

The Darkest Day Hurricane Parade Makes It Official — Christmas Is Here

The darkest day of 2021 will soon pass. On December 21st, the sun will stop on its southward journey, momentarily hover over the Tropic of Capricorn, and begin its march northward. Daylight hours will gradually increase, and, after a fashion, the temperatures will warm. The grass will grow and trees will put forth their greenery. All will be well. Well is an illusion. December 21st also marks the shortening of days in the southern hemisphere. Sunlight hours will decrease. Everywhere south of the equator, the conversion of carbon dioxide to oxygen and carbon containing molecules will slow. While the process of photosynthesis will slow in the southern hemisphere, it will increase everywhere in the northern hemisphere. Seasonal changes are as old as the Earth and the Sun. Carbon dioxide removal from the atmosphere by photosynthesis, however, is not equal for the two hemispheres. Carbon dioxide removal from the atmosphere is slightly higher in the southern hemisphere because the ocean surface area is greater. Century after century, both hemispheres have been doing their part in removing carbon dioxide from the air. Researchers have determined that the carbon dioxide level has bounced between 200 ppm (parts per million) and 280 ppm for millions of years until the present time. In 2013, the carbon dioxide level exceeded 400 ppm. Many scientists believe the increased level can be attributed to carbon dioxide produced by the burning of fossil fuels. World fossil fuel usage is 23 times greater today than in 1900. In 1900, the atmospheric carbon dioxide level was below 300 ppm. It would seem that natural photosynthesis cannot keep pace with

the new carbon dioxide introduced by fossil fuel usage. Environmentalists are concerned because in past times global carbon dioxide levels have been highest during interglacial periods and lowest during ice ages. There is good cause to believe that atmospheric carbon dioxide is the driving force that produces alternating periods of global cooling and global heating. Photosynthesis is a chemical reaction. The rate at which photosynthesis produces oxygen speeds up during interglacial periods in which global temperatures are warmer and slows when global temperatures are cooler. In past interglacial periods, photosynthesis has removed carbon dioxide from the atmosphere at a rate faster than the rate at which CO₂ is introduced by natural processes. In the 1950's and 60's, school-age children were told that the planet was on the verge of a new ice age. The beginning of that ice age is nowhere in sight. Photosynthesis has been converting CO₂ to O₂ at an increased rate but not at a rate sufficient to offset the carbon dioxide produced by fossil fuel usage. The promised cooling is not happening. Alarmists believe that global temperatures will increase and make it impossible for Planet Earth to satisfy the future needs of its current 7 billion people. Only time will tell if the alarmists of today are correct. Historically, mankind has always done that which is necessary to survive. Civilization is dependent upon doing that which is best for all. Fossil fuel usage has allowed civilization to flourish. World population has increased more than seven fold since the invention of the steam engine produced the need to rely upon fossil fuels. The push by globalists to replace fossil fuels

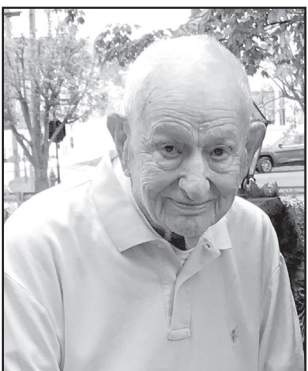

with renewable energy sources may be a case of doing what is best for all. The forced transition to renewable energy by edict is, however, contrary to the manner of past transitions. No one switched from the horse and buggy to fossil fuel consuming automobiles because they thought it was best for all. The switch to new technology was spurred by that which was best for individuals.

Great division of people exists today because some believe what is best for individuals is best for all while others believe that what is best for all should dictate individual choice. Hypocrisy reigns supreme as advocates of renewable energy jet from one continent to another.

A major stumbling block to doing that which is best is the disagreement of what is best. Some would argue that discontinuance of fossil fuel usage is not a solution because the carbon dioxide levels resulting from 200 hundred years of fossil fuel use cannot be undone by natural photosynthesis in the span of several human lifetimes. A solution must produce a

measurable outcome.

Seventeenth century alarmist Thomas Malthus believed that the quality of human life would collapse because the Earth’s finite resources could not supply the needs of an ever increasing population. Malthus was wrong. Mankind discovered technologies which allowed limited resources to supply increased human needs. Fossil fuel usage was instrumental in providing a solution an unsolvable problem.

The solution to elevated greenhouse gas concentrations may or may not be their removal from the atmosphere by photosynthesis. New technologies will emerge. Alternatives to removal by photosynthesis may be discovered. Technologies capable circumventing elevated temperature constraints may be come available. The future, while unknown, is as certain as the darkest day.

December 21 is a day without any sunlight in northern polar regions. Year round inhabitants of these northern reaches do not see the sun but they are confident that it shall return. We, too, know that tomorrow the sun will shine.

A private family service will be held at Haven of Rest Memory Gardens, Red House with Pastor Jeff Arthur officiating.

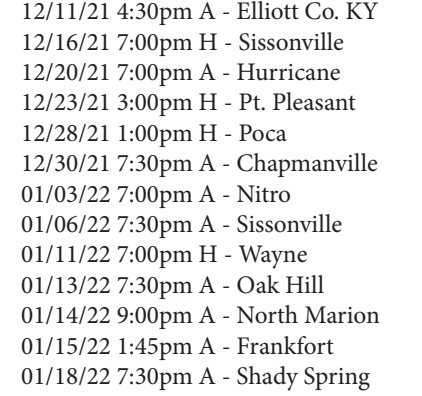


Mark Williams Blood died peacefully at home after a long illness on December 5, 2021.

He was born June 13, 1953 in Salt Lake City, Utah, to Melvin Loynd and Margaret Williams Blood, the fourth of five children. He served a



A Mission from Birth

Luke 2:25-35; John 12:23-26

We are introduced to Simeon in the opening verse before us. He is described as just and devout. The Greek word which is translated as “just” is *dikaïos*. *Dikaïos* appears 81 times in the New Testament. On 41 occasions, including Romans 3:10, it is translated as “righteous.” Romans 3:10 declares “There is none righteous, no, not one.”

Simeon is described as just because his belief, like Abraham’s belief, was counted to him for righteousness. What did Simeon believe? Simeon believed that which is written in the scriptures. Simeon believed that God save would Israel. Simeon waited for the consolation of Israel.

Hebrews 11:6 states that God is a rewarder of those who believe that He is and diligently seek Him. The Holy Spirit revealed to Simeon that he would not die before he had seen the Christ. God rewarded Simeon. “Delight thyself also in the Lord; and he shall give thee the desires of thine heart” (Psalm 37:4). Simeon delighted in the Lord and the Lord gave him the desires of his heart.

Simeon came by the Spirit into the temple. The Lord is not constrained by time. The Lord chose the time that Simeon should look upon the Christ. Many would behold the Christ thirty years after He was revealed to Simeon. The Lord chose to reveal Jesus to Simeon at this time — the time at which Joseph and Mary presented the infant Jesus to the Lord. Joseph and Mary offered the sacrifice required by the law of Moses (see Lev. 12:2-8).

The scripture before us does not state the reason why the Lord chose this time. That said, what follows in verses 28-32 would not have transpired had the Lord chosen a different time to reveal the Christ to Simeon. The words of Simeon are preserved as scripture for God’s purposes. Let us listen to the words that the Lord would have us to hear.

Simeon said, “For mine eyes have seen thy salvation, Which thou hast prepared before the face of all the people; A light to lighten the Gentiles, and the glory of thy people Israel” (v. 30-32). Simeon, speaking to Joseph and Mary, described the baby Jesus as the salvation which the Lord HAS prepared.

Simeon saw that which the Holy Spirit revealed to him. He saw the salvation which the Lord God had prepared for all people. In the baby that he took in his arms and lifted up, he saw a light to the Gentiles and the glory to “thy people Israel.” That which Simeon saw was future. Simeon saw two different things. The baby that he beheld became a light to the Gentiles. The New Testament church testifies of that light. The light to the Gentiles has been burning from the first century A.D. until now and is the light which guides the walk of all who believe.

Simeon also saw the glory of God’s chosen people Israel. The baby that Simeon held in his arms has yet to become the glory of Israel. The Lord Jesus will not be seen as the glory of Israel until the appointed time. That time has been revealed to New Testament believers. We know that Jesus shall reign from the throne of David in Jerusalem after the seven year tribulation set forth to John in the Book of Revelation. We know that Jesus shall not be seen as the glory of Israel until the time of the Gentiles is fulfilled (see Luke 21).

Simeon is not the first to declare that the promised Messiah would be a light to the Gentiles. The prophet Isaiah declared that “mine elect” would bring justice to the Gentiles (Isa. 42:1) and be a light to the Gentiles (Isa. 42:6, 49:6). Simeon saw the salvation which the Lord God has given for all people. Simeon saw “my righteous servant” who would bear “the sin of many” and make intercession for the transgressors” (Isa. 53:11-12).

The fullness of that which was revealed to Simeon is seen in the closing verses before us. “Behold, this child is set for the fall and rising again of many in Israel; and for a sign which shall be spoken against” (v. 35). The child would be a sign — the stone which the builders refused (Ps. 118:22; Lk. 20:17-18). The fullness of that which was revealed to Simeon is made known to believers by the Comforter who teaches us all things (Jn. 14:26). New and Old Testament scriptures alike declare that Jesus is the One of whom the prophets spoke.

Jesus came into the world such that men might have victory over death. Believers read John 12:23-26 and hear the words of Him who died that we might live. Jesus is the kernel of wheat which died such that much fruit should come forth. He said, “If any man serve me, let him follow me; and where I am, there shall my servant be: if any man serve me, him will my Father honor” (v. 26). Let us do as He has said.


