Winter Issue of GOLDENSEAL Now Available

The winter 2021 issue of GOLDENSEAL magazine is now available. Since 1975, GOLDENSEAL has been West Virginia's Magazine of Traditional Life. Attached is a list of retailers where GOLDENSEAL magazine is available.

This issue is dedicated to the 50th anniversary of the Buffalo Creek Disaster, Logan County, which occurred on February 26, 1972, killing 125 people. It was the deadliest flood in West Virginia history, but it was not a flood in the natural sense. It was caused by the collapse of improperly built coal impoundments on the Middle Fork of Buffalo Creek, which unleashed a torrent of black slurry that obliterated virtually everything downstream. In all, some 1,000 people were injured, and 80% of the residents of the narrow hollow were left

homeless. Authors Andréa Fekete, Christine M. Kreiser, Randy Yohe, Aaron Parsons, Brad Crum, Lisa Shrewsberry, Carl E. Feather, Travis D. Stimeling, and Jessica Lilly—as well as photojournalist Chuck Wyrostock—examine the tragedy from different angles, including the causes of the disaster and how survivors pieced their lives back together. Other articles discuss the memories of those who survived, the disaster's "miracle baby" Kerry Albright, the use of the Buffalo Creek Therapy Quilt as a coping mechanism, ongoing efforts to honor the victims, books and songs about Buffalo Creek, Mimi Pickering's classic

and Clay (1906-1985) are deceased. The daughters, Merdith F. and Lillian M. Sumner Roach still reside in Hurricane.

Ronald married joined the First Baptist Kathleen Garrett and they were the parents of one child, Vera Jeanetta Sumner Hash (Mrs. Bruce B.) of Florida. Ronald worked as an agent for the C&O Railroad for several years, and later managed the A.N. Sumner Furniture Store. He was Mayor of Hurricane for two terms. Lillian married Charles Robert Roach and taught school in Putnam County for 40 years. Merdith and Clay remained single, and became co-owners of Sumner's Department Store in 1955.

A.N. Sumner (1877-1960) worked for several people in Hurricane, including Noah Allen. He got his start in the merchandising field under information, call the City Mr. Allen, and in 1917 of Hurricane at (304) 562started his first business on Main Street. This was an "ice cream parlor" in a building beside the Conner Hotel, located between the present-day Ward's TV and Peabody Here the family sold ice cream and sundries. In a vear the Sumners moved larger building where Putnam the County Bank stands. In a few years they started a general merchandise store on the first floor of the IOOF building. In 1922 Mr. Sumner built a brick structure on Main Street beside the Hurricane Breeze building. Thus began Sumner's Department Store, an establishment for general merchandise, with the slogan, "Sells Everything."

This was a family business for 52 years, until Merdith and Clay retired in 1974. They sold the building in 1975, and it burned in March, 1979.

The store had a reputation for miles around and won many honors, including award from the

built a new structure

on Second Street which housed the A.N. Sumner Company. Furniture This store was managed by Ronald Sumner and Bruce Hash until the building was leased and later burned in 1969.

My grandmother lived out Route 34 as I have mentioned in the past, but this week's snow has me thinking of the cold, cold winters we used to have. The snow would be piled up for weeks and I don't remember very many snow days... She did not have running water, and when we helped draw water from the well, we had to prime the pump, that is, putting a little water down the pump so the water would come up from the well. I loved to pump the water and carry the water bucket in the house.

The well was out the back door and not many feet away, so it wasn't a bad trip in the winter if you had your snow boots on, or as we called them, your rubber boots. Grandma had a pair that were men's that buckled up. She would put them on and away she would go, but she didn't forget one important thing you must cover your head in the winter or you will get a cold or ear ache. She had a head scarf and

used it all the time in the winter. I still to this day do not go outside in the cold without something on my head. I don't wear scarfs, but I do wear a toboggan, and don't



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BASIC BIBLE

Peace and Trouble

John 16:19-33

The gospel according to John, unlike the gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, includes a record of the words Jesus spoke to His disciples as they walked from the upper room at the last supper to the garden of Gethsemane where He would be betrayed. In the words before us, Jesus revealed to the disciples the emotions which they would shortly experience. In verse 33, the Lord explained why He had told them these things. He said, "I have spoken unto you, that in me ye might have peace." The Holy Spirit moved John to record Jesus' words such that all who believe might also have peace in troubling times.

In verse 19, Jesus revealed to His disciples that He knew their very thoughts. He knew that they were totally puzzled by that which He said in verse 17. Jesus said, "A little while, and ye shall not see me: and again, a little while, and ye shall see me." Jesus had previously told them that which was about to transpire — that He would be betrayed, that He would go to the Father, and that He would send the Comforter to them. The words of verse 17 are different; they tell of that which the disciples were about to experience. Jesus knew the anguish which they should soon experience.

Jesus knew the turmoil of the near future and the joy which would follow. Jesus used proverbs to tell them these things (v. 25). Their sorrow would turn to joy in the manner in which the pain of childbirth is followed by overwhelming joy of precious new life. Jesus explained that they would experience joy which no man could take from them when they would see Him again (v. 22).

In verses 23 and 24, Jesus makes it known that the joy which they would experience shall not be full until after "Whatsoever ye shall ask the Father in my name." They would experience the joy of childbirth upon beholding Him but the fullness of their joy awaited their asking the Father in His name and receiving that which they asked.

The promise of receiving that which is asked in Jesus' name (v. 23) cannot be separated from that which Jesus spoke in chapter 15, verse 7. Asking in Jesus' name requires that one abide in Jesus. Words mouthed "in Jesus' name" are not magically fulfilled. Fulfillment requires all that is asked to be an expression of the Son; it is the will

John 1:12 states, "But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name." The Son gives power to be as He is to all who abide in Him.

The linkage between asking in His name and enjoying a special relationship with the Father is found in verses 26 and 27. The future time in which Jesus will no longer speak in proverbs (the time in which the disciple realize the fullness of their joy) is a time in which intercession is not necessary because the Father loves them as they have loved the Son believing that Jesus came out from God. The disciples, in asking in Jesus' name, shall enjoy a relationship of love. That relationship of love would not be realized until Jesus had left this world to be with the Father (v. 28).

The disciples thought they understood. They said, "Lo, now speakest thou plainly, and speakest no proverb" (v. 29). The disciples most certainly understood that Jesus knew all things and believed that He came forth from God but the time at which Jesus should

plainly show them the Father had not come (see v. 25). Jesus did not plainly reveal the love of the Father to them until He gave Himself upon the cross of Calvary. The love of the Father is revealed by the actions of the Son. Jesus, indeed, spoke plainly but the disciples would not fully understand until He should arise victorious from the grave and stand before them. One cannot know

the Father except He be revealed by the Son. Jesus knew that their joy to come must wait until they would see Him after "a little while" and that their joy would not be made full until they should know the Father who so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son that they not perish but have everlasting

life. Jesus asked, "do ye now believe?" The disciples would not truly believe until they beheld Jesus after "a little while." They would not truly believe until all that Jesus said should happened came to pass. They would scatter, leaving Jesus alone to die upon the cross. Jesus said they would leave Him but that He would not be alone

"because the Father is with me" (v. 32). God the Father and God the Son are one. Jesus alone died a physical life upon the cross. The suffering the only begotten endured, the Father knew. Jesus spoke these things such that we might have peace. We plainly hear that which Jesus spoke if we have peace. All who know

that He has overcome the world, all who know that He has done that which we cannot do, have peace and joy unspeakable. May all hear and find peace.


