

Praying for Second Chances

Like countless others, I have viewed Facebook postings of the video showing a Kia Soul smashing into the Scott Depot Dairy Queen.

The video shows the vehicle flying through an intersection at high speed and plowing directly into the DQ at 7:10 p.m. on Saturday, May 21. I saw no evidence of any attempt by the driver to swerve or to slow.

It looked to be intentional. Looks, in this instance, were exactly correct. Several news outlets reported that the operator, Casey Oxley, told State Police that he did it on purpose. Oxley's motive has yet to be made known. It appeared to me that Oxley intended to harm or to kill himself.

Miraculously, no one was injured. The Kia came to rest in the inside dining area. The dining area was closed. DQ owners, Veronica and Jeff Diehl, had planned to begin serving customers indoors for the first time since the onset of the Covid pandemic on that very day, Saturday, May 21. That plan was cancelled because Saturday's high temperatures would have pushed employees beyond measure.

The DQ will remain closed for quite some time. The building has been deemed structurally unsafe and has to be

rebuilt.

While Saturday did not go as planned for the Diehls, Oxley's plan (if he had one) did not go as he expected. He was taken to CAMC Teays Valley. While there, Oxley was uncooperative. He has been charged with five counts of attempted malicious assault, battery on a health care worker, battery on emergency personnel, assault on emergency personnel, felony destruction of property and reckless driving. Oxley is now in the Western Regional Jail in Barboursville. His bond is \$100,000 cash only.

While I do not know Oxley's intent, I am confident that it was not to be housed in the Regional Jail. I suspect that he crashed into the building with the expectation of never seeing another day.

Everything happens for a reason. Sometimes the reason is chance — sometimes, someone wins the Powerball Jackpot. That chance is very, very small. Upon reviewing the video of the crash, I would say that Oxley's chances of survival were small. The chances of his walking away uninjured would have been very, very small. Sometimes, the unlikely happens. Sometimes the most undeserving get a second chance.

I am praying that Oxley will take advantage of the second chance which he has been given.

Putnam County Golden Horseshoe Recipients Named

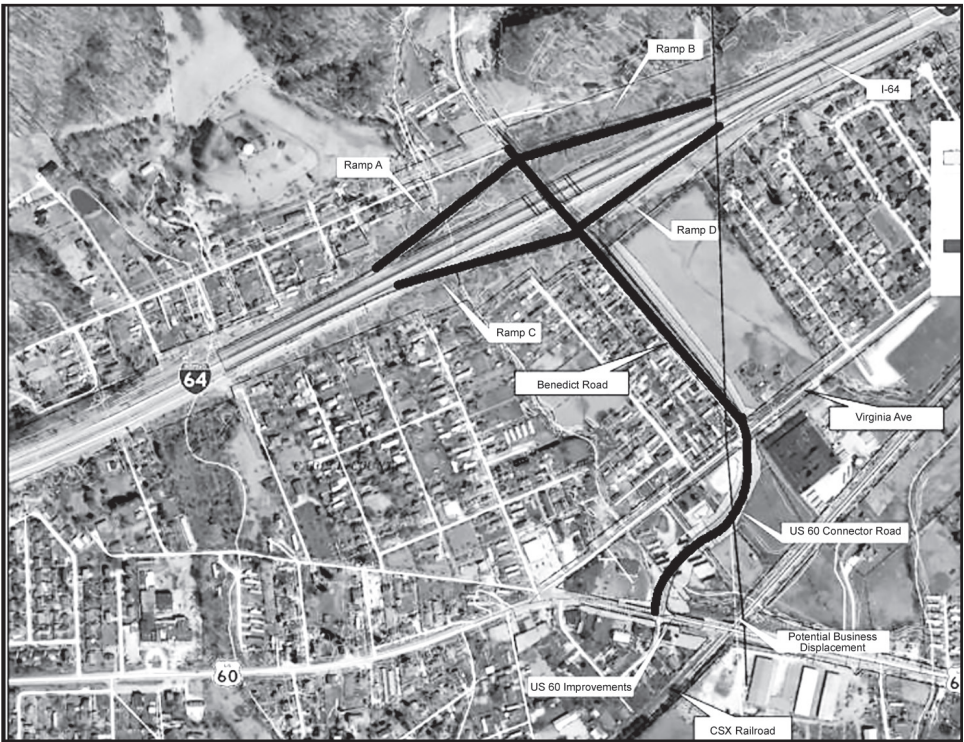

Louis, better known as "Shorty," was from Radford, Virginia, son of John Andrew Wilson and Mary Catherine Locke. He was from a family of 12 children. Mr. William Harrison of Wytheville, Virginia, formerly from Hurricane, sent Louis to Hurricane in 1909 to work at the Putnam County Bank. In 1916 he married Lillian Margaret Dorsey, daughter of R.V. and Victoria Dorsey. They had six children. One daughter, Mary Catherine, Continued on Page 3

Annual Vandalia Gathering to Be Held May 27-29 in Charleston

On Memorial Day weekend, May 27-29, the Culture Center and State Capitol grounds will set the stage for the 45th Vandalia Gathering – the state’s annual celebration of the traditional arts, music, dance, stories, crafts and food of West Virginia. The free festival’s unique blend of ethnic and cultural heritage combines an atmosphere as comfortable as a family reunion with the excitement of a state fair. The festival will return this year in its original, full weekend format after being cancelled in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic and a downsized version of the gathering in 2021, which included an afternoon concert to honor the Vandalia Award winners.

The 2022 Vandalia Gathering kicks off at 6:30 p.m., Friday, May 27, in the State Theater with an awards ceremony for quilt and wall-hanging winners and presentation of the 2022 Vandalia Award, the state’s highest folklife honor, at 7 p.m. A concert following the award ceremonies will feature Tessa Dillon, Jesse Milnes and Emily Miller, Jenny Allinder, Pete Kosky, and the Jimmy Gabehart Band.

A Saturday evening concert starts at 7 p.m. in the State Theater and will feature performances by the Mack Samples Band, Lady D, Dwight Diller, Kanawha Tradition, Gerry Milnes, and Chance McCoy.

The Vandalia Gathering creates new memories each year for the thousands of visitors who flock from across the Mountain State and around the country to celebrate traditions passed from generation to generation. The festival pays tribute to West Virginia’s mountain culture and ethnic heritage by showcasing a variety of craftspeople and performers.

For those who love the sounds of traditional music or would like to be introduced to it, Vandalia Gathering fits the bill. Concerts and contests fill the weekend, and impromptu musical jam sessions spring up all over the grounds. At any moment, a shade tree becomes the site of a lively performance as strolling musicians stop to join in on a favorite tune.

Outside activities begin on Saturday at 10:30 a.m. Events include old-time fiddle, bluegrass banjo, and mandolin contests, with half-hour concerts by Hunter Walker, Chance McCoy, Terry Vaughan, Southridge, Brayden Williamson, and Robert Shafer & Johnny Staats. Sunday’s events begin at 11 a.m. with a one-hour gospel set by Angie Richardson, followed by old-time banjo, lap dulcimer, and flat-pick guitar contests, with half-hour concerts by Buck McCumbers & Company, Andy Fitzgibbon, the Lilly Mountaineers, Roger Bryant, Robin and Dan Kessinger, and Sawyer Chapman. The fiddle and guitar competitions have a youth category for musicians 15 years of age or younger. Traditional dance offerings range from demonstrations of ethnic and square dancing

in the Great Hall of the Culture Center to an outdoor flat-foot dancing stage where spectators are encouraged to jump in and kick up their heels.

The popular Liars Contest returns on Sunday in the State Theater at 2:30 p.m. (with registration beginning at 1:30 p.m.), as storytellers compete for Goldenseal magazine’s coveted Golden Shovel award.

The Old-Time for Young ‘Uns area will have craft activities and “musical instruments” for all ages to enjoy.

During the festival, West Virginia craftspeople will be demonstrating and selling their creations. Visitors can shop for wind chimes, pottery, wall hangings, garden accessories, wood products, stained, fused and pressed glass, musical instruments, jewelry, silk scarves, candles, leather goods, baskets and a host of other items in the Artisan Circle. Salsa, jellies, salad dressings, gourmet coffee and tea, roasted nuts, chili and dip mixes and a variety of other food products also will be available.

Vandalia food booths will feature a unique sampling of traditional and ethnic foods, including such favorites as hot dogs, roasted corn, Italian sausage sandwiches, tacos in a bag, ramps, potatoes and eggs, strawberry shortcake, and cobblers. The festival sales tent will offer Vandalia Gathering t-shirts, caps and other souvenirs, as well as music from West Virginia’s finest traditional musicians.

Visitors also can see the annual Quilts and Wall Hangings Exhibition on display in the Great Hall of the Culture Center. The crowd-pleasing annual juried exhibition features exquisite quilts and wall hangings representing the talents of West Virginia quiltmakers. Quilts and Wall Hangings 2022 will be on display from May 27 – Sept. 13. A separate exhibit, The Sounds of Music, includes various instruments from the West Virginia State Museum permanent collection.

Vandalia Gathering is a program of the West Virginia Department of Arts, Culture and History. The Culture Center is located at the State Capitol Complex in Charleston.

was born in Hurricane, the other children were born in Huntington where they moved in 1918. He worked as assistant cashier at the Day and Night Bank and was later a successful underwriter for the Reliance Life Insurance Company there. In 1933, he returned to the Putnam County Bank as cashier, later becoming President and chairman of the board where he was active until his death at the age of 94.

Lillian, his wife was an accomplished musician and taught piano in Hurricane and Huntington to many students who continued their study of music to become professionals. She died at the age of 63 in 1960 in the house where she was born. Their children are Mary Catherine DePaulo of Bethesda, Maryland; General Louis L. Wilson, Jr., U.S. Air Force retired, of Tucson, Arizona; Margaret Ann Durham of Berea, Kentucky; R.V. Dorsey Wilson, deceased; Victoria Elizabeth Davis of San Francisco and Jack Wilson, Chairman of the board and President and Executive officer of the Putnam County Bank.

Louis, Jr. and Jack played football at Hurricane High. Dorsey was drum major there and Elizabeth composed the Alma Mater. Margaret was a cheerleader and later taught English.

There are 17 grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren, among whom are two environmentalist, two medical doctors, four attorneys, a translator and interpreter of French and German, a diplomat, c i n e m a t o g r a p h e r, composer and orchestra director, computer expert, nurse and banker.

Shorty Wilson was proud of his family, his town and his work, never hesitating to join or to lead any undertaking that would reflect honorably on any of the above. The Town of Hurricane honored him in 1983 with a proclamation "in recognition of his outstanding efforts and years of service given to the City."

Final days of COVID-19 antibody testing

All Red Cross blood, platelet and plasma donations are being tested for COVID-19 antibodies through June 3. Donors can learn if their donation has the antibody levels needed to potentially help COVID-19 patients with a weakened immune system.

The Red Cross is screening all blood, platelet and plasma donations from self-identified African American donors for the sickle cell trait. This additional screening will provide Black donors with an additional health insight and help the Red Cross identify compatible blood types more quickly to help patients with sickle cell disease. Blood transfusion is an essential treatment for those with sickle cell disease.

Donors can expect to receive sickle cell trait screening results, if applicable, within one to two weeks.

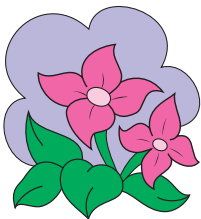

 - 1/2 teaspoon salt
 - 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
 - 1 tablespoon olive oil

- Pizza Bites:
- 3 tablespoons olive oil
 - 1 cup sliced sweet onion
 - 5 mini bagels
 - 1 large zucchini, sliced 1/2 inch (10 slices)
 - 1 cup marinara sauce
 - 1 cup walnut chorizo
 - 1/2 cup crumbled goat cheese
 - 1/2 cup chopped basil

To make walnut chorizo: In food processor, pulse walnuts until finely crumbled. Transfer to mixing bowl.

In food processor, pulse pinto beans, lime juice, paprika, oregano, cumin, chipotle powder, salt and garlic powder until mixture resembles ground meat. Stir bean mixture with walnut pieces.

In medium skillet over medium heat, heat olive oil. Add walnut chorizo and cook 5-7 minutes until lightly browned, using spatula to break into crumbles.

To make pizza bites: In pan over medium heat, heat olive oil and add onion. Cook, stirring occasionally, 15-20 minutes until onion is soft and golden brown.

Preheat oven to 375 F. Line two baking sheets with parchment paper. Halve bagels and place on baking sheet. Place zucchini slices on second baking sheet.

Top each bagel and zucchini slice with 1 tablespoon marinara; spread with back of spoon. Add 1 tablespoon walnut chorizo crumbles to each bagel and zucchini slice. Sprinkle with caramelized onion and goat cheese.

Bake 10 minutes.

Cool 5 minutes on baking sheets. Top with basil.

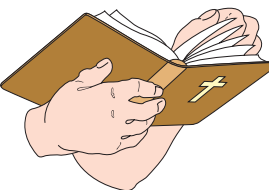

Paul’s Thorn in the Flesh

II Corinthians 12:1-10

Paul states that it is not profitable for him to glory in himself. In chapter 11, glorying in the flesh is exactly what Paul appears to have done (see 11:18-28). Paul’s apparent boasting in the flesh, however, was not to promote himself but to reveal to his detractors that they had no cause to rejoice in themselves.

Nonetheless, it was not expedient for him to glory because his glorying brought to mind visions and revelations — visions and revelations which caused him to think more highly of self than one should.

“I will come to visions and revelations of the Lord” (v. 1). Visions and revelations of the Lord are hardly of the flesh. God reaches out to them whom He chooses. God reached out to Abraham while he was yet in Ur. God spoke to Abraham before Abraham’s belief was counted to him for righteousness. As it was with Abraham, it was with Paul. God spoke to Paul while he was yet Saul.

The incident (v. 2-4) which Paul describes occurred 14 years before he wrote this epistle. The calendar date would have been around 42 A.D., about five years prior to his first missionary journey. Based upon Acts 11:25, Paul likely dwelt in Tarsus at the time of the vision.

Paul was taken up into paradise. What he experienced was too wonderful for words. He describes seeing that which is not lawful for a man to utter. The Lord gives revelations to men for His purposes. The Lord did not show these things to Paul such that Paul should lift himself up.

Paul saw and heard that which God has prepared for them who love Him (I Cor. 2:9, Isa. 64:4). Paul knew what he had seen. Paul saw that which is too wonderful for a man to see. Paul states that he could not tell if he were in the body or out of the body. Paul saw that which the flesh is not allowed to see.

Paul desired to glory in that which he had experienced but he had no cause to glory in himself. Paul would glory in that which the Lord had done. He would do so by glorying in his infirmities. Paul possessed an infirmity, a thorn in the flesh.

Many have speculated upon the identity of Paul’s thorn in the flesh. While the scriptures do not reveal the nature of the thorn, Paul states the reason that he was given this infirmity. His infirmity allowed a messenger of Satan to buffet him (v. 7). The thorn in his flesh was beneficial to Paul. Romans 8:28 states that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are called according to His purpose. Paul’s thorn was for his own good; it was needful.

When we consider one buffeted by Satan, Job comes to mind. God used Satan’s buffeting to correct Job’s self-righteousness. Paul, unlike Job, knew the reason for Satan’s buffeting from the beginning. Paul knew the thorn prevented him from glorying in the flesh. Paul knew that the thorn made it necessary for him to rely upon God and not upon self.

Paul prayed three times that the Lord might remove the thorn with which he was buffeted. The Lord answered: “My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness” (v. 9). The Lord’s answer to Paul’s prayer was “No!”


In John 16:23-24, Jesus said, “Whatsoever ye shall ask the Father in my name, he will give it you. Hitherto have ye asked nothing in my name: ask, and ye shall receive, that your joy may be full.” Jesus spoke these words to His disciples, to the apostles. Paul was not an apostle when Jesus spoke these words. Nonetheless, the Lord’s words are fully applicable to Paul. Paul prayed three times asking that the thorn be removed. Paul asked but did not receive. How could the Lord say No?

The Lord did not remove the thorn because thorn removal would not fulfill Paul’s joy. It was the desire of Paul’s heart that the will of the Father be done. It is the will of the Father that men might see His strength — a strength made perfect in weakness. The Lord wanted His strength to be seen through Paul. The power of the Lord cannot be revealed by works of the flesh — even the flesh of them who love Him.

Because Paul heard and understood God’s answer, he gloried in his infirmities. Paul gloried because his weakness allowed the strength of God (the power of Christ) be seen in him (v. 9). Paul took pleasure in all things which he suffered for Christ’s sake because in his weakness, the strength of God was revealed.

How is the strength of the Lord revealed? The power of Christ is seen in changed lives. Paul led many to repentance. There is joy in heaven (Lk. 15:10) when sinners repent and turn to Him who suffered death for them. When Paul became weak in the flesh, he became strong (v. 10).

All believers are called to abide in Christ and given the promise that He shall abide in us. Let us, like Paul, be weak such that Christ be seen in us. The Lord would have all to come to repentance (II Pet. 3:9).

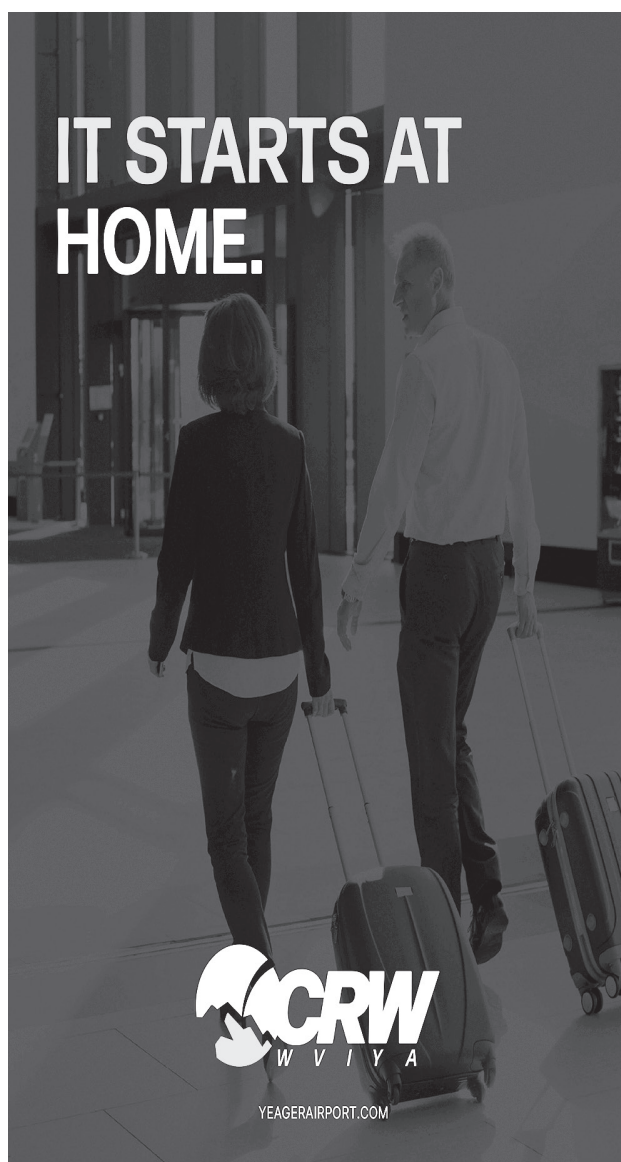

WVSU Program Among Best In Country for Preparing Elementary Math Teachers

The undergraduate teacher preparation program at West Virginia State University (WVSU) has been named among the best in the nation when it comes to ensuring future elementary teachers have the essential content and skills they need to teach mathematics.

The National Council on Teacher Quality (NCTQ), a national research and policy organization that evaluates the core requirements and practices of more than 1,100 programs that prepare future elementary teachers released a report this week in which the program at WVSU earned an A+ designation

for its requirements in elementary math. WVSU is among only 79 programs in the nation to earn this distinction. The specific courses and requirements for the undergraduate program at WVSU are included as an “Exemplar Resource” in the report, serving as a guide to help other programs improve.

“Mathematics is a huge component in setting the foundation for students,” said Dr. J. Paige Carney, WVSU interim provost and vice president for academic affairs.

Research has found that elementary math skills are a strong predictor of whether a student will graduate from high school.

Attorney General Morrissey Announces Winners of ‘Kids Kick Opioids’ Design Contest

West Virginia Attorney General Patrick Morrissey announced 12 students from the Metro Valley as regional winners of the office’s sixth Kids Kick Opioids contest, a competition designed to spur creativity and raise awareness of prescription painkiller abuse.

Judges recognized winning entries from 79 students overall. Those designs will be displayed in the State Capitol in the fall.

The statewide winner and runner up will be announced soon. The statewide winning entry will appear in newspapers across West Virginia as the Attorney General’s next public service announcement.

Kids Kick Opioids represents one of many initiatives through which the Attorney General has sought to combat West Virginia’s drug overdose death rate, including a lawsuit against the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration that achieved sweeping reforms to the nation’s drug quota system.

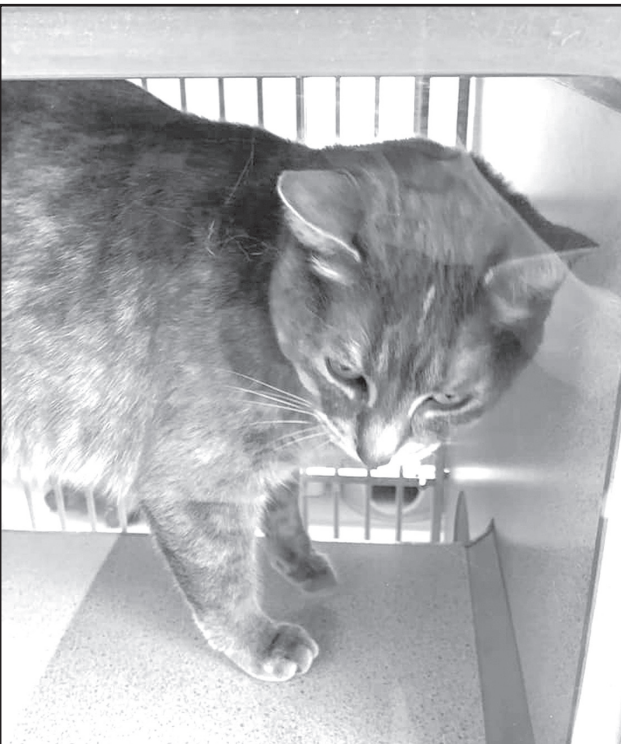
The Attorney General also has combated the opioid crisis with civil litigation, multistate initiatives, funding to target opioid abuse, criminal prosecutions, new technology, engagement with the faith-based community and education.

The West Virginia Board of Pharmacy, West Virginia Association of School Nurses and the Capitol Police assisted the Attorney General in judging the public service announcement contest.

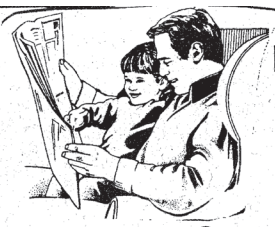
