County Commission upon Property Owner

Raymond Davis of meeting Charleston became the first property owner to be subjected to fines for failure to comply with an order to remedy conditions on his property at 67 Marina Park, Hurricane. Davis was given notice in January that fines of \$100 per day would begin in sixty days if he failed to clean up the cited conditions. The fines began on April 20, the date of the Commission meeting.

A second property owner, John Cook, was also given notice that he would be assessed \$100 per day fines for conditions existing at 55 Marina Park, Hurricane. The Commission, citing a request from Cook, opted to delay the assessment of fine for an additional

30 days. Commission approved a request from Bancroft Mayor Donna McKneely to have the town's corporate limits be made subject to Putnam County's Dilapidated and Abandoned Ordinance. Tuesday, Beginning April 20, anyone (even an anonymous source) can file a complaint with the DAEA Board concerning property conditions within the municipality and the DAEA Board will investigate and issue a corrective action if

necessary.

One item on the agenda for Tuesday's which $_{
m the}$ Commission did not act upon was a request to purchase property located at 6321 Poca River Road South. A grant for the purchase was approved in February of 2020 but the Commission, after determining that the property could not be developed for any purpose other than recreation, considering is now returning the grant funds to the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program. The matter was tabled to a future meeting.

In other business, the Commission adopted levy rates for the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2022. Putnam residents will be subjected to the same rates on July 1, 2021 as were in effect on July 1,

The Commission also approved a request for a letter of support for the WVDOT to proceed with a full engineering design to widening Sleepy Hollow Road in Hurricane and for the Regional Intergovernmental Council to explore funding options for the project.

In another agenda item, the Commission By Betsy Allen approved a Violence Against Women Act grant application.



basis asked him to open a shop in Hurricane, which at that time was needed. So in 1925, he started

his own shop, charging twenty-five cents for haircuts, and fifteen cents for shaves. In the span of forty-five years that he was a barber, there wasn't a man or boy who didn't come to him at one time or another for a haircut.

He had four locations. The first barber shop was in the alley behind the old post office on Main Street. From there, across the railroad on Front Street near Billups' Store, then later back to Main Street in the Conner building close to Bill Black's Grocery Store and Doc in 1972, he and his wife Raines' Drug Store. His moved to Culloden, West

last shop was in a small building he remodeled behind the house on Rhoda Street where he worked until he retired in

On August 26, 1923, he married Eunice M. Boothe of Salt Rock, West Virginia. They had two sons and two daughters, but lost their first son at the tender age of sixteen months with pneumonia.

In 1938, he joined the Hurricane Church of the Nazarene, and was a very active member. It is our belief that everyone who knew him loved and respected him. He loved to fish, hunt, meet and talk to people, but above all he loved God and his



The following events happened on these dates in West Virginia history. To read more, go to e-WV: The West Virginia Encyclopedia at www. wvencyclopedia.org.

April 22, 1908: Marshall "Little Sleepy" Glenn was born in Elkins. Glenn coached basketball at West Virginia University from 1934 to 1938 and football from 1937 to 1940. He was inducted into the WVU Sports Hall of Fame in 1992.

April 22, 2003: Activist Judy Bonds, a Raleigh County native, received the Goldman Environmental Prize for her fight against mountaintop removal. Her efforts inspired thousands and turned a local issue in West Virginia into a national cause.

April 23, 1857: Andrew Summers Rowan was born in Gap Mills, Monroe County. Rowan, a military officer, was chosen as the messenger when President McKinley wanted to send a message to Cuban General Calixto Garcia. The 1899 pamphlet, A Message to Garcia, made the incident

April 24, 1865: The McNeill's Rangers surrendered to Union troops at New Creek (now Keyser). The Confederate guerrilla force probably

never numbered more than 100 men at any time, but they managed to do damage to Union operations.

under Gen. William "Grumble" Jones advanced through Greenland Gap, a deep pass through New Creek Mountain in Grant County. The Confederates encountered 87 Union soldiers who held off several assaults before finally surrendering.

April 25, 1923: Union leader Arnold Ray Miller was born at Leewood on Cabin Creek in Kanawha County. In December 1972 he defeated Tony Boyle to become president of the United Mine Workers.

April 26, 1816: General Alexander Welch Reynolds was born in Lewisburg. He served in the armies of the United States and the Confederacy. After the war, Reynolds accepted a commission as a colonel in the forces of the khedive of Egypt, the ruler of Egypt under the Ottoman Empire.

April 27, 1978: An accident at the Willow Island Power Station on the Ohio River killed 51 ballpark was demolished men. The scaffolding that in 2005. had been erected for use in

cooling tower collapsed, is a project of the West sending them plunging to the ground.

April 28, 1884: Musician Henry Reed was born in Peterstown, Monroe County. Reed was a legendary West Virginia fiddler whose repertory contributed to the old-time music revival in the last half of the 20th century.

April 28, 1914: April 25, 1863: About An explosion at the Eccles 1,500 Confederate soldiers No. 5 mine in Raleigh County killed 174 men. The mine connected with Eccles No. 6, operating in another coal seam, and nine men in No. 6 died of injuries and of afterdamp, the deadly gas left after a mine explosion.

April 28, 1920: The Monongahela National Forest was created by presidential proclamation. It is the only national forest that is completely within the boundaries of West Virginia.

April 28, 1924: An explosion ripped through the Benwood coal mine south of Wheeling, killing 119 miners.

April 28, 1948: Watt Powell Park opened in Charleston. About 8,000 people, including Governor Okey L. Patteson, attended the city's inaugural game in the Class A Central League. Watt Powell Park was replaced by the city's new Appalachian Power Park after the 2004 season, and the old



BASIC BIBLE

Anticipating Redemption Romans 8:18-27

In the first chapter of his epistle to believers at Rome, Paul expressed his desire that they might be established in the mutual faith. Believers of today know the mutual faith includes the earnest expectation that we be part of the glory which shall be seen when Jesus rules and reigns. The mutual faith includes knowledge of the Spirit which dwells in us. All this and more is contained in the text before us.

"For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us" (v. 18). Both the suffering and the glory of which Paul speaks refers back to verse 17. The suffering is that which believers suffer with Christ. The glory which shall be revealed in us is that glory which shall be revealed when Christ returns to reign for one thousand

In verse 19, the apostle describes this glory to be the earnest expectation of the creature (or creation). God cursed the ground because Adam ate of the fruit of tree which God had forbidden (Gen. 3:17). All creation suffered for the curse and all creation waits for the curse to be lifted. The curse shall vanish when the sons of God will reign with Christ for one thousand years. During that time, the wolf and the lamb shall feed together, and the lion shall eat straw like the ox: and the dust shall be the serpent's meat (Isa. 65:25).

Paul states the reason that the creature (creation) possesses this earnest expectation in verse 20. When God cursed the ground for Adam's sake, Adam had cause for hope. God told the serpent that He would place enmity between the seed of the serpent and the seed of the woman and that the seed of woman would bruise "thy" (the serpent's) head. The serpent would bruise the heel of the seed of woman. Adam's hope lies in God's promise that the seed of woman would bruise the serpent's head. The hope of all creation is found in the person of the seed of woman. The glory which shall be revealed in us will be the manifest glory of the seed of woman.

The seed of woman shall deliver all creation from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God. Grace through faith has delivered us from the bondage of sin. That same grace shall make all creation free from sin's influence. It is by grace through faith that we are saved and it is the glory of Him who died for us which shall be revealed in us.

All creation continues to groan and travail in pain almost two thousand years after Paul wrote these words because "now" is ever present. Now shall cease to be when the Lord Jesus returns. The suffering of now shall not end until Satan is bound for one thousand years. Then shall His glory be manifested.

Paul states that we know that the whole creation groans and travails in pain in verse 22. In the next verse, he adds that all who have the first fruits of the Spirit also groan within because they, like all nature, wait for Christ's return. We wait for the redemption of our bodies. We wait for our corrupted bodies to be changed. "For this corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal must put on immortality" (I Cor. 15:53).

In verse 24, the apostle states that we are saved by hope. Once a hope is realized, it is no longer hope. We hope that Christ shall soon return. We are to hope with patience. The fruit of the Spirit which is in us is "...love, joy, peace, long-suffering..." (Gal. 5:22). The Holy Spirit within us produces the fruit of patience. Believers wait for His return. We do not entertain Satan's lies. We know that disobeying God will not make us as gods. We know that we cannot save ourselves. We cannot end sin's reign. Our hope is in Him who died with our sins encompassed about Him and, then, rose the

The Spirit within us guides us in ways which "helpeth our infirmities" (v. 26). The Spirit makes intercession for us with groanings that cannot be uttered. The Spirit interprets a believer's

innermost feelings — feelings that words fail to express. In verse 27, Paul reveals that "he that searcheth the hearts" knows the mind of the Spirit. Christ Jesus is He who searches the hearts and makes intercession for us. We know that all which we ask according to His will, He hears (I John 5:14). Our Lord and

Savior knows the mind of the Holy Spirit who makes intercession Knowing these things, we can reckon with Paul that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us. May the power of the Spirit

be manifest in us.


