Rosalee Juba-Plumley also filed for the Board of Education on the last day. Juba-Plumley and Wade Neal both reside in Magisterial District 2.

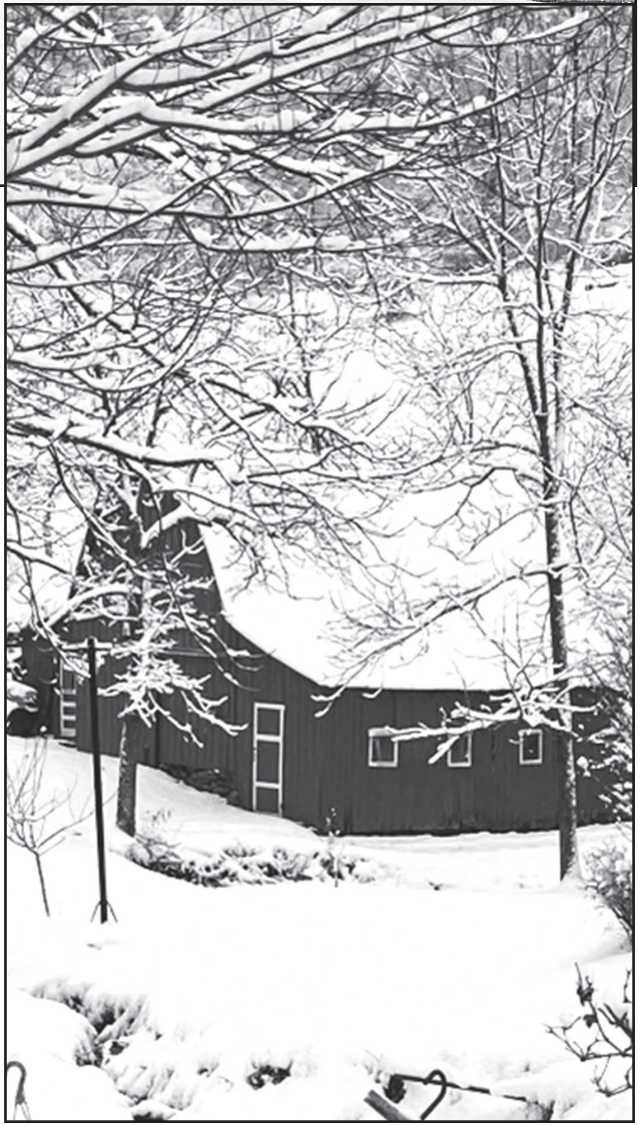

211 is West Virginia’s Guide to Help

The 211 Impact Survey Results reveal that in 2020 alone, the 211 network made 27.8 million connections to critical services and help. This an increase of nearly 100% from the 14 million connections in 2019. Locally, in West Virginia, specialists responded to over 20,000 calls. The most notable increase for 2020 is a 150% increase in connections to food programs. This increase in calls to 211 for help highlights the magnitude of the need for human services as the COVID-19 pandemic disrupted millions of lives in 2020.

211 is a free and confidential service that helps people across North America find local resources when they are in crisis. The West Virginia United Way Collaborative operates West Virginia 211, providing information on more than 12,000 services across a variety of human services. With a presence in all 55 counties and more than 96% of U.S. communities, 211 is the most comprehensive source of information about local resources and services in the country. Each trained specialist is local to his/her community and is equipped to identify the appropriate resources

Voices From Misty Mountains Deadline

West Virginia teachers, librarians, and college students now have extra time to apply for the West Virginia Humanities Council Summer Teacher Institute, “Voices from the Misty Mountains, Reclaiming Our Story for a New Appalachia.” The deadline to apply for the two-week institute is now April 1.

Taking place July 11-22, the interdisciplinary Institute is open to all teachers in all disciplines and grade levels, as well as librarians and teacher education graduate and undergraduate students. The institute, which is offered through Shepherd University’s Center for Appalachian Studies and Communities, is available both virtually and in-person at the Shepherd’s campus.

All teachers and students selected to participate will receive \$500 to use for professional development and/or classroom resources and certificates of completion. Graduate credit is also available.

Participants will learn the story of West Virginia and Appalachia, gaining an understanding that will enhance teaching the state’s children. Writers Silas House and Gretchen Moran Laskas will be involved in the institute, as will storyteller Adam Booth, George Tyler Moore Center for the Study of the Civil War Director Dr. James Broomall, and Center for Appalachian Studies Director and 2006 West Virginia Professor of the Year Dr. Sylvia Bailey Shurbutt.

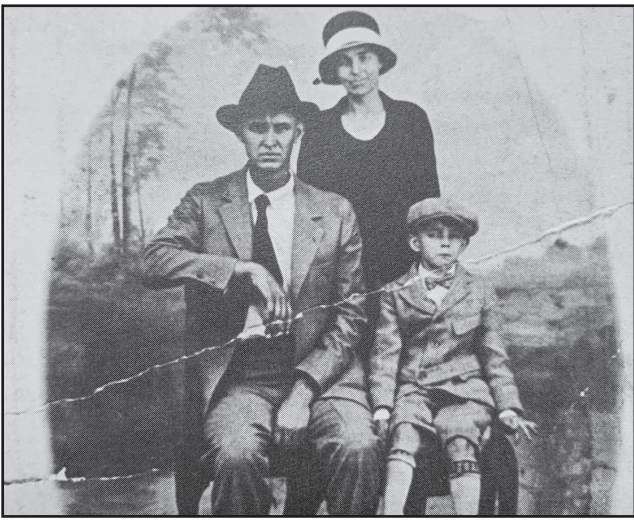

of the slavery issue and settled on land where the Town of Hurricane had its beginning. Eleven children were born to this union, all of whom either died or left Hurricane early in life, with the exception of Columbus Washington (affectionately known as “Uncle Lum”), who was born on Christmas Day in 1855. “Lum” owned a grist mill for many years in Hurricane. Adam Claxton married a second time, to Catherine Holley. To this union were born a daughter and a son who died in infancy, and three other children who lived most of their long lives in Hurricane: Brooklyn Dalton (born 12-10-90) and twins, Allie (Coyner} and Alvah (Smith). Brooklyn Dalton married Ada Delle Tanner in 1915. Ada died in 1928, leaving six small children: Jay Douglas (born 2-8-17) is married to Lula May (Morrison), has two sons, Alvin Lee and Charles Dell, two grandsons, and lives in Hurricane. Jean Avalee (born 8-26-18) is married to M.S. (Dutch) Potts, and lives in Ohio. Margaret Catherine (Margarine) (born 2-22-20) is the widow of Arthur Hulley, has four children, Dennis, Susan, Steven and Anne, and four grandchildren. Margaritte has a winter home in Florida and a summer home very near the spot where Adam Claxton and Catherine (Holley) Taylor had lived. Dalton Tanner (born-8-22-2 1) is married to Harriet (Morgan), has four daughters, Carolyn, Linda, Nancy and Pamela, seven grandchildren, and lives in Hurricane. Melba Claxton (born 9-10-22) is married to Raymond Lafon, has two children, Lynette and Bryan, and three grandchildren, and lives in Hurricane.

Dorothy Fern (born 9-26-23), was married to James Dick and had three children, Kathryn, Virginia and Doug, and lived in Hurricane until her fatal automobile accident in February, 1950. Nine grandchildren have been born since Dorothy’s fatal accident. All of Brooklyn Dalton’s children who live in Hurricane have homes on the property formerly owned by Adam Claxton Taylor.

Brooklyn Dalton Taylor was a rural mail carrier during World War I. He later became a cattle farmer, operated a dairy, was a real estate broker, built homes, and developed many tracts of land. Jay and Dalton, sons, have operated several business in Hurricane and Teays Valley, including log milling, block manufacturing, development of several subdivisions and builder of around 400 houses, primarily for the working class people. Dalton does the development and managing in the field, while Jay takes care of the business of the companies. Jay’s two sons, Alvin Lee and Charles Del, and Dalton’s son-in-law (Linda’s husband), Danny Harshbarger (formerly of Milton), have interests in the companies. Margarine and Melba were registered nurses, both have retired from the Veterans Administration Hospital. Avalee is retired from her former position of personnel security specialist with the U.S. Department of Defense. Dorothy, before her death, operated the dairy business for Brooklyn Dalton, her father, and a restaurant (The Co-Ed) for Jay and Dalton, her brothers.

Crush Run Coming!

The 2nd annual Crush Run will be held Saturday, February 5th, at the Hurricane City Park. There will be a Trail Half Marathon, 5k run or hike, and Kids Run. All proceeds go to support further development and maintenance of the Meeks Mountain Trails Alliance.

Packet pickup is from 7:00-9:00 am on Saturday, February 5th, at Hurricane City Park’s big red barn. All race participants in the half marathon, 5k, and kids run can pick up their packets at that time. After 9:00, packets will be available for pickup at the starting line in the back of the bowl. There will be signs directing you to the start line.

Bathrooms are available in the park, and portable restrooms will be available at the Start/Finish.

All races begin in the bowl. You will cross active train tracks, so beware and be careful.

Plan for an extra 15 minutes to walk to the start/finish line.

The half marathon has a 4 hour time limit, and the last aid station will close at 11:30.

Water and sports drink aid stations are available on the course. The 5k and kids run will have one aid station, and the half marathon will have access to an aid station 5 times.

To all of our military, first responders, and family members, Meeks Mountain Trail Alliance says, “Thank you!” MMTA loves faithful service members and their families and appreciates their sacrifice on behalf of our country and its people. To show appreciation, MMTA is offering service members and families a 15%

discount on the Hurricane Crush Run. Enter coupon code “service” at checkout for 15% off of your registration. There will be awards for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd overall for both male and female in the half marathon and 5k; and awards for the 1st place Crush Two Person Teams in both the half marathon and 5k. The Kids Run is a fun run with unique finisher awards.

Please be prepared to follow any local Covid-19 or other health and safety guidelines. For anyone with symptoms of any illness please stay home and you will be credited for the 2023 race or refunded.

Safety and EMT will be on call for emergency situations.

Every runner gets the coveted MMTA Crush Run Buff, tote, and finisher award. Expect a finish line bon fire, marshmallows, Orange Crush, and a West Virginia original, pepperoni rolls.

Registration is limited to 100 runners for the half marathon and 100 runners for the 5k.

Thanks to generous local sponsors, the price for the kids run is only \$10, the 5k is \$30 and the half marathon is \$55. Registrations are final and there are no refunds.

THIS WEEK IN THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES

For the week ending Jan. 28, 2022

Members of the House took time near the end of week three of the regular legislative session to honor the life of former House Speaker Robert S. Kiss who died Nov. 5, 2021.

House Speaker Roger Hanshaw, R-Clay, presented Resolution 10 to Kiss’s wife Melinda who was escorted to the floor of the House Jan. 27 by all living House Speakers and the current Raleigh County delegation.

Kiss was first elected to the House in 1988 to represent Raleigh County and spent several years as House Finance Committee Chairman before his selection as House Speaker in 1997. Kiss oversaw legislative accomplishments that included creating the state’s Rainy Day Fund, funding higher education scholarships, funding roads and highways and most notably steering the Legislature through an overwhelming state budget deficits, a failing workers’ compensation system and a medical-malpractice insurance crisis.

“I practice law at the same firm where Speaker Kiss was, and I found him to be an invaluable source of advice and counsel,” Hanshaw said. “His example, not just to me as a Speaker of the House of Delegates, but also to every member of the Legislature as we start each day together, to always think about those who will come after us, and to focus on how to make their economic and social conditions better.”

Two measures that would pave the way for West Virginia to begin utilizing its rich supply of rare earth elements advanced in the House this week after months of discussion and study in legislative interim committee meetings.

The state has a vast array of coal waste piles, and those abandoned treatment solids contain concentrations of the rare earth elements in high demand because of their essential role in making most electronic and automotive products.

The Water Research Institute at West Virginia University has determined that cleaning acid mine drainage can be a rich source of rare earth elements.

House Bill 4003 would establish a clear legal right of title to the chemical compounds, elements and substances derived from the treatment of acid mine drainage, setting definitive roles in the cleanup and extraction of rare earth elements from those coal waste piles. The bill goes next to the House Judiciary Committee for debate. House Bill 4025 would provide a severance tax exemption of up to five years for the extraction, production and sale of rare earth elements and other critical materials as an economic development incentive. The measure goes next to the House Finance Committee.

House Bill 4252 overwhelmingly passed the House Wednesday. The measure would limit the maximum amount a person with health insurance would be required to pay for a prescription insulin drug to \$35 per day for a 30-day supply, as well as a limit of \$100 for a 30-day supply of diabetes devices, such as blood glucose strips. The limit for an insulin pump would be \$250.

“This is an attempt to help our families with one of the main health problems in West Virginia,” said House Health Committee Chairman and lead sponsor of the bill Matthew Rohrbach, R-Cabell.

Delegate Barbara Evans Fleischauer, D-Monongalia, has advocated for lower insulin copays for many years, and said the bill would be a relief to many West Virginians.

“I am so thankful for this bill because it will truly save lives,” she said.

As of Jan. 28, a total of 1,046 bills had been introduced in the House of Delegates, 24 House bills had passed the House and two bills had completed the legislative process. The last day to introduce bills in the House is Feb. 15 and the regular session ends at midnight March 12.

Trials and Denials

John 18:15-27

All four gospels present an account of Peter’s denying Christ three times and the crow of the rooster that followed his third denial. All four gospels record words which Jesus spoke at His trial. The gospel of John, however, records words of Jesus different from those reported by Matthew, Mark and Luke. The words which John recorded were spoken in a different portion of the trial than which Matthew, Mark and Luke reported. The words recorded in Matthew, Mark and Luke were spoken by Jesus near the close of proceedings, immediately prior to the high priest’s announcement that Jesus was guilty of blasphemy.

When Jesus was taken captive at Gethsemane, He was first taken to appear before Annas (see Jn. 18:13). It would seem that Peter’s first denial (v. 15-18) occurred during the period in which Jesus stood before Annas. Peter’s second and third denials most definitely occurred when Jesus stood before Caiaphas (see v. 24). The timing of Peter’s denials is found in Luke 22:58-59. Peter’s first and second denials were separated by “a little while.” His second and third denials were separated by about one hour. The words spoken by Jesus to Annas in verses 20 and 21 and to the officer in verse 23 appear to have been said at about the same time that Peter first denied Jesus.

“And Simon Peter followed Jesus, and so did another disciple . . .” (v. 15). John, alone, makes mention of the presence of a disciple other than Peter. The only things which we know of this disciple are that he was known by the high priest and that he went into the courtyard of the high priest before Peter entered and spoke to the female doorkeeper (v. 16). It would seem reasonable to conclude that access to the courtyard was limited and that Peter’s admission was obtained through the disciple whom the high priest (and the doorkeeper) knew. Peter’s initial denial of Jesus was upon his entry into the courtyard (v. 17).

Caiaphas was the official high priest at this time but it is Annas, the former high priest, Caiaphas’ father-in-law, who is calling the shots. It is Annas who asked Jesus of his disciples and of His doctrine. Jesus answered, “I spake openly to the world . . .” (v. 20). Jesus most certainly had spoken openly. He had made His doctrine known from the beginning of His ministry. Speaking to the great multitude present at the Sermon upon the Mount, Jesus said, “Think not that I am come to destroy the law, or the prophets: I am not come to destroy, but to fulfill” (Matt. 5:17). Jesus could have answered Annas by stating all that which is recorded in Matthew 5:3-7:27. Instead, Jesus asked the question, “Why askest thou me?”

Jesus knew why Annas questioned Him. Annas wanted Jesus to confess that He had come as a king who would make the Jews free from Roman rule. Annas sought cause to have the Romans execute Him. Jesus was a threat to the power which Annas and Caiaphas and the other religious leaders wielded over the people.

Jesus followed His unanswered question with a suggestion which reads as a directive. Jesus said, “ . . . ask them which heard me” (v. 21). With these words, Jesus instructed Annas to do the very thing which the law of Moses requires. Deuteronomy 17:6 specifies that one should not be put to death except that his guilt be established by a minimum of two witnesses. Jesus, in His answer to Annas, directed him to comply with the law of Moses.

John does not report that Annas spoke. John focuses upon the response of one of the officers present. The officer struck Jesus because Jesus had spoken to the high priest in the manner in which He did. Jesus said, “If I have spoken evil, bear witness of the evil” (v. 23). In the eye of the officer, Jesus had done evil. Jesus had challenged the high priest. Believers know that Jesus had directed the high priest to keep the law — the law which He had come to fulfill.


In His last words to the officer, Jesus asked “why smitest thou me?” The scene ends without an answer and Jesus is brought before Caiaphas.

Jesus knew that which was to follow. Jesus knew all things. Jesus knew the manner in which He should die. He knew that that which is recorded in Psalm 22:14-16 should soon pass.

Jesus knew every detail. We know that Jesus knew all because all that He said should happen, happened. Peter denied Him three times. John reports Peter’s second and third denials in verses 25 and 27.

In verse 25, Peter is asked if he is a disciple of Jesus. John states that Peter answered, “I am not.” The gospel of Matthew quotes Peter as saying, “I know not the man.” Both John and Matthew say the same thing but “I am not” is a more powerful denial. “I am not” states “I AM” is not. Peter, in denying Jesus, denied God the Father, God the Son. Jesus was “I AM” manifest in the flesh. John has recorded that which he recorded such that we might know Jesus as he (John) knew Jesus.

Might all men know Jesus.

After high school graduation, Bill, like many young men at that time, served in World War II to protect our country and freedoms. As a U.S.

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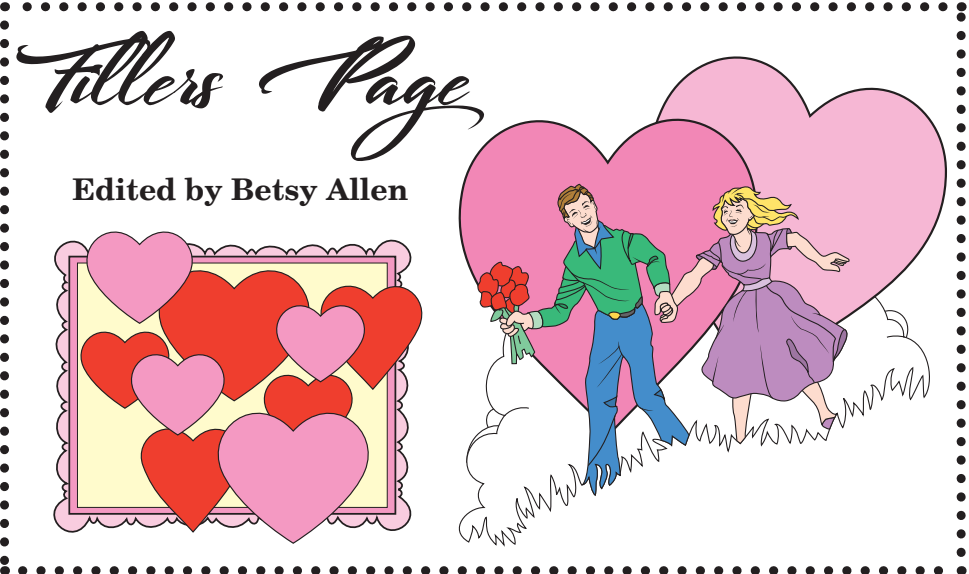

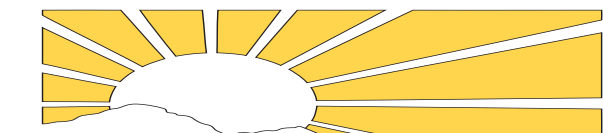

Historic Carrollton Covered Bridge Restoration

Work is underway to restore the historic Carrollton Covered Bridge in Barbour County, the West Virginia Division of Highways announced.

Contractors for Span 1, LLC are currently installing scaffolding and rigging to replace the bridge's wooden siding and portions of the upper superstructure.

“While it’s been a long time coming for community members, it’s been a top priority for the Division of Highways since day one,” said District 7 Engineer Brian Cooper, P.E.

The bridge, the third oldest of 17 surviving covered bridge in West Virginia, was badly damaged by a fire in August 2017. The blaze destroyed much of the outer covering of the bridge but left the basic structure mostly intact.

The WVDOH was able to reopen the bridge to traffic in September 2017 after minor repairs to the modern bridge superstructure to ensure the bridge was safe. Consultants then developed plans on how to best replace

the structure.

Consultants Mead & Hunt, who have done extensive work on the Philippi Covered Bridge, determined what portions of the old wooden superstructure could be saved and installed temporary bracing to shore up the remains of the roof system.
