Herd Immunity **Livestock Show Now Annual County Event**

With the name Putnam County Herd Immunity Livestock Show, one might surmise that herd immunity is a reference to animal health. It is not.

The Putnam County Herd Immunity Livestock Show was born in 2020, the year of Covid. The lack of human herd immunity to Covid-19 caused the 2020 Putnam County Fair to be cancelled and, with it, all 4-H project livestock

Long-time 4-H Club supporter Brian Prim, disappointed that 4-H'ers would not be allowed to show their animal projects, stepped forward to organize and sponsor a consolation livestock show which was held at the Winfield Riding Club. He named it the Putnam County Herd Immunity Livestock Show because its creation stemmed from the lack of human herd immunity to Covid. The success of the show was cause for 4-H supporters to band together and sponsor a 2nd Putnam County Herd Immunity Livestock Show on June

4 and 5. Chief sponsors

were the Prim Law Firm and Call's Meat Market. Contributing sponsors were the Mason County Fair and United Producers Livestock Market.


The event was open to all youth in Putnam, Cabell, Jackson and Mason counties wished to show their market hog, market goat, market lamb, prospect heifer, prospect feeder calf, or market steer. For a \$10 entry fee, youngsters could compete against each other in a quest to have their animal named Grand Champion, Reserve Champion or 3rd Place. Grand Champion winners received a \$500 cash prize; Reserve Champion, \$300; and 3rd Place, \$100. Winners were selected by a single livestock judge.

Livestock judges, certified to judge all classes of animals (hogs, goats, lambs and cattle), are few. Derrick Drury of Midland, Texas, was selected as the judge following a national search.

Life in early 20th Century coal towns was often harsh and unpleasant. Miners spent long hours working in the mines, an exhausting and often dangerous job, and were exploited by the big coal companies. Since the coal companies effectively owned the towns, they could evict the miners if they tried to join labor unions and fight for better working conditions. The companies employed the services of detective agencies, which essentially worked as hired thugs and mercenaries to harass the miners and prevent them from unionizing. On May 19, 1920, the conflict between coal miners

Detective Agency came to a head when a shootout broke out in the town. Prior to the Battle of


Matewan, agents with the Baldwin-Felts Detective Agency had been evicting families who had been living at the Stone Mountain Coal Camp, which was located on the outskirts of the town. After their business in the camp was over, the agents had planned to return to Bluefield, but they were stopped by Matewan Chief of Police Sid Hatfield. Hatfield was sympathetic to the miners' plight, and supported their attempts to unionize. He presented the agents with arrest warrants from the Mingo County sheriff, which caused the detectives to present their own warrant for his arrest. The mayor of the town, Cabell Testerman, inspected the detectives' arrest warrant and claimed it was fraudulent.

While this confrontation was going on, armed miners



W. W. Trent Educator William Woodson Trent (January 31, 1878-June 15, was known to legions of West Virginia schoolchildren from his scrawling signature on their report cards and other school documents. served as state superintendent of schools from 1933 until 1957. Born in rural Nicholas County and educated in the local schools, Marshall State Normal School (now Marshall University), and Columbia University (A.M., 1921), he rose through the teaching ranks to become secretary of the West Virginia Education Association (1919-27)and of the influential West

Throughout his long professional and political career, Trent maintained association close with the state Baptist Convention, and he was often a dynamic speaker at its annual meetings. After serving as president of Broaddus College and Alderson-Broaddus (1927–33), a College Baptist institution, he ran as a Democrat for state superintendent of schools in the landmark election of 1932.

(1923-27).

Upon assuming Trent almost single handedly oversaw implementation of the county unit system of public schools, in 1933 and 1934. A fierce, often outspoken defender of school teacher interests, he soon developed into one of the state's most formidable politicians.

He was reelected as state superintendent in 1936, 1940, 1944, 1948, and 1952. In several of these elections he polled

statewide than the party candidate for governor. When the Supreme Court handed down its decision ending segregation in the public schools, Trent worked with Governor William Casey Marland to integrate the state in a peaceful and speedy manner.





Jonathan Attacks the **Philistine Outpost**

I Samuel 14:1-13

"Jonathan the son of Saul said . . ." (v. 1). Bible readers briefly encounter the person of Jonathan in the chapter 13. The text before us provides a record of Jonathan's words and actions by which we may view his relationship with the Lord God. This account has been preserved as scripture such that believers may know God and be fruitful doers of His will.

In the opening verse, Jonathan stated his intent to go over to the Philistine garrison which was camped at Michmash. Verse 13 states that which took place when he and his armor bearer arrived at their destination — the Philistines fell before him and were slain by his armor bearer after him.

When Jonathan left Gibeah to go over to Michmash, he departed from his father's presence. The human author of I Samuel was moved by the Holy Spirit to make note of that which took place at Gibeah in Jonathan's absence (v. 2-3). Saul tarried under a pomegranate tree which was in the uttermost part of Gibeah in Migron. The Hebrew word which is translated as Migron means precipice. It would appear that Saul, the six hundred men with him, and the priest Ahiah were all gathered in an area that afforded limited the directions from which the Philistines could attack. This picture of defense contrasts sharply with Jonathan's plan to go to the enemy garrison.

The path by which Jonathan approached the Philistine garrison was a path that an attacking party would normally choose. Gibeah and Michmash were separated by a deep ravine (see v. 4-5). Jonathan would approach the enemy from the depth of the ravine.

The words which Jonathan spoke in verse 6, while similar to that which he said in verse 1, are notably different. In verse 6, he states the reason that he and his armor bearer should go up to the Philistines. His reason: ". . . it may be that the Lord will work for us." Jonathan made it known to his armor bearer that the fact that their force of two was not a reason to refrain from attack. The Lord can save with a few just as well as He can save with many. Jonathan's words reveal his belief and confidence in that which God would do.

His armor bearer's reply was: "Do all that is in thine heart . . . I am with thee according to thy heart." What was in Jonathan's heart? Returning to verse 1 - Jonathan's secretive departure would suggest that it was in his heart to engage the Philistines in combat, even if it were contrary to his father's wishes. Verses 8-10 reveal something a bit different. It may have been in Jonathan's heart to fight but he did not want to fight unless the Lord would be with him. In these verses, Jonathan proposed a test by which he and his armor bearer might know that the Lord would work

The two were in close proximity to the garrison. There were Philistines on the ridge top above them, well within shouting distance. Jonathan proposed purposely making their presence known to the Philistines and, then, act according to their response. If the Philistines told the two to wait while they came down to them, Jonathan and his armor bearer would stay in place. If the Philistines invited the two to come up, Jonathan and

his armor bearer would go up knowing that God would work for them. The Philistine response would determine Jonathan's course of action. How can an answer from God be the Philistine response? It cannot be unless God is the director of that response. Proverbs 21:1 states that the Lord turns the king's heart in whatever manner He chooses. If Proverbs 21:1 is true (and it is), the Lord would turn the Philistines' heart to

respond in the manner of His choosing. What God chose is recorded in verses 11 and 12. The scripture does not state that which Jonathan and his armor bearer did to make their presence known. Jonathan may have issued a challenge to the Philistines to come down and fight. The Philistines, perhaps believing that Jonathan and his armor bearer would return to their hiding places, taunted, "Come up to us, and we will show you a thing." Their taunt was God's assurance

to Jonathan. He would fight for them. It is apparent from verse 13 that the Philistines were not waiting and ready when Jonathan and his armor bearer arrived at the top of

the steep embankment. In the ensuing battle, Jonathan and his armor bearer fought from the high ground and slew 20 Philistines in the space of a half acre (v. 14) and the earth quaked and the entire garrison fled (v. 16). We know that God worked for Jonathan because of that which is

recorded in scripture. God gives the desires of the heart to them who delight in Him (see Ps. 37:4). It was Jonathan's desire to defeat the Philistines in such manner that God should receive the glory. God gave Jonathan the desires of his heart because he placed God's will before his

May we do likewise.


