## County Commission Candidates Fork Out \$50,000-Plus

Barring a dramatic shift in political winds between now and November, every Putnam County Republican who wins candidacy in Tuesday's Primary will be elected to office in the General Election on November 8th.

The last Democrat elected to a county office was Gary Tillis who was elected as County Commissioner in 2006. Since 2006, Republican candidates have won every election for county office with an increasing margin of victory.

In November, county voters will fill the offices of Circuit Clerk, County Clerk, and County Commissioner. No Democratic Party candidate chose to file for Circuit Clerk or County Clerk during the January filing period. Democrat Jim Withrow filed for County Commissioner. The last Democrat to run for the Commission was Rosalee Juba-Plumley in 2018. She was defeated by a 2 to 1 margin.

Incumbent County Clerk Brian Wood is unopposed in the Primary. The offices of Circuit Clerk and County Commissioner each have four Republicans seeking candidacy. Seeking candidacy for Circuit Clerk are Stephanie Smith, Michael Thompson,

Donald Underwood and Mike Reynolds. The race is wide open in that current Circuit Clerk J.J. Mullins is not seeking reelection.

The Republican candidates for County Commissioner are Ron Foster, Ed Absten, Steve Dewese, and Todd Dillon. Foster was elected to the Commission in 2016 and is seeking a second six-year term. Dewese served as Putnam County Sheriff from 2013 to 2021. Absten and Dillon are first-time office seekers.

The cost of running for Circuit Clerk pales in comparison to that of the race for County Commissioner. The combined total expenses of the four Circuit Court candidates on their Pre-Primary filing reports was \$15,021. The four County Commissioner candidates listed a combined total of \$51,922 of Pre-Primary expenses. The Pre-Primary filings are listed on the Putnam County Clerk's website at <http://putnamcoclerk.com/election/>.

Foster was top in reported expenses with \$20,176.90, followed by Dewese at \$14,203.66, Absten at \$8,851.14, and Dillon at \$8,556.22.

The actual cost per vote will not be determined until the votes are counted and Post-Primary financial reports are

When I was a senior at Hurricane High, Marshall was a sophomore. We saw each other daily... we talked about Mike... the family... he took the school by storm... popular... well liked... president of this and that... an athlete like his older brother... both smart...

When we went places, the Burkes and I, Marshall sat in the backseat with us... we chatted... we laughed, crowded with another sibling... he and Mike had a relationship that was unusual... always caring about the other... I don't remember arguments... they weren't like that...

Marshall met a girl... he was smitten... he brought her to meet us... Little beautiful Betty Thompson... that was it... she was a junior, and he was a senior (if I remember correctly)... they were together from then on... just like his brother and I... for a time...

Marshall, Betty, Mike, and I double dated... we went out to eat... to football games... to movies... Betty became a good friend to me. I cherished her as I did Marshall... I still do... I pray for her and her family faithfully... and for Mike... losing his brother...

Marshall was the best man at our wedding; Betty was my maid of honor... we were blended as a family... M and B; M and B... four of us... together...

I can still picture Marshall and Betty holding Nathan, the first grandchild, first grandson... that picture was sweet... the same with Kathy, first granddaughter... they enjoyed their niece and nephew just as we did their kids, later years...

Marshall and his family visited us often... and we them... they got us into snow skiing... yes... I was forty... we did it and loved it... we were hooked... fun with them and without... they met us at Canaan Valley at Christmas... so much family fun... and game time after the skiing...

A nice boy... a nice man... the last time I saw Marshall was at the funeral of Uncle Roger Burke... he was the same Marshall... considerate... asking about my family... always doing that... thinking of others... Marshall had that same smile I remembered from high school.

The most important thing about Marshall Burke was not that he was an esteemed doctor... a Bible teacher... he was a husband, father, and grandfather, and he cherished those roles... a life well lived. He was a son... a brother... a brother-in-law, a nephew, a cousin... a friend...

He and Betty were married over 50 years... the last anniversary celebrated in the hospital with family... he cherished his four children; he adored his twelve grandkids... he was the best family man...

Marshall spent time outdoors... he loved Cranberry River with Mike and other family members. (Mike first started going there in 1969... and continued the Burke family fishing trip... our two kids backpacked with him as young as five or six...) I have seen pictures of Marshall in May of last year... his last trip there... I remember Marshall... I don't remember the man of 70 plus... I remember the boy with that smile... the boy in the yearbook... the boy others liked so much.

A life well lived... a man who adored his wife beyond belief... a man who raised his children in a home of love... and oh my... his grandchildren... Betty wrote that he taught them about life and Christ... he instilled in them his own beliefs... strong... Christian beliefs...

I know from experience how much Marshall loved Betty... from day one it seemed... there was no one else... they were inseparable... fifty years plus... I remember their beautiful wedding in 1970... the most gorgeous bride... handsome groom... off to begin their lives together...

I have seen Marshall with his children... I saw the times he taught them by experience, and I have seen the times he played with them...

Marshall was a good son... he, Mike, Betty, and I loved going to the Burke home for Canasta games, great food from Grandma Burke... and laughter with Grandpa Burke... those were fantastic date nights... and they continued after we were married and moved away... none of us remained in our home town of Hurricane... I wish...

A life well lived... Marshall Burke lived his life making it count... never wasted... his experiences are beyond what most have ever considered from living in the Middle East to settling in a small town in Pennsylvania... where Betty and some of the family live... Marshall lived a successful life, but I know that he counted his family as his greatest success...

Our lives are better for having known this boy... this man... our lives are better for being cared for by Marshall... our love and prayers go out to Betty and the family as they approach June, the anniversary of his death... but I know they are not remembering only those few days in the hospital... they are remembering his life... my friend, Linda, says it so perfectly... "I don't stress on the illness and bad days; I remember the fifty plus years of goodness." Betty does the same... her family does also... they honor their father by their lives... because the way we were is always the way we are... remembering the boy... we loved so much... Marshall, my brother-in-law of my heart... you are missed and thought about every day... you lived a life beyond measure... well done... faithful servant.

 filed. The voter turnout in non-presidential elections tends to be low. In 2018, there were 5,711 Republican Primary voters. If Tuesday's turnout is similar to 2018, the average cost of a vote for County Commission will be \$9.09.

The number of individuals choosing to vote early is considered to be an indication of voter interest. Early voting began on Wednesday, April 26. County Clerk Brian Wood said that as of Monday, May 2, there were slightly fewer early voters than in the same period in 2018.

In addition to selecting candidates for the General Election, voters will be electing three members to four-year terms to the Board of Education. Election to the Board is dependent upon both vote total and residency requirements. No more than two Board

members can be elected from the same district. Two members of the five-member Board were elected in 2020 and two years of their terms remaining. Because one resides in District I and the other in District II, only one District I candidate and only one District II candidate can be elected on May 10th. Two candidates may be elected from District III.

Both Melissa Oxley and Brad Hodges are running from District III. The highest vote-getter of the two is guaranteed a seat on the Board. The low vote-getter in District III cannot be elected unless his or her vote total is greater than either of the top vote-getter in District II or in District I. Rob Cunningham is the only one seeking election from District I but he will not necessarily be elected unless his total is greater than the second place finisher in District III. Marshall University in 1966, did his Doctoral work at West Virginia University, and has done Bible studies at Toledo Bible College and Seminary of Tennyson, Indiana.

After twelve years with the department of education, Dick returned to the classroom to teach mathematics at Dunbar High School. He presently teaches Computer Science and mathematics at Nitro High School. He also teaches fast-paced mathematics to the mathematically-gifted students of Kanawha County. His first love is the work of the Lord as pastor of Naomi Missionary Baptist Church at Quincy, WV where he has been for eleven years.

Beverly has stayed busy raising their family and encouraging the children in their academic and personal development. She loves to sew, cook, crochet, knit, and garden.

Deron is licensed paramedic and works for the Putnam County Emergency Service. He is also a volunteer fireman in Hurricane.

Joy is a freshman at Marshall University and is a Speech Pathology major. She is a talented pianist

and vocalist and uses her talents in her church and school activities.

Deron, Corey, and Daniel have all been very active in Boy Scouting. Corey plays the baritone in the Middle School Band, and Daniel is an avid soccer player. Neil was on the Middle School basketball team and plans to play on the team at the high school where he is a freshman.

Though Julie was the fourth child to arrive in the family, she is actually the youngest child. 

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## BASIC BIBLE

### Our Heavenly Dwelling

II Corinthians 5:1-10

In the ten verses before us, Paul uses the pronoun "we" 13 times, "us" twice and "our" twice. These plural pronouns, while referring to Paul and the Corinthians, are applicable to all who believe.

In the opening verse Paul speaks of two houses — an earthly house and a house in heaven. The earthly house is the tabernacle (tent) in which a believer dwells. It is our physical body. It is a transient structure. The house in heaven is our future dwelling place. Paul states that the house in heaven is of God's construction. It is not transient. It is forever. The heavenly home is ready for habitation but cannot be occupied until the earthly home is vacated.

We groan (v. 2). We make deep and inarticulate sounds in response to pain and despair which we experience in our physical bodies. We desire to be clothed upon with a garment which shall never experience pain or sorrow. Paul describes that garment as our house which is from heaven.

"If so that being clothed..." (v. 3). The picture which Paul has placed before us is that of changing one's clothes. The clothes in which we now reside is our earthly body. The clothes in which we desire to reside is our heavenly home. To be dressed in our heavenly home, we must remove our earthly clothing. When we remove our earthly clothing (submit to death), we are exposed. Some believers shall be more exposed than others.

In Revelation 3:15-18, Jesus addressed the church at Laodicea. The church at Laodicea was the seventh and last church which Jesus addressed. Jesus saw the church at Laodicea as wretched, miserable, poor, blind, and naked. Jesus urged the Laodicean believers "to buy of me gold tried in fire" such that they might be rich and be clothed in white raiment such that "the shame of thy nakedness do not appear" (Rev. 3:18). The nakedness of those clothed in white raiment shall be hidden.

In verse 4, Paul makes it known that the groaning which he, the Corinthians and like-minded believers engage is not for fear of being found naked. We groan because we desire to be clothed with the house which God has built.

Why is Paul not fearful of being found naked? Read verse 5. God has given us the earnest of the Spirit. Jesus said, "In my Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you" (Jn. 14:2) and "It is expedient for you that I go away: for if I go not away, the Comforter will not come unto you" (Jn. 16:7). The Comforter, the Holy Spirit, abides in all who hear and believe that which Jesus said. The presence of the Holy Spirit is proof that God is faithful to His every promise. The Comforter is cause for our confidence. We are confident because we know that the Comforter speaks to us and we see Him revealed in fellow believers.

"Therefore" (v. 6). Because the Holy Spirit dwells in us, we are confident that we shall see Christ face-to-face when we depart this body. We are confident of every promise because we live, not by sight, but, by faith. Living by faith means believing God and acting upon that which He reveals. Living by faith means acting upon that which the Comforter teaches and brings into remembrance (Jn. 14:26). It means loving one another as Jesus loves us. It means letting Him be seen in us.

In verse 8, the Apostle reiterates his and our confidence that being absent from the body (our earthly tabernacle) means to be present with the Lord. That confidence is manifested by our labors. In Paul's day, prior to Paul's day and in the present day, men who labor in the employment of others do so with confidence that their labor shall be rewarded on payday. Laborers do not receive payment in advance. It is with a similar confidence that we labor to please Him who made us free of the law which we could not keep.

In verse 10, Paul states that all believers must appear before the judgment seat of Christ. Every believer shall be exposed but not all shall be naked. Believers who have bought gold tried in fire shall be attired in white raiment such that their nakedness shall not be seen. Jesus does not want to look upon naked believers. He desires to look upon them who are clothed in white raiment and are rich because they have purchased gold tried by fire.

There is one source, and one source only, of gold tried by fire — Christ Jesus. All believers shall appear before the judgment seat of Christ. Some shall be clad in gold, silver and precious stones. Others shall be adorned in wood, hay and stubble. All coverings shall be tested by fire. In I Corinthians 3:15, Paul makes it known that the coverings of wood, hay and stubble shall be consumed by flame but that believers themselves will be saved as by fire. Though saved, these believers are without works and are naked.

The plural pronouns which Paul employs are inclusive but not totally inclusive. We, in verse 9, applies only to them who labor to be accepted of Him. Those who labor not shall be as the church at Laodicea.

Let us labor for the night shall come when no man can work.
