messenger before thy face, which shall prepare thy way before thee" (Isa. 40:3). John was the messenger of whom

In verse 11, Jesus stated that there were none born of women greater than John the Baptist. John was second to no one in greatness. The Lord followed with a statement that would have surprised His audience. He said that the least in the kingdom of heaven was greater than John. John's greatness was not of the magnitude needed to qualify for entry in the kingdom of heaven. The least in the kingdom of heaven would be greater than John. Entry into the kingdom of heaven is not dependent upon one's greatness.

That which Jesus spoke in verses 12 through 14 is for all who have the ears to hear (see v. 15). In verse 12, Jesus said, "And from the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven suffereth violence, and the violent take it by force." Suffereth violence, biazo in the Greek, is a single word which carries the thought of being subjected to force. The violent are those who forcibly attempt to enter the kingdom of heaven. Before John the Baptist, men sought entry into the kingdom of heaven by relying upon their own effort, by keeping the law (a forceful attempt). They sought to enter on the strength of works. John preached that entry into the kingdom of heaven was dependent upon changing one's ways (Matt. 3:2). In verse 14, Jesus made it known that John's ministry was that which was prophesied by Malachi (Mal. 4:5-6). John was the Elijah whose ministry would result in a relationship that did not previously exist. That new relationship is created when one repents of one's works and comes to Christ believing that
