# **Board of Zoning** Appeals Squelches Gun Sale Request

Go to: valleyoutdoorswv.com that is what Dolores Lowe and she did not like what she found. Lowe shared her findings with the Putnam County Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA) on Thursday, July 1.

Lowe said, "When I pulled up the website and the first thing that I see is an assault rifle — I have grandkids that come to my house every other week and I felt that it puts them in danger."

The BZA was meeting to consider a request by Valley Outdoors owner Glenn Yeager for a variance to allow retail sale of firearms within 300 feet of a church, school, or residential building at 3034 Mt. Vernon Road in Hurricane.

Outdoors opened its doors to sell outdoor recreation equipment, including firearms, in mid-June. Yeager reported that a former county employee gave him permission to open the business where it currently sits and to sell firearms. Officials with the Office of Planning and

Infrastructure indicated permission given by the now former county employee, but that there was no written agreement. The former employee was terminated in March.

"When you tell somebody 'this is how something is' I'm the guy that, 'that's how it is," said Yeager. "You can't let somebody go and borrow a ton of money and then change the game."

"I have gone extraordinary lengths to protect my community, my family, I live there. I have two little girls, you really think I'm going to drag some element into there that's going to jeopardize that," Yeager told members of the BZA.

Yeager stated that he had invested \$150,000 to make the building more secure.

Citing the lack of a written approval by the former county employee to Yeager, the BZA denied the request to continue selling firearms in a 2-1 vote. Valley Outdoors can continue selling outdoor recreational equipment. The denial was strictly in regards to firearms.

My beautiful calico cat, Lilly, was born in my home in the spring of 1992, to a pregnant stray we had taken in. We had actually taken in two strays and both were pregnant. They gave birth within a couple days of each other. One of them was a young mommy who didn't take care of her babies. The other cat was accepting of the other kittens along with her own and was taking good care of them. Within a week, however, she was growling when the baby kittens nursed. Upon checking her, she was very red and inflamed. A trip to the vet found her to have mastitis. She was not going to be able to nurse anymore. I bottle fed the kittens during the day while my daughters were at school, and then when I went to work in the evenings, they would

feed them.

Lilly was the one who immediately stuck out in the bunch. She was a fuzzy ball of fluff with a distinctive black spot on the back of one foot. (That spot eventually took on the shape of a heart). Lilly was very pushy and demanding during feedings and she ate a lot. She soon became a pudgy little fuzzy ball of fluff. We gave all the kittens a home with us. They were spayed and neutered and given their vaccinations and such. Lilly initially didn't like being held much. I would pick her up and she would kick with her hind legs and squirm until put down. She was always talkative. When I was working in

the garden, I would hear meowing and look up to see Lilly crossing the yard, coming towards me. While I hoed the garden, she would stay one aisle over, supervising my work. Often, I would go to sit and rest a spell, only to find she had claimed my lawn chair for herself. We would end up sharing. Me in the chair and her in my lap. She got along well with

the other pets, but if one aggravated her, I noticed that all she had to do was give them "the look" and they would immediately back off. Everyone, myself included, knew that Miss Lilly had a mean right hook and wasn't afraid to use it, to either get what she wanted, or teach one

Marshall Health and Mountain Health Network Cardiovascular Center of Excellence are among the first in the United States and the only site in West Virginia to use, CCMTM therapy, or cardiac contractility modulation, delivered by the Optimizer® system, to treat patients suffering from heart failure. The first patient treated in West Virginia with CCM therapy received the device implant by Marshall cardiologists in June as part of a postapproval device trial for

Heart failure, a condition in which the heart slowly weakens and is not able to adequately supply oxygen-rich blood, affects an estimated 6.5 million Americans and

CCM.

CCM therapy is a

new, FDA-approved heart failure treatment proven to improve quality of life for patients who are no longer adequately responding to medications to manage symptoms or slow the progression of heart failure. The innovative therapy is the first of its kind intended to improve the contraction of the heart, allowing more oxygen-rich blood to reach the body. CCM therapy delivers precisely timed electrical pulses to the heart that are intended to improve the heart's ability to contract. CCM can be used in conjunction with medications and other

heart failure therapies. "Bringing clinical trials and innovative, proven procedures to our patients is consistent with our role as part of an academic health system," said Mark A. Studeny, M.D., an interventional cardiologist at Marshall Health, Cabell Huntington Hospital, St. Mary's Medical Center, and professor and chair of cardiovascular services at the Marshall University Joan C. "CCM therapy is a breakthrough, minimally invasive treatment option that doesn't require open heart surgery and allows patients to return to everyday activities shortly after the procedure."

The purpose of the post-approval study is to evaluate the effects of CCM therapy on patients' quality of life and heart failure symptoms, according to Rueda, an assistant professor and principal investigator on the device trial. 

down, and then climb through the window and plop down in my lap. We would often sit in the car like that for an hour or so, just cuddling and enjoy each other's company. Bagheera became suddenly and seriously ill one day, and the vet determined that she had a previously unknown congenital heart defect. They did everything they could to save her, but she didn't make it.

I missed her terribly, and one day, Lilly started meeting me at the car, and doing everything Bagheera had done. She had never done that before. She saw my sadness and she stepped in to fill that void. A few years ago, when my Mother first became ill, and I was caring for her, Lilly started wanting to come inside more and began sleeping with me. The sicker my Mom got, the more attentive and loving Lilly became. She would climb into my lap when I was watching TV and graduated from sleeping with me, to sleeping on me. She would my upper arm, and hook her paws over the edge of my shoulder. We would both go to sleep that way. If I woke up in the middle of the night, she would often be lying across my neck, and I'd have her tail as a mustache, or she'd be asleep on my chest. That went on for a few years.

When my Mother passed away last November, I was deeply affected by my grief. Lilly stayed right with When me constantly. watching TV, she no longer lay in my lap; she laid against my chest and would rub her head against my cheek, and give me kisses with her rough little tongue on my cheek. When I went to bed, she went with me and stayed right by my side, or often, ON my side. She usually was up before me, and after deciding I'd had enough time in bed, her earsplitting yowl could be heard across the house. If I waited a few minutes, she would come to get me. She'd jump on the bed, walk up my legs and my chest, and start licking

walk up on my back, or my face like a dog would, my hand in to comfort her medicine and some water imagine her cavorting my side, and plop down until I got up. She was on my back or the side of hungry and wanted her breakfast, what we called "her nummies." Just like she was as a kitten, Lilly liked to eat! Over the years, I had

to adjust her diet, because she lost all her teeth. She received wet, canned food in the mornings. She loved Friskies shreds, flakes, and bits in gravy. I would give her a base of the pâté and top it with the gravy mixture. She loved it. In the evenings, she still ate dry food. I don't know how she did it, but she swallowed it whole. The canned food was added to maintain her weight. She also had lost most, if not all, of her hearing. She learned to respond to hand gestures. 

### Hezekiah Rallies Judah's Army

II Chronicles 32:1-8, 22-23

"After these things . . . " (v. 1). After these things refers to all which transpired between II Chronicles 29:3 and 31:21. After these things consists of all that Hezekiah caused to happen during the first 13 years of his reign as king of Judah.

In the first month of his reign, Hezekiah opened the temple which his father had closed and made repairs. He refurbished the articles of worship in the temple and organized the priests and Levites such that they might sanctify themselves and cleanse the temple. He reestablished the offering up burnt sacrifices to the Lord and keeping the Passover as had been practiced in the days of Solomon.

Shalmaneser king of Assyria conquered Israel and repopulated the territory of the northern kingdom with Assyrians in the 7th year of Hezekiah's reign. The kingdom of Israel ceased to exist at that time. Hezekiah invited the remnant of the tribes of Israel that remained in the land to partake of the Passover in Jerusalem and a number responded (see II Chron. 30:6, 11). Following this Passover, the people went throughout Judah and destroyed altars to false gods and cut down the groves.

In the 14th year of Hezekiah's reign (see II Kings 18:13), "Sennacherib king of Assyria came . . . and thought to win them (the fortified cities of Judah) for himself" (v. 1b). Sennacherib thought to do to Judah as Shalmaneser had done to Israel. In verses 2-8, we see Hezekiah's response.

Hezekiah's thoughts were to make it as difficult as he possibly could for Sennacherib to accomplish his goal. It was Hezekiah's thought to stop up the springs of water that flowed into "the brook that ran through the midst of the land" (v. 4). Hezekiah sought to eliminate a natural water source upon which the Assyrians could

While making water unavailable to the enemy can be an effective tactic, stopping up ever flowing springs is not easily achieved and is, at best, a temporary deterrent. Hydraulic pressure will build and cause the pent up waters to break through and create new channels of flow. It was Hezekiah's intent that the Assyrians should not find an abundance of water when they came to besiege the city and he ordered the defenders of Jerusalem to seal up the springs.

Hezekiah then strengthened the walls of the city and constructed an outer wall which, when breached, would expose the attackers to counter attacks launched from the higher elevation of the stronger walls that had protected Jerusalem for century after century. Hezekiah "made darts and shields in abundance" (v. 5). The defenders of Jerusalem would have the weaponry needed to defend themselves.

After taking these steps, Hezekiah gathered his "captains of war" and issued words of encouragement to them. He declared that Jerusalem was stronger than the multitudes that came to fight against them because "with us is the Lord our God to help us, and to

fight our battles" (v. 8). The author of II Chronicles was moved to write: "And the people rested themselves upon the words of Hezekiah king of Judah." The defenders of Jerusalem were as well prepared to defend their city as they could possibly be. They were prepared for a battle that would never take place.

Sennacherib's plan was to lay siege to Jerusalem (v. 11). The defenders of Jerusalem would eventually find themselves without food and water and be forced to surrender. Sieges can be long in duration. The Assyrian siege of the city of Samaria was three years in duration (II Kings 17:5). Sennacherib, likening the God of Jerusalem to gods made by the hands of men, announced that God would fail to

deliver Jerusalem from his hand (v. 14). Hezekiah's preparations would be insufficient to endure a siege of three years and Hezekiah knew it. Hezekiah called upon the Lord (v.

20). The Lord heard his prayer. Sennacherib would return to his own land (v. 21). The siege ended because the Lord sent an angel who slew 185,000 Assyrians that very night (see II Kings 19:35). The Lord God caused Sennacherib to

return to his own land. Verse 22 states, "Thus the Lord saved Hezekiah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem from the hand of Sennacherib the king of Assyria, and

from the hand of all other, and guided them on every side." That which happened with Hezekiah was made to happen by the Lord God. Hezekiah believed that the Lord was with him and would help Judah. Hezekiah called out to the Lord and Judah was saved. The God of the Old Testament is the God of the New Testament. All who call upon Him believing, shall not perish but receive life eternal.




