Four Putnam Yuletide in Park Transitions Veterans Receive to Full Week of Festivities 'Quilts of Valor'

Four Putnam veterans were recently honored by the Order of the Eastern Star. Hurricane Chapter 116. Dee Kemper, who is affiliated with the Order, is in a quilting ministry at her church, Maranatha Fellowship. The church is also one of five churches in West Virginia which make quilts for Quilts of Valor. Kemper requested that quilts be presented to four members of the Eastern Star who are Quilts of veterans. Valor state coordinator Maribeth Shreve presented the four men with homemade quilts, each sewn with a patriotic theme. These were some of the quilts that were

Jon Comer served with the Marines in Cuba in 1971-2, guarding Guantanamo Base. While he signed up to fight in Vietnam, he got sent to Cuba instead, where he repaired radios, phones, mine detectors, and cryptographers. Although he received the National Defense Ribbon and Good Conduct medal, he says that he always felt left out because the men who went to Vietnam came back with ribbons and medals. "This is the nicest thing anyone has ever done," he said in response to being given a Quilt of Valor.

"I was very humbled and honored to receive the quilt," said Al Howard. He was in the Air Force from 1964-68, where he served as a jet engine mechanic, working on B52's and KC135's.

"I appreciate the quilt so much," said Grover Continued to Page 3

program provides teachers with an online repository of free, standards-based curriculum materials for the classroom. These include an online poetry anthology containing more than 1,100 classic and contemporary poems, a teacher's guide, lesson plans, posters, and video and audio on the art of poetry recitation. Teachers can access these resources at PoetryOutLoud.org, and physical copies of the teacher's guide are available from the WVDACH. 
As we enjoy this season of holidays...getting to the new year...play a game with your family... read a book with them... take a walk...talk to them...remember...talk

Howard, had finished a large garden and had Huff, who served in the school and were employed in Kanawha County. A.C. traveled, selling coal for the Stover Smokeless Coal Company, leaving Lena and her children to tend to the "farm." Mabel graduated from Hurricane High School and then accepted a position as a bookkeeper for Coyle and Richardson Department Store Charleston.

Geka graduated from the same school in 1933, studied at Marshall College and completed her B.S. degree at Morris Harvey College. She was employed as a teacher in Kanawha County.

Gail finished high school in 1936, went to Marshall College, earning M.A. degree in Elementary Education, and then taught in Putnam County for 32 years, retiring in 1981.

The family attended and was active in the Hurricane Methodist Church, but at that time there was so much cooperation between the Methodist and Baptist Churches, church was often dismissed at one church so that everyone could attend special events at the other, so the Stovers were often in the Baptist Church also.

During the late 20's,

Lena was one of the original organizers of the Stitch and Chatter Club, a club which endured for many, many years and cemented many great friendships. They met twice each month to do just as the title suggeststo stitch and to chatter. Other members were Anna Woodworth, Lula Withrow, Jean Wilkerson, Edith Easter Roberts, Rumbaugh, WilmothAnnie Erwin, Elizabeth Roberman, Artie Sovine, Grace Burdette, Mary Kirtley, Marie Easter,

Emmazetta Hodge, Laura

Riddle, and Flora Fannin.

Lena always raised several producing fruit trees. From this effort her larder was always full, even during the period known as the Great Depression. She bought cases of salmon at 10 cents a can and dried beans and sugar in 50 or 100 lb. bags, so the family never went hungry. She also managed to send two children to college during this period.

Some of the events remembered were the hay rides, corn roasts, ice cream socials, quilting bees, wiener roasts, high school dramas, operettas, and just good, good friends getting together.

One very frightening time remembered was when the KKK paraded through the Methodist Church, apparently for a good cause, but certainly not understood by the youngsters present, who thought they were seeing GHOSTS.

Another fright came when Geka and Gail, after church one Sunday morning, were asked to go to Allen Funeral Home to identify a body that had been found on the railroad track, and rumored to be their brother, Howard, a rumor, thankfully that proved to be untrue.

The Stovers have been blessed greatly during their years in Hurricane and since. They remained in fairly close proximity and have all stayed close to the values which were caught them both in their home and in the community of Hurricane.

US Army. "Indeed, it is an honor to be considered for this. I served my country because I was called, but I would do it again. I really appreciate what the Eastern Star and Quilts of Valor did it touched my heart and I couldn't talk.'

"It's a wonderful thing that they recognized us. It was a big surprise," said Curtis Grant, who also served in the US Army. "Many Vietnam veterans were not recognized when they got home. We felt out of place when we got home, and missed the soldiers we served with. Some of those guys we never saw again."

During presentation, veterans were wrapped in the quilts, a Quilts of Valor tradition which symbolizes an embrace of love and gratitude. The quilts are meant to be a healing and comforting gesture, a way of@ showing appreciation and support to veterans. Quilters from all over the nation spend hours designing and sewing these heartfelt blankets. Over 266,000 have been presented to veterans since the foundation of Quilts of Valor in 2003. Anyone can request a quilt to honor a veteran.





The Silver Bridge fell on December 15, 1967.

The following events happened on these dates in West Virginia history. To read more, go to e-WV: The West Virginia Encyclopedia at www. wvencyclopedia.org.

Dec. 9, 1829: West fourth governor, John Jeremiah Jacob, was born in Hampshire County. He was the first governor born within the area that became West Virginia and the first Democratic governor of the state.

1932: Dec. musician, Songwriter, playwright, humorist, and poet Billy Edd Wheeler was born in Whitesville.

Dec. 10, 1841: Logan County preacher "Uncle Dyke" Garrett was born on Big Creek. His greatest fame was for converting and baptizing Devil Anse Hatfield in Main Island Creek in 1911.

Dec. 10, 1949: The first class of 20 cadets graduated from the West Virginia State Police accident led to Academy in Institute. The State Police purchased property for the academy on a hilltop overlooking Institute from Kanawha County for about \$3,200. Construction began in 1948, and the building was completed the next year.

Dec. 12, 1953: Chuck Yeager set a speed record by flying two-and-a-half times the speed of sound in a Bell X-1A. Yeager, who grew up in Hamlin, had broken the sound barrier six years earlier on Oct. 14, 1947.

Dec. 12, 1942: Internationally known jazz pianist and recording artist Bob Thompson was born in Jamaica, Queens, New York. He studied music at West Virginia State College (now University) and is the house pianist on the Mountain Stage radio program.

Dec. 13, 1861: The Allegheny Battle of Mountain, one of the bloodiest conflicts of the Civil War's first year, took place in Pocahontas County.

Dec. 14, 1910: The accidental death of a Ohio Chesapeake & engineer near St. Albans led to the popular train song, "Billy Richardson's Last Ride."

Dec. 15, 1967: The Silver Bridge at Point Pleasant collapsed, killing 46 people. The Silver Bridge was built by the American Bridge Company of Pittsburgh and opened to traffic

WVSU Extension Service to Discuss Wild Birds at 'Ag Talk Tuesday' December 14

West Virginia State University (WVSU) Extension Service's monthly Ag Talk Tuesday series continues Tuesday, December 14, at 6 p.m. ET with a live discussion of wild birds in West Virginia.

WVSU Extension Service will be joined by Katie Fallon, executive director and co-founder of the Avian Conservation Center of Appalachia (ACCA). Fallon discuss what to do if you find an injured wild bird, as well as some typical injuries and causes. She will also provide an overview of the ACCA and ways to help wild birds in general.

BASIC BIBLE

A King Comes Forth Isaiah 9:6-7, John 12:12-16

The words of Isaiah 9:6 and 9:7 need to be read with care. Some would claim that the things of which the prophet wrote more than 2,700 years ago have never happened and they would be partially correct. The first part of verse 6 is separated from the second part of verse 6 by more than 2,000 years. The literal reign of Jesus Christ from the throne of David has not happened. Isaiah 9:6 employs both verbs of the present tense and the future tense. The promised child and son is of one time and His reign of another. A literal reading of Isaiah 9:6 and 9:7 requires the promised one to rule from the throne of David in a time different from his birth.

The names: Wonderful, Counselor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, and The Prince of Peace, are names by which the child shall be known when the government is upon His shoulder. The throne of David ceased to exist less than 150 years after Isaiah recorded these words. The throne of David did not physically exist when the promised child was born. The Herods who sat upon the throne in Jerusalem at the time of Jesus' birth were puppets of Rome, not sons of David. The promise of verse 7 will be literally realized during the one thousand years following the Lord's return.

New Testament believers know our Lord and Savior to be the promised child because we enjoy a personal relationship with Him. When He ascended to sit at the right-hand of the Father, He sent the Comforter (the Holy Spirit) to bring into remembrance all things which He said and to teach us all things (John 14:26). It is through and by the Holy Spirit that we know Jesus as Wonderful, as Counselor, as one with God the Father, and as the Prince of Peace. Believers realize now (present tense) that which will be known to all when Christ Jesus reigns from the throne of David.

While the rule of our Lord and Savior from the throne of David in Jerusalem is yet future, the proclamation of Jesus as the promised king is two thousand years past. All four gospels record His triumphal entry into Jerusalem. John 12:13 is a record of the words which the people proclaimed, "Hosanna: Blessed is the King of Israel that cometh in the name of the Lord."

The word "Hosanna" means save now. It is a call to the Lord God to deliver Israel from her enemies. It is the same call of praise that is recorded in Psalm 118:25-26. In Psalm 118, the call for the Lord to save Israel is preceded by the acclamation, "The stone which the builders refused is become the head stone of the corner." New Testament believers know that we are "saved now" by believing upon the stone which the builders rejected. We know our Lord and Savior to be the one of whom Isaiah spoke saying, "He is despised and rejected of men" (Isa. 53:3). Our King is Jesus who was despised and rejected. Our King is the one of whom the prophets spoke.

Those who hailed Jesus with Hosannas believed that He would save them now from Roman oppression. Jesus revealed the manner in which He should reign through His actions. Jesus was not a king who would deliver the people from Roman rule. He came riding upon the back of a young donkey (v. 14). He showed Himself to be the one of whom Zechariah spoke saying, "Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion; shout, O daughter of Jerusalem: behold, thy King cometh unto thee: he is just, and having salvation; lowly, and riding upon an ass, and upon a colt the foal of an ass" (Zech. 9:9). Jesus did not come to deliver the Jews from Roman rule. He came to bring salvation to all who would believe.

The salvation which Jesus brought is that which Peter described as that which "the prophets have inquired and searched diligently, who prophesied of the grace that should come" (I Pet. 1:10). Jesus is the promised grace.

Peter and the other disciples did not understand these things at the first (v. 16). Peter and John and the other disciples witnessed the people cast branches of palm trees before the Lord. They heard the multitude sing out the praises of Psalm 118. They saw Jesus ride into Jerusalem in the manner which Zechariah prophesied. They had been with Jesus for three years. They had witnessed His miracles. They had heard His public sermons and teachings. Jesus had given the private explanations of parables which He had declared publicly. Despite all this, they did not understand at the first. They did not understand until Jesus was glorified. They did not understand until they beheld the resurrected Christ and saw Him ascend to heaven to sit at the right-hand of God the Father. They did not understand until the Comforter caused them to remember all things that the prophets

had written of the grace that was to come. The Holy Spirit has delivered to New Testament believers that which the prophets sought. It is though the foolishness of preaching that God chose to save all that believe (I Cor. 1:21). Let us go, teach and baptize in the name of Him whom we know.


