ELECTION RESULTS

Putnam Shoots Down Special Levy

Putnam contest, former Sheriff and Steve Deweese easily defeated former County Commissioner Jim Withrow in the only county race which offered candidate.

Only result in which Putnam differed from statewide preference Constitutional Amendment No. 3, Incorporation. Church County voters gave amendment 54% approval. Statewide the amendment received 45% approval. Putnam voters said "No!" to Amendments No.s 1, 2 and 4. Putnam's disapproval of these amendments was not nearly as high as expressed statewide. Statewide and Putnam disapproval rates were: No. 1 - 58% and 54%, No. 2 - 66% and 57%, and No. 4 - 65% and 53%.

Putnam voters gave the Special Fire and Ambulance Levy 52% of the vote. A 60% approval is required for non-school

Residents of Bancroft,

Winfield also voted for County Mayor, Recorder and election results mirrored Council. Bancroft elected the statewide vote with Jami Beth Echols-Hayes, Republicans dominating. John Hackett, Bethany IntheCountyCommission Adkins, Jaycob Phillips Thomas Frame to Council (the only contested race). Buffalo elected Conrad Cain to Mayor, and Barbara Johns Reed, Gary Tucker, Sean Democratic Party Errett, Charley Cain and Doug Pierson to Council in the contested races. elected Poca Shawn Milam, Matt Drema Ward, Veronica Dale Parkins, and Helen Martin to Council. City of Hurricane Acts to Expand Eastward

Council held the first reading of a petition to annex 127.66 acres into Hurricane city limits at it November 7 meeting. Most of the acreage (121.66 acres) is State Road or I-64. The six acres which is not is a portion of the roadways is owned by Martin's Peterbuilt and is located on North Poplar Fork Road adjacent to the I-64 Exit 39 interchange.

The petition must be approved at a second hearing at a future council meeting and by the Putnam County Commission. The Commission is required by statute to approve annexation by petition requests involving single property owners. Martin's Peterbuilt approached the City of Hurricane requesting the city to accept the six acres into city limits.

The roadways involved are the section of State Route 34 (Teays Valley Road east of Wendy's and Route 34 to North Poplar Fork Road) and the section of I-64 from Cow Creek to Exit 39). The annexation of the roadways will result in additional calls by the Hurricane Police Department as it will be tasked with responding to vehicle accidents on the new stretches of 34 and I-64. 



168,000 West Virginians wait until December 15 before turning on the heat

1 in 10 West Virginians will wait until December 15th before warming their

Winter is coming, in the inimitable words from Game of Thrones, and that means only one thing: it's about to get colder. With energy prices, inflation and therefore the cost of living on the rise, it is no surprise that many Americans are tightening their belts and cutting their spending. Usually when this happens, it is purchases of nonessential items that are reduced – perhaps trips to the movies, dining out and gym memberships. It appears, however, that millions of Americans will also be cutting back on essential things in life such as heating, in order to save some money.

ServiceMaster by Zaba Restoration surveyed 3,000 respondents to find out how many say they only plan on turning

on their heating when average temperatures reach freezing (or the lowest temperature where they live). The survey revealed that 168k West Virginians (12%) will only turn their heating on when average outdoor temperatures reach 32°F.

The company analyzed historical weather data (30 years) from Weatherspark. com and found that average temperatures fall to 32°F in West Virginia on December 15th. Each state is different.

In the 48 lower states, Nortrh Dakota is first to turn on the heat. Over 166,000 North Dakotans (29%),have already turned their heating on as temperatures dropped to 32°F on October 24th. And over 1 million hardy Tennesseans will wait until January 7th next year when temperatures reach 32°F before they turn on the

shown for him is one dated 1722, a deed of gift from one John Roberts. It is probable that this transfer marked the marriage of Francis Kirtley to Margaret Roberts, the daughter of John and Elizabeth

Trammel Roberts. Upon the home plantation, situated near the Great Forks of the Rappahonnack River, were raised four sons and


two daughters: William,

Thomas, Francis, James, Sarah Frances and Mary. Francis Kirtley served as Captain in the French and Indian War (1756)

and in all ways seemed to

by his peers. Earlier he was appointed one of five constables of Spotsylvania County, was a lieutenant in the Militia 1724ó30 and further served as a church warden of S. Mark's Parish. Upon his death' in 1763, much of his land was sold by the several inheriting sons. Indeed, James Kirtley even bought from his mother her right and title to the plantation "whereon she lives". He did agree in the same bond to build his mother "a house sixteen feet wide and twentyófour feet long with two rooms and a stack of brick or stone chimneys", to further care for her in her lifetime.



Obedience Among Neighbors Leviticus 19:9-18, 33-37

The words before us were spoken by God to Moses in the interim between the setting up of the tabernacle (Ex. 40:17) and the departure of the children of Israel from Sinai (Num. 10:11). In the fifty days between the completion of the tabernacle and the departure of Israel from Sinai, God issued instruction to Moses more than forty times. God's instruction in Leviticus 19 deals with the manner in which His people were to conduct themselves once they took possession of the promised land.

In verse 2, God states, "Ye shall be holy: for I the Lord your God am holy." In the specific instruction in the text before us, God links His holiness to manner in which His people are to conduct their everyday affairs.

Verse 9 deals with gathering the harvest. The manner in which harvests were gathered three thousand-plus years ago was much different from modern day methods, but God's instruction to ancient Israel has application in the affairs of men today. When the fields were harvested and the grapes of the vineyard were gathered, not all grain and not all grapes were to be collected. A portion was to be left in the field and in the vineyard for the poor and for the stranger. The purpose of leaving the grain unreaped and the grapes unpicked was to provide for individuals who lacked resources to satisfy their needs. God did not instruct the owners of the fields and vineyards to give of the produce that their workers had gathered. God instructed the owners to make it possible for the poor and the stranger to help themselves. The poor and the stranger were not given a handout; they were given a means by which they could help themselves. The holy God who said: "Ye shall be holy: for I the Lord your God am holy" requires His people to make a provision for the needy such that they can help themselves. That instruction was given to Israel, but God's standard of holiness remains unchanged.

God requires New Testament believers to love one another as He loves us (Jn. 15:12). The God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob instructs us to make it possible for those who have not to partake in that which He has given to us. His love is to be shared with all who will receive it.

In verse 10, the Lord states why Israel is (and New Testament believers)

are to do as He has commanded: "I am the Lord your God." In verses 11 and 12, God specifies the manner in which His people are to

be known. His people are to be known by their honesty and by the manner in which they uphold His name. Their conduct, in dealing with their equals, was to be such that an observer outside the camp of Israel would look upon their honest dealings and attribute them to the God which they served. It is God's intent that the world should know Him through His people.

In verses 13 and 14, God's instruction turns to the conduct of individuals who enjoy a position which would enable them to victimize others. Neighbors, hirelings and the handicapped, are specifically listed. God forbids His people from engaging in any practice which defrauds, inconveniences or puts others in harm's way. God says: "... fear thy God: I am Lord." All who would victimize others will find that they must face God's judgment. In some instances it is possible to unintentionally place a stumbling block before the blind or to accidentally trade something of low value for that which is of great worth with no intent to defraud. Such happenings do not reflect the holiness of God. Thoughtfulness and diligence are part of the holiness of God.

One is to judge his neighbor in righteousness (v. 15). One is to judge as God judges. God is neither a respecter of the poor or an honorer of the rich.

God's standard for regarding one's neighbor is spelled out in verses 16-18. Verses 16 and 18 close with the phrase: "I am the Lord." God holds His people to a standard uncommon to the world because He is God. He is holy and His people must be holy as He is holy. His holiness extends beyond refraining from harmful acts. His holiness requires His people to reach out and to love their neighbor as thyself.

God's people are to be known for the manner in which they deal with strangers (see v. 33-34). The stranger is to be as one who is native born. God's people are to regard the stranger as their neighbor. They are to love the stranger as thyself. God would have all men to know His love.

"Ye shall do no unrighteousness in judgment" (v. 35). This is the same words which the Lord spoke in verse 15. Verse 35 addresses business dealings while verse 15 addressed dealings involving individuals of differing status. God is righteous in all of His ways. Again, God's people are to reflect His righteousness.

In verse 37, God tells His people to both observe His statutes and to do them. God does not require anything of His people that He does not require of Himself. We, His people, are to extend our love to others as He has extended His love to us. The children of Israel knew Him to be the God

who brought them out of Egypt. We are children of the New Covenant. We know Him as the One who made us free from sin. He gave His only begotten Son to die in our place such that He might justify all who believe.

Let us live before men, extending care and concern, such that men may know the God who so loved us, the undeserving.

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


