

The Public Integrity & Fraud Unit of the State Auditor's Office was created in 2018 and is tasked with investigating the theft, misuse, and mismanagement of public monies. The unit

Connolly. "When Auditor McCuskey came in, he hired Marty Wright to head the unit," Connolly said. "The very first case right out of the gate - was Richwood."

is now headed by Steve

Connolly was referring to the investigation which culminated in the Auditor's March 29, 2019, report. The report alleged "Mismanagement of City Finance and Abdication of Fiscal Responsibility," as well as "Potential misuse of FEMA monies" on the part of Richwood city officials following the 2016 flood.

"We threw a lot of resources at it and hired more people," Connolly continued. "At that time, I was still with the Secretary of State's office. Marty recruited me to come over. He said, 'We need a prosecutor. We need somebody who can walk into any court in the state and be able to handle these cases."

The investigation led to the conviction of Richwood's former mayor, Bob Henry Baber, for "obtaining money under false pretenses." Marty Wright has since accepted a position with the West Virginia Health Care Association, with Connolly succeeding him as director of the Public Integrity & Fraud Unit.

"I've directly prosecuted, or assisted in the prosecution of, 40 convictions in three-anda-half years," Connolly noted. "I think there were five or six in federal court, and the remainder were in courts around the state. At last count, or that. And then when there have been criminal convictions in 16 counties (in West Virginia), and five federal cases." Currently, the Public Integrity & Fraud Unit employs two human monitors to review purchasing-card (P card) transactions made by public employees authorized to spend state funds. However, the unit also utilizes DataRobot an Artificial Intelligence (AI) platform - to analyze such transactions. "Rather than having eyeballs look at 50,000 credit card transactions a day, the computer can comb through it and give risk-scores for suspicious activities," Connolly said, before further explaining how reports of "state level" suspicious activity are forwarded to the Legislative Commission on Special Investigations (CSI)."We have a great relationship with CSI," Connolly noted."They're basically the legislativeversion of what I do on our side. We do local government, and CSI does state government." In addition to CSI, Connolly credited partnerships with numerous federal, state and local agencies for contributing to the unit's success thus far. However, for all of the reported cases of potential fraud the unit investigates, Connolly shared that as

much as 60% of them are unfounded. As for the cases that are legitimate, according to Connolly, most are acts of necessity or opportunity.

Presently, the Public Integrity and Fraud Unit of the State Auditor's Office has 41 active fraud cases and potentially a dozen more ongoing. This year alone, our case work resulted in seven felony charge convictions. Restitution to the state for misspent funds has already grown to \$556,000. These are tax dollars that were spent fraudulently. This was your money. Our team includes four investigators, seven forensic accountants, and two fraud monitors who look for illegal P-Card purchases. We work with the Southern and Northern District federal prosecutors, plus we have special prosecutorial privileges in five counties.

The formula for fraud is motivation, such as addiction, or past due bills; rationalization, which is the feeling you are somehow due those dollars that do not belong to you; and opportunity, where there is no oversight or transparency and too much trust in one person."

Connolly said the problem normally isn't master criminals.

"(People will tell themselves) 'I'll do this just a little bit, but then I'll put the money back," Connolly explained. "And then they keep doing it, and doing it, and doing it."

"I bet that the 40 people who I've investigated you could interview every one of them - it started out innocently enough,' Connolly added. "It was just a little bit of money from the till, or it was just a little bit of this

"Waiting for Ian"

Imagine being from Hurricane, WV, and again waiting on another hurricane. Living in South Carolina, I became used to waiting for the storms... I lived through tornadoes and blizzards in Ohio and Indiana... one small town near us in Ohio was leveled by a tornado. That being said, waiting for "Ian" was different. Perhaps it is my age... perhaps it was worrying those loved ones who don't live here. I am not sure, but the stress brought on a period of exhaustion.

First of all, my daughter's flight was cancelled. She comes every few weeks, but this trip was special. The family here, she and I... planning to celebrate my birthday, a big one... remember the Class of '65 turning 75 this year... alas... that could not be helped. She and I will celebrate later in October, when she comes.

My son told me that I would be staying with them in their hurricanebuilt home, not in this little condo. Although a major hurricane has not hit this area in one hundred years, I knew he was right. I prepared to go. The waiting... knowing so many days ahead of time. That was difficult. The predictions were that the big storm would get us right where we live... the Tampa area...

Schools closed Tuesday through Friday... became shelters. That was foreboding. I moved to the family's house ... I took a carry on and my important papers. I have few clothes... they would fit in a couple of suitcases, so I only took what I needed for a couple of days... but I did pack a suitcase and leave in my car.

On Tuesday evening, my son came and turned off the water, and we stacked bags of potting soil in front of the doors... or he and the boys did... I put towels all around in case... knowing that if the then in the midst of it all, condo was hit, those would do little to help. However, a little water... The next couple of days were super windy, dark, dark, and the rain... the limbs blowing. The area was sheltered-in-place... nothing open... no cars on the roads... Actually, we only knew what we could see out the windows of the house... and what we could hear. In fact, my condo area was under mandatory evacuation... no questions asked... we were to go. Some did... some just would not. Although my son lives one half mile behind me, he is in an area that is more sheltered, and the huge homes are built to withstand most storms. The family and I spent the days inside...they have so much to do there that the time flew by. All the while, I was worried about my Indy family worried and my friends. When we heard the storm was veering in another direction, we were happy for us but not for those people in the direct path of "IAN"... and we were ok. The damage... the lives lost... IAN did his best... his worst... he hit hard... he made a path through most of Florida and even to South Carolina and above. What a storm... what a mess that hurricane made...the sadness. I could not watch on You Tube for weeping for those about an hour or less south of us. I came home...we put everything back together ... of phone friends ... tons of the boys set the patio up...

they helped me, along with my son. My daughter-inlaw ran to the market for me as I had no energy to shop for food. Thursday night... in my own bed, I could not sleep... perhaps because of the relief... the stress... I was so exhausted... emotionally drained... to have gone through that again and come out unscathed... what a miracle...

Friday, September 30th, my birthday dawned bright and sunny... no school... the five of us ate at the ocean in Clearwater... the ocean calm again. I still do not go into restaurants and eat as Covid has not left our area... we prefer eating outside anyway. We ended up having the best vegan cake ever again... and the gifts... memorable ones... in the back of my mind, I missed my daughter as I knew it was important for her to be here.

I told her and my son, "Well, son, you were in the midst of the pandemic when you had your 50th... October 2020... to my daughter. "You were the same when you had your 50th this year ... " NOW a hurricane for mine... maybe we should schedule birthdays later... we all chuckled... Facetime is a life safer... just saying... My daughter and I are still planning a trip to NYC to celebrate the 75, as we did the 70...

Hurricane Ian came and went... another one will come again. Those storms starting with "I" seem to like hitting Florida with a vengeance... we will prepare ... we will evacuate ... we will keep each other close... I am proud to have a son who took care of me... made room in his garage for all three vehicles... got the condo put together... was prepared with food and water... and gasoline in case we all had to leave... he and his wife and the boys worked for days to get things together... and the four of them took Nana to eat, got the cake and candles, made wishes, and shopped for the best gifts. I am a blessed woman As I finish this column, I hope we remember those in the south of us in prayers... how tragic... I don't know why the hurricane changed course... I just know it helped us... On a sweet note, I must add here... changing the topic... that I met an IAN several years ago. He came into my life kind of like a hurricane... he had a personality and a charm that was unique. He was in my English class... a brilliant and talented young man. He was memorable. (Later, I worked with his charming father...) I hope he is doing well and is making a difference in this world... I just hope he got rid of that notebook with the picture of that president... chuckle, chuckle... So there are two IANS who have changed my world... one for the better having known him... one not so much... and I will remember both because the way we were is the way we are always... please get vaccinated... if not for yourself for those of us who are elderly, heading toward 80 ... and want our total lives back. (I appreciate my friends in WV and elsewhere who were praying for me. I have a cadre of textpraying friends... one of snail mailing friends... one


Recently Auditor McCuskey announced that a member of the State Auditor's Office will be joining the Mountaineer Health Care Fraud Strike Force. The Strike Force was recently created by U.S. Attorney for the Northern District of West Virginia William Ihlenfeld to combat health care fraud in the state. It is a multiagency unit that will take a data-driven approach to uncovering waste and abuse. The official from the Auditor's office and representatives from seven other agencies will discuss fraudulent billing patterns and to identify new targets.

While t h e investigations are proving successful, Connolly has a higher goal, stating that, "Audits aren't supposed to catch fraud that's not their intent. The point of an audit is to make sure measures are in place within an agency to prevent fraud."

"Not to find fraud," Connolly reiterated. "To prevent it."

Lansing, and were the parents of four children. Traveling by wagon, they returned to Meigs County, Ohio in the mid-1880's.

arrived They in Pomeroy late one evening, totally unaware that the town was under quarantine for a smallpox epidemic. Somehow they passed the pickets at the edge of town unnoticed. Supposedly, no one was allowed to enter or leave during the quarantine. Not wanting to stay and jeopardize the health of his children, Allen made plans to leave. He arranged for a large "John" boat to be concealed at river's edge and after darkness, the family, and what belongings there was room for, got in the boat and floated down to Guyandotte, WV. From there, they made their way to Sycamore Creek a few miles south of Hurricane.

They lived for a time on the old Neal farm then moved to Huntington. They later moved back to Sycamore and lived on the John Miller farm. They eventually moved back to Huntington where

Allen was with the fire department. Their last move was to the Milton area near some of Laura's relatives. But they always thought of the Hurricane area as home and are buried in Sycamore Cemetery.

They were the parents of:

Clad Francisco, who, after marriage, moved to Clay County and was a minister and coal miner.

Twins, Ida and Iva. Ida married Ed Fizer and lived in Huntington where they raised a large family. Iva Jane married Jack Miller, remained on Sycamore and they were the parents of Roco, Garley, Joe and Bill.

Letha (Leafy) married Floyd Miller, remained on Sycamore and they were the parents of Bessie (Smith), and Edith (Mitchell).

The Hysell name is no longer common in Hurricane, but whether the name is Mitchell, Fizer, Raines, Miller, Burdette, Smith and others, descendants of Allen and Laura are to be found in abundance. Submitted by: O. R. Miller



Nov. 3, 1947: Kanawha (now Airport Yeager International Airport) was dedicated. World War I ace Capt. Eddie Rickenbacker was among the dignitaries present.

Nov. 4-5, 1985: Heavy rains led to devastating floods in parts of West Forty-seven Virginia. people were killed, and several towns were severely damaged.

Nov. 5, 1891: Alfred Earle "Greasy" Neale was born in Parkersburg. He was one of West Virginia's greatest allaround athletes.

Nov. 5, 1922: Cecil Underwood was born at Josephs Mills in Tyler County. Underwood, West Virginia's 25th and 32nd governor, served as the state's youngest and oldest


chief executive.

Nov. 1863: 6, Confederate troops led by Brig. Gen. John Echols were defeated at Droop Mountain by a larger federal force led by Brig. Gen. William W. Averell. This was one of the most important Civil War battles fought on West Virginia soil.

Nov. 6, 1923: A methane gas explosion killed 27 men inside the Glen Rogers coal mine in Wyoming County. The mine, which opened in 1921, became one of the state's largest. A total of 160 fatalities over a 31-year period occurred at the mine before it was closed.

Nov. 7, 1775: The historic Forks-of-Cheat **Baptist** Church was organized about six miles north of Morgantown. It is the oldest church with continuous records west of the Alleghenies in West Virginia.

Nov. 8, 1936: "It's Wheeling Steel," a halfhour musical variety radio



follow the crowd when the crowd does that which is evil. We need to look at God's word, and not at the crowd, in choosing the way which we should go. The commandment: "neither shalt thou speak in a cause to decline after many to wrest judgment" makes it clear that God's people are to be guided by the intent of His law. It is God's intent that one should seek His will, not crowd approval. We are to be seekers of His will.

In dealing with others, God would have His people deal equally and fairly in every occasion. When one looks upon the poor and afflicted, one is not to extend favor (v. 3) or disfavor (v. 6). God holds both rich and poor to the same standard. God's standard of righteousness is the same for all. The Lord counts believing Him for righteousness. It is the same for all.

God's ways are not the way of the crowd. When one finds an ox or an ass which has gone astray, one is to return it to its owner. This instruction specifically addresses the instance in which the owner of the ass or donkey is one's enemy. Verse 4 illustrates the extent to which one is to reach out to others. If one observes an ass (a beast of burden belonging to someone else) which is unable to perform its task, one is to go out of his way to assist. This is not the way of natural man. Natural man is seen in the parable of the Good Samaritan. Both the priest and the Levite, like the thief, left the wounded man to fend for himself. The Good Samaritan went out of his way to help the helpless.

Again, God's ways are not the ways of natural man. God's instruction to Moses requires a righteousness not found in men. Natural man looks upon his enemy's distress and declares it to be God's judgment. God looked upon our distress and commended "his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us" (Rom. 5:8). We are to do as Christ who selflessly gave Himself for us, the undeserving. It is God's intent that man should realize his need to look to Him to supply the righteousness which the law requires, a righteousness which all men lack.

"Keep thee far from a false matter . . ." (v. 7). Failure to distance one's self from a lie or misrepresentation makes one guilty of any miscarriage of justice which results. The Lord God requires perfection. Keeping far from a false matter nine times out of ten is not satisfactory. God will not justify a single sin. When we ask forgiveness, He is quick and faithful to forgive (I Jn. 1:9). Christ supplies the perfection which the Lord God requires. "I will not justify the wicked" (v. 7). There is no escape from judgment.

In verse 8, Moses cautions against accepting gifts. The gift which one is to refuse has unseen attachments. It is one which influences justice. Acceptance of such gifts cloud the mind and destroy the testimony that God would have His people place before the world.

The instructions of verses 1, 2, 3, 6, 7 and 8, are actions that would normally be implemented in the setting of a courtroom, while that of verses 4 and 5 apply to settings far removed from a hall of justice. The instruction of verse 9 has application both in court and outside of court. Regardless of the setting, God's expectations remain the same. We, as His people, are called to do that which is right in His sight in every place and on every occasion.

We are called to His standard and to be the testimony of His standard. New Testament believers are to be a testimony of Christ who said, "This is my commandment, That ye love one another, as I have loved you" (Jn. 15:12). Let us be obedient.
