Putnam County Gets Harriet Tubman Visits Putnam County \$1,000,000-Plus in Opioid Settlement

The Putnam County Commission received an opioid settlement update from Alan Pritt of Pritt & Spano, PLLC, at its September 13 meeting. Pritt reported that Putnam County would be the direct recipient of \$1 million to \$1.5 million over a 12 year period. Pritt said that county could expect to receive 20 percent (\$200,000 minimum) of the total before the end of February, 2023.

Pritt told the commission that most of the \$400 million statewide settlement with the Big Three opioid distributors (AmerisourceBergen, Cardinal Health, and McKesson) would go toward abatement programs which would be administered by a nonprofit opioid foundation which would benefit Putnam County but would not require county resources.

Pritt stated that the county could use its share of the settlement money for anything which has a link to addressing the opioid problem. He said that nearly everything in law enforcement would be an

eligible use — new facility construction, new hires, equipment.

In unrelated business, the commission authorized three grant applications totaling \$689,750.00. A grant through FEMA for emergency generators to fully power the Courthouse and the Judicial Annex of \$583,350 requires the county to provide \$72,918 in matching funds. The other grant applications (\$100,000 from the Courthouse Facilities Authority and \$6,400 through the Hazard Security Program) require a 20 percent match from the county.

The commission did not act upon an agenda item which would have established a Putnam County Towing Policy. State code stipulates that eligible towing companies must have a storage yard. Hurricane Wrecker is the only towing service within the county that meets this qualifications. The commission voted to postpone action and asked County Attorney Larry Frye to obtain rate information from Hurricane Wrecker.

History came alive during the Putnam County Homecoming as abolitionist and social activist Harriet Tubman gave a presentation at the Winfield Community Center. Harriet, portrayed by History Alive presenter Ilene Evans, told her story through a combination of spoken narrative and spiritual songs.

Harriet Tubman was born on a plantation in Maryland in the early 1820's. When Harriet was a child, she was hit in the head by a metal weight which an overseer had thrown at another worker. After she recovered from the injury, she suffered from headaches and seizures which caused her to fall into a sleep-like state. The owner of the plantation was an

unscrupulous man, selling off members of Harriet's family and continuing to enslave them even when they should have been manumitted according to the final wishes of former owners. Harriet resented those who enslaved her, and she dreamed of escaping. She found comfort and inspiration from the stories of the Bible, especially the account of Moses leading

the Israelites to freedom. The highlight of the lecture was a dramatic retelling of Harriet's escape into Pennsylvania which kept audience members on the edge of their seats. People who were sympathetic to the plight of the enslaved tried to do whatever they could to assist them in fleeing to safety, and so began the Underground Railroad. (Continued to Page 3)

The descendants of Calvery and Lucretia Gibson held their family reunion on Sunday, September 18, at the Bethel Baptist Church Activities Building on Hurricane Creek Road. The activities building which was the site of the event is located around 100 yards from the spot where Calvery was murdered by Confederate bushwhackers during the Civil War.

Due to the COVID pandemic, the once annual family gathering has not been held since 2019. There were more than forty people in attendance.

a vast network of safe houses and secret routes. As Harriet traveled from one Underground Railroad station to the next, the slave catchers were hot on her trail. She had many close calls, but fortunately, she managed to elude her pursuers and arrive safely in Pennsylvania. Later, she returned to Maryland to help the rest of her family escape from slavery.

As is the tradition of History Alive presentations, the first part of the lecture was conducted in character, and was followed by a question-and-answer session with the historical personage. Towards the end of the lecture, Evans broke character to discuss details which Harriet Tubman would not know.

Ilene Evans, a communications professor at Fairmont State University, does in-character lectures as part of the West Virginia Humanities Council's History Alive program. Harriet Tubman is one of several influential women whom she portrays, which include Memphis

Tennessee Garrison, an African American activist in West Virginia during the Jim Crow Era; educator and suffragist Coralie Franklin Cook; and other historical figures. Evans is also the artistic director of Voices From The Earth, a historical theater arts organization based in Tucker County. The goal of Voices From The Earth is to preserve stories in danger of becoming lost, especially those of African Americans.

While the real Harriet Tubman never came to Putnam County, there were at least two stations along the Underground Railroad in Winfield and Eleanor.

No More New Costs for Small Businesses

As the midterm elections near, it's clear the economy is still on the mind of voters. Record high inflation, supply chain issues, labor force struggles and more have made the last few years tough on any small business. As our politicians in Washington come home to campaign for the next few months, they will celebrate small businesses like mine as the backbone of local economies. When they head back to Washington we have one simple ask, 'Don't make things worse.'

In West Virginia, in many ways we are still working to get our economy back to pre-pandemic levels. Our labor force participation rate still struggles and businesses across the state are feeling it. But the last few years have made our businesses tougher and more resilient. The pandemic forced us to adapt, many of us moving our sales entirely online. The digital marketplace became a savoir, and now some in Washington want to turn the whole system on its head.

Several proposals coming out of Congress seek to hamper innovation within our domestic technology sector. These proposals, often framed as giving more "choice", would have the opposite effect. On top of limiting the growth and innovation within this sector, these proposals would also worsen the record-breaking costs hurting our businesses. Attempts to stifle U.S. tech innovation will in turn have a ripple effect, costing small businesses like mine money and more.

A recent report from Data Catalyst estimates "conservatively that small and medium-sized retail businesses ("SMB Sellers") would lose roughly \$500 billion in sales in just the first five years after the passage of

the "Big Tech" antitrust legislation currently being considered by Congress." This "regulatory tax" would cost each business more than \$1,700 per month. According to the report, "the \$500 billion in estimated lost SMB sales reflects the aggregate effects of higher costs for digital platform services and lost access to some of those services."

How, after years of closures, supply shortages and more, would Congress want to remove these services from our local businesses?

The following events happened on these dates in West Virginia history. To read more, go to e-WV: The West Virginia Encyclopedia at www.wvencyclopedia.org.

Sept. 22, 1856: Albert Blakeslee "A. B." White was born in Cleveland, Ohio. He was West Virginia's 11th governor, serving from 1901-05. He was the fourth person to serve as governor from Wood County, his adopted home.

Sept. 22, 1894: Louis Bennett Jr. was born in Weston. Bennett was West Virginia's only World War I flying ace. With 12 combat kills, including three aircraft and nine balloons, Bennett placed himself ninth on the roster of aces. This record was accomplished in just 10 days after assignment to his combat unit.

Sept. 23, 1922: Five men were struck and killed at the Glen Rogers mine in Wyoming County when equipment fell during the construction of a deep shaft.

Sept. 23, 1938: The Mingo Oak was cut down

after succumbing to the fumes of a burning coal refuse pile. The Mingo Oak, which stood near the Logan-Mingo county line, was more than 500 years old and may have been the largest white oak in the world.

Sept. 24, 1918: George Spencer "Spanky" Roberts was born in London, Kanawha County. He entered aviation cadet training with the first class of Tuskegee Airmen and became the first African-American military pilot from West Virginia.

Sept. 25, 1864: George Smith Patton was killed at the Battle of Winchester. Patton, a Charleston lawyer, had organized the Kanawha Riflemen, a Virginia militia company. He was the grandfather of Gen. George S. Patton of World War II.

Sept. 28, 1955: Labor activist Sarah "Mother" Blizzard died at the age of 90. Blizzard was deeply involved in the United Mine Workers of America, from the organization's early beginnings in the late 19th century.

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1/2 cup finely chopped yellow onion
- 8 ounces mushrooms, such as white button, crimini or portabella, finely chopped
- 1/2 pound lean ground beef
- 1 tablespoon taco seasoning
- 6 burrito-size flour tortillas (about 10 inches each)
- 1/3 cup nacho cheese sauce
- 6 tostada shells
- sour cream
- 6 mini soft taco-size flour tortillas (about 4 1/2 inches each)
- shredded lettuce
- diced tomatoes
- shredded Mexican cheese blend
- nonstick cooking spray

In large skillet over medium-high heat, heat olive oil. Cook onions 1-2 minutes until translucent. Add mushrooms and ground beef. Cook about 5 minutes, or until beef is no longer pink. Stir in taco seasoning. Cook 2-3 minutes. Set aside.

Lay one large flour tortilla on flat surface. Spread 2 tablespoons mushroom-meat mixture on center of tortilla.

Drizzle dollop of nacho cheese over mushroom-meat mixture. Top meat with one tostada shell then spread thin layer of sour cream over tostada shell.

Top with shredded lettuce, diced tomatoes and shredded Mexican cheese then one small tortilla. Make sure not to overstuff so wrap doesn't break apart while cooking.

Fold edges of large tortilla toward center until completely covered.

In hot skillet, generously spray with nonstick cooking spray. Carefully place wrap seam side down on skillet. Cook 2-3 minutes until golden brown.

Flip and cook other side until golden brown. Repeat with remaining mushroom-meat mixture, tortillas and toppings.

Cut wraps half and serve.

God's Covenant with Israel

Exodus 19:16-25

In the scene before us, the children of Israel are encamped before Mount Sinai. This campsite was of God's choosing. God had led them from Egypt to Sinai going before them by day in a pillar of a cloud and by night in a pillar of fire. The Lord pre-planned Israel's journey to Sinai. That which is recorded in the scripture before us is not happenstance.

"It came to pass on the third day in the morning" (v. 16). "It" in this instance, is the visible and audible presence of the Lord in the form of a thick cloud and thunders and lightnings. New Testament believers cannot help but reflect upon the fact that a very different "It" occurred upon the morning of the third day 13 or 14 centuries later when the Lord Jesus Christ arose from the grave. That which occurred at Sinai and that which occurred at the resurrection were the same in that on both occasions the Lord revealed Himself to men. The two occurrences were very different because Sinai marked the beginning of the law and the resurrection marked the fulfillment of the law.

"And Moses brought forth the people out of the camp to meet with God" (v. 17). Moses did as he had been instructed to do. The Lord told Moses that He came as a thick cloud such that men might know that He spoke to him (Moses) and that they would believe him (Moses) forever (see v. 9).

Verse 18 describes that which the people beheld. They saw smoke and fire unlike any smoke and fire which they had ever seen. The entire mountain was engulfed in smoke. If an educated man of today were to observe that which the children of Israel saw, that man likely would describe the event as a volcanic eruption. It matters not if the fire and smoke of verse 18 has a natural or supernatural explanation. That which occurred on the morning of the third day was the form which God chose to manifest Himself to men.

Smoke ascended from the mount in response to the Lord's descending upon it in fire. The smoke is described as like that of smoke from a smoking furnace. Abraham (Abram) looked upon a similar scene following the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah (Gen. 19:28). The image of a smoking furnace and the quaking of the mountain is an image of power and judgment.

"... the voice of the trumpet sounded long, ... Moses spake, and God answered him by voice" (v. 19). The Lord had told Moses that the people were to come up close to the mount when the trumpet sounded long (v. 13). Everything that encompasses this scene —the smoke, the quaking, the closeness of the people to the mount, the trumpet— was orchestrated by God for a singular purpose: God wanted the people to hear Him speak to Moses (v. 9). God wanted Israel to believe the future things which He would tell Moses. God produced this scene such that men might believe with absolute certainty that the words which Moses would relay to them were from Him.

All that the Lord does is done such that men may receive understanding. New Testament believers have been given the Comforter to teach us all things (John 14:26). In verse 20, the Lord called Moses to come to Him at the top of the mount. Upon arriving, Moses was told to go back down the mountain and warn the people not to break through the bounds which Moses had placed around the mount. The Lord had previously instructed Moses to establish bounds so that the people could not go upon the mountain. Why did the Lord require Moses to climb the mountain? Why didn't the Lord instruct Moses to warn the people before He called Moses to come to Him at the top of the mountain?

Again, the answer is found in verse 9. God wanted the people to know that He spoke to them through Moses. Moses had established bounds about the mountain according to God's instruction. If one were to break through the bounds and gaze upon the righteousness of the Lord, that one would perish (v. 21). God can only be approached through an intercessor. For the children of Israel, Moses was that intercessor. The intercessor must go to the Lord.

Israel could not look directly upon the mount because it was obscured by smoke. The children of Israel could not look directly upon the fire in which the Lord descended.

God's covenant with Israel required obedience to the law. Anyone breaking through the bounds about the mountain would perish because they disobeyed God. In verse 22, the Lord instructed Moses to have the priests sanctify themselves lest the Lord break forth upon them.

In verse 23, Moses argued that bounds had been set up such that the people could not go upon the mountain and that the bounds had been sanctified. Moses had done as the Lord had instructed (see verses 12 and 14).

The Lord instructed Moses to go back down the mountain because He wanted the people to know that even priests who had sanctified themselves could not approach Him and live. The self-purification of the most righteous men is insufficient. Aaron alone was able to come upon the mountain because God through Moses (the appointed intercessor) made provision.

New Testament believers have a better intercessor. The Son has satisfied the law and made provision for all who believe. We, like Moses, need come down from the mountain and deliver the Father's message.
