West Virginia's Lying Putnam County Library Sponsors Covid-19 Numbers 'Healthy Earth, Healthy You'

the popular quotation — "There are three kinds of falsehoods, lies, damned lies and West Virginia Covid-19 statistics."

West Virginia's Covid disease is without value or worse, harmful.

On Tuesday, April 26, the DHHR reported 81 Covid hospitalizations statewide. More than half, 41, were listed as fully vaccinated. If this statistic is NOT a lie, vaccination against the disease is no better than not being vaccinated.

A closer look at the DHHR data reveals that 22 of the hospitalized were in ICU. Half (11) were fully vaccinated and half were not. If true, what is the value of having been vaccinated? The lying DHHR Covid number declares that there is no

An even closer look at Tuesday's DHHR numbers show that 12 individuals, statewide, were listed as being on ventilators. Of the 12 patients on vents, seven were fully vaccinated and five were not vaccinated. If these numbers are true, it is reasonable to conclude that vaccination is either worthless or,

The DHHR Covid Purposely, misquoting number are correct and the numbers do not lie. That said, to suggest that vaccination against Covid-19 was worthless is a misuse of numbers.

Putnam's active case numbers hit a seasonal high of 477 during the first week of February.



(1836), and Charles (1838). Elias (married Elizabeth Harbour) and (married Amanda Cooper) were farmer/merchants and owned stores in and around Hurricane. Nancy married James Nichols. Arch married Minerva Jane Wheeler on Oct. 1, 1857. Jane was born in Little Rock, Ark., the daughter of Alexander and Mary Wheeler, and was reputed to be of Cherokee Indian descent. She was born during the "Trail of Broken Tears" episode, so it is possible.

When the Civil War began, Noah enlisted immediately, but Arch enlisted a year later when Capt. Morris Kirtley came through Putnam County recruiting for a new company of Confederate cavalry. He was captured in late 1864 and spent the rest of the war as a prisoner at Ft. Delaware. Arch was a master stone mason, and after the war, he resumed working at this craft, moving often and traveling extensively about the state. Evidence of his skill can still be seen in the chimneys on old farm houses and perhaps on some stone bridges in the

Arch and Jane were the parents of five children: James (1858), Mary (1860), John (1864), Lee (1866), and Andrew (1870). In 1925, he began operating a grocery store on Main Street that was later owned by Delmar Pullen. When water and sewer came to town in the early 1930's, Bill moved across the tracks to the old McCallister store building and opened a plumbing and hardware business. He plumbed most of Continued from Page 1 the houses in town and wired many of them for electricity. He continued to operate the business until his death in 1962.

would allow gardeners to save money on supplies, as well as give new purpose to ordinary household

Bowen also discussed how table scraps could be used as compost to help improve garden soil. He suggested saving eggshells and grinding them up to add calcium to the soil. Coffee grounds also add nitrogen to ground, helping tomatoes, potatoes, onions and roses grow. He also suggested keeping fruit and vegetable scraps away from the garden so that rabbits would eat the scraps instead of the garden.

During the workshop, demonstrated the proper way of using pre-made seed starter mix: by adding water to the mix before planting seeds, as the dry nature of these types of potting soils actually repel water at first. Gardeners can purchase biodegradable planters, or make their

own with cardboard egg containers or by drying wet newspapers in muffin tins to give them shape.

As part of the handsof the on portion demonstration, Bowen led both children and parents in mixing up seed starter and planting

seeds to take home. He also led his audience in hummingbird making and butterfly seed bombs which can be dropped on within the balls and the the ground and planted anywhere. These seed bombs are made by combining wet potting

parsley and cilantro soil, air dried clay, and seed mixture, and then rolling the dough-like concoction into balls. The seeds begin to germinate rain will wash the soil away, leaving the seedlings

behind. Bowen is a nutrition educator and registered dietician who gives healthy living presentations in area schools through the K-2nd nutrition education grant through the USDA. The Marshall University Nutrition Education Program encourages healthy lifestyle changes early in life," he says. 

Glory of the New Covenant II Corinthians 3:7-18

Paul was moved by the Holy Spirit to write to the Corinthians concerning the difference between God's relationship with believers under the law and under the new covenant. The Apostle introduces the difference by announcing that the Corinthians are an epistle

written, not with ink, but, with and by the Spirit of the living God upon fleshy tablets of the heart (v. 3).

In verse 6, Paul states that God "hath made us able ministers of the new testament." He, further, declares that God did this, not by letter, but, by the Spirit. In the closing words of the verse Paul reveals why God chose to make "us able ministers" by the Spirit -". . . the letter killeth, but the spirit giveth life."

All that Paul wrote was given to him by God for God's purposes. God desires that all believers know and act upon that the Spirit has

In verse 7 and 8, Paul refers to the law which God gave Moses as the ministration of death and the new covenant as the ministration of the Spirit.

Why does Paul label the law as the ministration of death? In Romans 7:10, the Apostle states, "The commandment which was ordained to life, I found to be unto death." Man cannot join himself to God by keeping the law because no man can undo his sin. To keep the law one must be as God. In Genesis 3:5, Satan told Eve that she could be as God by disobeying God. Eve believed Satan's lie and disobeyed. One cannot be as God by disobeying God. God gave the law to men such that we might know that we are separated from Him. Hence, the law which was ordained to life was found to be unto death because all have sinned.

The law, the ministration of death, was written upon stones. The law was glorious — too glorious for the children of Israel to look upon the face of Moses (see Ex. 34:29-35). The veil upon Moses' face prevented the children of Israel from seeing the glory which God bestowed upon Moses. The new covenant is the ministration of the Spirit (v. 8). The glory of the new covenant is greater than the glory of the law because Jesus fulfilled the law (see Matt. 5:17). The new covenant was not revealed until Jesus removed the veil by fulfilling all righteousness. The glory of the ministration of the Spirit is magnitude upon magnitude greater than the glory of the law because the Spirit reveals that which the law masks.

In verse 9, Paul uses new names to refer to the law and to the new covenant. The ministration of death is the ministration of condemnation and the ministration of the Spirit is the ministration of righteousness. These new names declare the difference between the glory of the law and the glory of the new testament. The glory of condemnation is pale and weak and does not compare to the glory

"For if that which is done away was glorious, much more that which remaineth is glorious" (v. 11). The glory of condemnation has been replaced by the glory of righteousness. The glory of righteousness is seen in Him who was without sin. Jesus came, not to destroy the law, but to fulfill it. Jesus replaced the glory of condemnation with the glory of righteousness.

Paul was God's messenger to the Corinthians and us. God wants us to know that we are bathed in the glory of His righteousness — a righteousness that is without veil.

Because there is no veil, we see that which the children of Israel could not. In verse 14, the Apostle states that the veil remains before the eyes of Israel and Israel is unable to hear when Moses is read (v. 15). The blindness of Israel remains, even now, almost two thousand years after Paul wrote this epistle.

There is, however, good news for Israel. The veil shall be removed when Israel turns to the Lord (v. 16). Believing God changes one's relationship with God from condemnation to that of righteousness.

In verse 17, Paul states, "Now the Lord is that Spirit." That Spirit is of righteousness. Christ is the righteousness who satisfied the law and has made us free of the law. In Him, we have liberty. The condemnation of the law is put to no effect.

In the closing verse, Paul state that "we all" —all believers— are changed into the same image from glory to glory by the Spirit of the Lord. His righteousness has been given to us. The image that we behold in a mirror is that which God sees. The Father sees that which the Son has done. We see His glory, the glory of life

everlasting, life with Him. Let us share that which we have received.

Born Nov. 30, 1835, in the small town of Florida, Missouri, with the given name of Samuel Langhorne Clemens, Mark Twain achieved international acclaim for such works as "The Adventures of Tom Sawyer," The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn," and "A Connecticut Yankee in King Arthur's Court."

Twain passed away on April 21, 1910, but has a following still today. 
