

just before midnight on December 31, 1885, but the doctor in attendance said it was close enough to midnight that he could be called a New Year's baby, so the January 1, 1886 date was generally used by the family, although his birth certificate does indicate December 31, 1885.

When P.W. (as he was called by family and friends) was still under six years of age, he lost both of his parents. This left P.W. and his two brothers and two sisters to be raised by relatives. P.W. grew up in the home of an uncle, Floyd Mitchell, who was his mother's brother.

In September, 1909, P.W. was married to Anna Agnus Beckett who was born December 14, 1892, and was the daughter of John Charles "Charley" and Abigail Sowards Beckett. Charley Beckett was the son of Ahas and Mary Rayhill Beckett. Abigail Sowards had moved to the area from Scotttown, Ohio. and Agnus (better known as Aggie) lived for a time on Bee Branch/Sycamore Creek where most of their children were born. Son, Freddie, would later say that it was on this farm that he spent the happiest days of his life. (Most of us would say that about the first home we remember.) Eventually, they purchased a larger farm on Sycamore and lived there the remainder of their lives.

most farms, was tobacco, and Aggie's butter and eggs were always in demand.

When the Laywell Church of Christ was organized in 1913, P.W. and Aggie were charter members. The church met for a time in an old school house but in 1924, decided to build a new building with most of the labor provided by the members. P.W. would later relate that any time it was too wet to farm or the work was caught up, they would go over and work on the church building.

P.W. and Aggie were the parents of five children:

- 1. Hobart Ernest, b. May 12, 1911, who married Hazel Chaney and they have lived in Hurricane for nearly 50 years. They had one son, Aubrey Glen.
- 2. Laymon, b. 1913, d.
- 3. Alberta Marie, b. November 2, 1915. Alberta m. Martin Honaker and lived in Huntington. They were the parents of a daughter, Romona, and a son, Gary.
- 4. Freddie Morrison, b. February 25, 1918. Freddie m. Dosha Helen Lawson and they were the parents of two daughters, Natella and Evelyn.
- 5. Vaneta Jewel, b. October 6, 1919. Vaneta m. Forest Smith (d. 1992) and they were the parents of two daughters, Charlotte (d. 1993) and Jov.

The following events happened on these dates in West Virginia history. To read more, go to e-WV: The West Virginia Encyclopedia at www. wvencyclopedia.org.

July 7, 1928: The Madonna of the Trail monument was dedicated in Wheeling. It is one of the 12 such statues erected along the National Road to honor America's pioneering women.

July 8, 1894: Walter Aegerter was born in Helvetia. An amateur photographer, Aegerter built both a studio and darkroom on his farm and photographed portraits, celebrations families, and everyday scenes of the German Swiss settlement. The glass plate negatives survive today in several archived collections.

July 8, 1924: Rock 'n' roll pioneer Johnnie Johnson was born in Fairmont. Johnson collaborated with Chuck Berry on songs such as "Roll Over, Beethoven." Berry's hit "Johnny B. Goode" was written as a tribute to Johnson.

July 9, 1942: An explosion at the Pursglove No. 2 Mine at Scotts Run near Morgantown killed 20 men. It was one of three fatal accidents at the mining operation in an eight-month period.

July 10, 1769: Physician Jesse Bennet was born. He performed successful caesarian section America in 1794, on his own wife and without proper equipment and with no antiseptics. He

later established a large practice in Mason County and served as an Army surgeon in the War of 1812.

July 10, 1936: The temperature in Martinsburg reached 112 degrees. It tied the record for hottest temperature on record, which had been set August 4, 1930, at Moorefield.

July 11, 1867: John Jacob Cornwell was born on a farm in Ritchie County. He served as the 15th governor of West Virginia.

July 11, 1976: Gov. Arch Moore dedicated the West Virginia Culture Center. The structure was built to showcase the Mountain State's artistic, cultural, and historic heritage.

July 12, 2003: The Clay Center for the Arts & Sciences in downtown Charleston opened to the public. More than 50,000 schoolchildren from 50 West Virginia counties and 21 counties in surrounding states visit the center each year.

July 13, 1861: The Battle of Corricks Ford took place in Tucker Confederate County. Gen. Robert S. Garnett was killed. He was the first Confederate general killed in the Civil War.



I have written before about the lightening bugs but I want to encourage you to just take some time to look for them and enjoy God's handiwork.



Sweetpotato Wedge & Purple Cabbage Salad with Poppyseed Dressing

North Carolina sweetpotatoes

1/2head purple cabbage

tablespoon olive oil

salt, to taste

Servings: 4

pepper, to taste

tablespoons poppyseed dressing, divided tablespoon chopped parsley

cups grape tomatoes, halved

tablespoons feta cheese, crumbled

Preheat grill to 400 F. Scrub and wash sweetpotatoes. Cut each into six wedges. (If sweetpotatoes are

long, consider cutting wedges in half.) Parboil sweetpotatoes 5 minutes, drain and cool 5 minutes. Shred cabbage into thin slices.

Toss sweetpotatoes with olive oil and salt and pepper, to taste. Place sweetpotato wedges on grill perpendicular to grates over direct heat;

grill about 3 minutes on each side, or until tender-crisp with grill marks on each side. Remove from grill and set aside.

In zip-top bag or large bowl, toss cabbage with 4 tablespoons poppyseed dressing

until coated. Add parsley and tomatoes; toss. To serve, place sweetpotato wedges on bed of dressed cabbage and drizzle with

remaining poppyseed dressing then sprinkle with cheese. Serve warm or cold.







Micah Stands Firm for God

Micah 2:4-11

Micah prophesied more than 2,700 years ago to an audience which had little interest in hearing that which God would have them hear. The text before us reveals the hearts of them who were far from God in that day. Sadly, the hearts of many of today are as were the hearts of Israel in Micah's day.

"In that day shall one take up a parable against you" (v. 4). These words were given to Micah by God. What does it mean to take up a parable? A parable is a simple story that tells a whole lot.

The day in which this simple story would be taken up against Israel is revealed in verse 3. It is the day in which the Lord would bring judgment upon them who devise and practice iniquity (v. 1).

"We be utterly spoiled: he hath changed the portion of my people" (v. 4). This is the voice of them who devise and practice iniquity. It is the voice of them who have taken the land of the weak and downtrodden. The voice bemoans that the Lord has taken away the land which it had obtained by exploitation.

Micah uses the judgment to come to tell the simple story that the Lord wanted Israel (and all who would ever read scripture) to hear. The message is simple and clear: Those who cast aside the word of God shall be cast away. In verse 5, Micah prophesies that there shall be none who shall cast a cord by lot in the congregation of the Lord. What does it mean to cast a cord by lot? It means to be part of the congregation of the Lord. For Israel, it meant possession of the land which God promised to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

For New Testament believers, casting a cord by lot in the congregation of the Lord means being a child of God. It means abiding in Christ Jesus.

Micah prophesied the loss of the land to all Israel — there would be none who would cast a cord by lot in the congregation of the Lord. Micah also prophesied that the land would be restored to the remnant of Israel and their king would pass before them (v. 12).

"Prophesy ye not . . ." (v. 6). These are not the words of God. These are words spoken by them who do not hear the Lord and do not want to hear God. They are words which were directed against them who declared the coming judgment of God in Micah's day. Today, we hear words of similitude. We live in a time in which some shout down the truth that the Lord would have all men know. The same voice which said 'Prophesy not' in Micah's day says 'Don't tell me that there is only one way to heaven.'

Micah was the target of them who said 'Prophesy ye not' because he shamed them who had cast the commandments of God aside. Micah was charged with hate speech because he had said that which God told him to say. God hears the words of them who say: "Prophesy ye not." God hears and He wants all to know that He hears. God, likewise, looks upon New Testament believers and makes note of when we cast His commandments aside. God would have all men know Him and know their standing before Him.

In verse 7, Micah directs the house of Jacob to answer three rhetorical questions: Is the Spirit of the Lord straitened? Are these His doings? Does not the word of the Lord do good for them who walk uprightly? These questions require one to think upon the character of God and to answer in truth. The Spirit of God is not made narrow by them of hardened heart. The evil of men is not of God. God's word directs men in the way of righteousness.

God asked but Israel did not answer. The house of Jacob had already answered the Lord's questions through their actions. They were as an enemy that attacked the innocent passerby and as a heartless landlord who evicted helpless women (v. 8, 9). They did not believe that they should be required to answer to God. They had lifted themselves above God. Is not America of today and the world likewise pretending that the Spirit of God is straitened and men shall not be accountable for their

actions? Have men not turned from the truth? God looked upon the house of Jacob and issued His eviction order: "Arise ye, and depart" (v. 10). God's people, who were His people in name only, would depart less than thirty years later when Assyria would

conquer Israel and remove the inhabitants from the land. In verse 11, Micah was moved by the Holy Spirit to declare them who issued false words of assurance to be the prophets which Israel deserved.

Israel most certainly received that which the people deserved. All who turn from God's word shall get their just desserts. The Lord called Micah to warn Israel of the judgment to come because He takes no pleasure in judgment. The Lord is not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance (II Pet. 3:9). Nonetheless, the day of

judgment shall come as a thief in the night (II Pet. 3:10). God's judgment cannot come upon believers as a thief in the night. God's judgment upon believers was satisfied upon the cross at Calvary. Christ has borne the judgment which every believer deserves. May all

men hear the word of God and come to repentance.
