Ron Arthur, former Winfield Police Chief and retired West Virginia State Trooper, has officially been named the School Safety Security and Administrator for the Division of Protective Services, School Safety and Security Division. Pursuant to

Governor's School Safety Initiative, developed through the West Virginia Department of Homeland Security earlier this year, the Division of Protective Services (Capitol Police) will now house the West Virginia School Safety and Security Division. As Administrator for the School Safety and Security Division, Ron Arthur brings over 20 years of law enforcement experience and leadership skills to assist in the program's development.

"My goal is to make the program the best it can possibly be," Arthur said. "I want it to be so good that other states want to copy it, and parents thank God their kids go to school in West Virginia."

As a lifelong resident of West Virginia, Arthur has a vested interest in the

safety and security of the state. He has dedicated most of his life to serving West Virginia and the United States. After he graduated from Concord University in 1992, Arthur became a Paratrooper for the United States Army National Guard.

In 1995, Arthur graduated from the West Virginia Police Academy. He was subsequently stationed at the Logan Detachment, where he served until he retired in 2020 as the West Virginia State Police Special Operations Commander.

On May 16th, 2020, Arthur was named Chief of the Winfield Police Department, where he served until he took the position of Administrator of the School Safety and Security Division.

"Ron Arthur is exactly who West Virginia needs to ensure this program is implemented successfully," says Kevin Foreman, Director of the Division of Protective Services. "We are so fortunate to have him on our team, and I am excited for the future of

Former Putnam County Bank Head John 'Jack' Wilson, Sr. Passes

On December 3, 2022, John "Jack" Wilson, former President, Chief Executive Officer and Chairman of the Board of Putnam County Bank and Putnam Bancshares, Inc. passed away.

Jack and Putnam County Bank were one and the same. He was the goto person when one had a financial need. Like many in the community, I knew Jack in a business capacity. He helped me time and time again.

I knew Jack in other ways, too. He shared some of his experiences as a youth with the Breeze. Jack responded to an article which Irene Ambler wrote in 1981 in which she recounted wearing worn out shoes with flapping soles during the years of the Great Depression. Jack said that he had the same problem (Jack was 12 years younger than Irene). Irene was surprised to learn that Jack coped with his flapping soles by wearing rubber jar

rings around his worn-out

shoes. Irene was not aware

and early '50's. I was the son of an unemployed factory worker during the difficult economic times that immediately followed World War II. Jack was the son of a banker. I marveled that we both had need of

Later, I learned from Jack that he and I shared similar somewhat experience relating to dairy cows. During my pre-teen years, I was tasked, twice daily, with milking two or three of my grandfather's cows by hand. Jack milked two Jeresy cows and sold milk to customers during his high school years in Hurricane.

Jack was no ordinary banker. He understood what others experience and was always ready to enable them to help themselves and to make Hurricane and Putnam County a better

of the Shenandoah Valley, the winters were harsh and the Blue Ridge brooding.

The "good" land was claimed early in the settlement of the area, so Stewart Rowan sought other means to provide for his family. The route westward provided the answer; his land faced a frequently traveled road. The Census of 1850 titled him a hotel keeper.

The Civil War brought a different kind of guest to Stewart Rowan's inn. Depending upon the fortunes of war, guests were tailored in blue or gray uniforms. The Rowans favored the Confederate

Probably sometime in 1862, a company of cavalry was quartered at the inn. A young lieutenant caught Maggie's fancy, a Lt. Charles J. S. Kirtley from Hurricane Bridge in western Virginia (Putnam County). Lt. Kirtley wore his uniform well and was ably served by his black servant, Jeff Maghee. Jeff had been with C.J.S. from boyhood and had accompanied his master when he rode from Hurricane Bridge to Buffalo Creek to be mustered into the 36 Batt'n Virginia Cavalry of the Provisional Army of the Confederate States on 1 November, 1862.

They were brothers of time and place. When C.J.S. was elected lieutenant, Jeff was filled with pride. But the brilliant autumn days yielded to the cold rains of December, which in turn yielded to the sleet and snow of January. The festivities of the musteringóin gave way to the harsh reality of skirmishes, the wounded and the dead. With relief, they paused at the Rowan Inn, to rest their mounts and their weary bodies.

Here it was that C.J.S. vowed his enduring love to promising to return to marry her and take her home to Hurricane Bridge. He described the Kanawha Valley in the most gentle terms. It held promises

Return he did in 1863 to marry her on the 6th day of May. Pastor John Repass of the Evangelical Lutheran Church found them a handsome couple and prayed that peace would soon bless their union. Charles J.S. soon rejoined his company and Maggie's happiness dulled, tarnished by the despair of separation. She longed to escape the valley, the inn,

The tides of war turned against the Confederacy, and the bright promise of a November day at Buffalo Creek was swept away. Instead there was hunger and dysentary, unquenchable thirst gnawing

the war!

hunger, amputation and mutilation. Death marched before them.

Death marched, as well in Tennessee, where the half-brother of C.J.S., Frank Kirtley fell at the Battle of Morristown, 12 December, 1863. Six years younger than Frank, C.J.S. held his brother in the

highest esteem. Overcome by his personal sorrow, yearning for Maggie, his horror of the sick and dying, Charles J.S. fled to Giles County, where

he reclaimed Maggie. Together they set out for the comparative safety of Charleys Creek and Hurricane Bridge. He was dropped from the

Confederate rolls on 24

April, 1864.

passed...The Time heroes returned, like cousins, Mahlon and Morris Kirtley, while the one hero, Frank, continued to haunt them all. A pocketful of tears became a flood of despair when a stillborn male child was born to Maggie in 1867.

Sorrow heaped on sorrow! The grandfather, Joseph Kirtley, died "of old age" in December of that year. A few months later Frank's young sons succumbed to the flux. More despair.

Offsetting these losses in 1871 was the birth of Stewart Simms Kirtley on 25 April. C.J.S. and Maggie rejoiced in this son. Virginia B. was born two years later, but pneumonia claimed her at age six

Then, on a stifling day in August of 1875, double triumph and celebration... TWIN sons, John and Mahlon Oak ("Oakie") were born. Charles J.S. was Exuberant! Then, suddenly, health his faltered, righted itself briefly, but abruptly worsened. At age 31, he died "paralyzed". Maggie's horror and emptiness was magnified when baby John fell to diphtheria. One year old and taken from her!

She never the recovered from multiple losses. Her "sometimes" ill health became a gradual but steady decline, the cough a chronic racking one. She died of consumption on 9 September, 1877.

Out of his grief, Jeremiah Kirtley took up his pen, writing sadly to the inn in Giles County, "Our Maggie is dead this day." ... The Blue Ridge brooded even more darkly that year; the waters in Charleys Creek were frozen white, empty of any image.

Attorney General Morrisey Urges Consumers to Use Caution with Holiday Credit Card Offers

West Virginia Attorney General Patrick Morrisey is urging consumers to exercise caution when evaluating credit card offers this holiday

The advice comes as part of the Attorney General's Holiday Consumer Protection Week.

Consumers may see an uptick in credit card offers with the Christmas shopping season now in full swing. While it may be tempting to take advantage of the "buy now, pay later" option, the Attorney General urges

consumers to verify the credit card offer is legitimate.

"It's always a good idea to verify any sort of offer you may receive," Attorney General Morrisey said. "Credit cards can be attractive as they offer consumers the option to pay off purchases over time, but credit card fraud can wreak havoc on finances, so it's important to be vigilant."

Holiday credit card offers require a close reading of the contract. Deferred interest promotions may promise zero-percent interest through

BASIC BIBLE

God's Promise to David II Samuel 7:4-16

God's ways are different from the ways of men. The text before us is given such that we may know and understand His ways and know Him.

The text opens with the words: "And it came to pass that night" (v. 4). These words introduce God's response to the events recorded in verses 2 and 3. In verse 2, King David is troubled by what he perceived as an inequality. David dwelt in a house of cedar —a house of luxury— while the ark of God dwelt in the tabernacle (a tent). It is apparent that David's sense of fairness prompted him to call upon the prophet Nathan for advice. Nathan reasoned that God had been with David and that David would do well to do what was in his heart. Nathan knew that it was in David's heart to honor God. There is little doubt that the manner in which David intended to honor God was by building a structure that would

It was not the Lord's will that David should build a house to honor Him. God intervened such that future generations might know and understand His grace.

God spoke to Nathan on that very night and said: "Go tell my servant David . . ." In the message that followed, God presented a synopsis of Israel's history from the time of Israel's coming out of Egypt to David's rise from a shepherd boy to become king of all Israel.

Why did God answer in this manner? God gave David (and us) a history lesson because the history of Israel and the tabernacle is representative of spiritual things that God would have us know and understand. It was God's will that Israel should come out of Egypt with great gain (see Gen. 15:13-14). The Lord caused the Egyptians to heap jewels of gold and silver, and raiment upon the departing people whom they had held in bondage (Ex. 12:35). Israel was delivered from Egypt by God's grace, and His grace alone. David, likewise, was elevated from tending sheep to become ruler of Israel by God's grace alone.

Consider the tabernacle —a tent, a nonpermanent structure. In its innermost part was the Holy of Holies which contained the Ark of the Covenant. The ark contained the testimony of God. The ark held the ten commandments (God's law), Aaron's rod (symbolic of God's power), and a container of manna (symbolic of God's provision). The only light within the Holy of Holies was the Shekinah which is of God. The tabernacle (a temporary dwelling place) was the house of God by God's choosing; it was not the house of God by an accident of history or by will of man. The tabernacle was fashioned from the abundance which Israel took from Egypt and all of it furnishings testified of that which God performed.

David's rise from a lowly shepherd boy to king of Israel, like the dwelling place of God, was of God's choosing —a choosing that illustrates spiritual things that God would have us know and understand. God told David that the day would come when He (God) would establish the kingdom of David's seed, and, he (David's seed) would build a house for my (God's) name (v. 13). God also stated that this kingdom which He (God) would establish would be forever (v. 16).

God stated that these things would come to pass after David died. David's son, Solomon, ruled from the throne of his father and Solomon constructed the temple. These things took place after David died. Solomon most certainly was the seed of David, and, Solomon most certainly built a house for God's name (the temple), but Solomon's kingdom was not the kingdom that God promised to establish. The promised kingdom would endure forever. Solomon's kingdom did not last. It was immediately divided following Solomon's death and ceased to exist in any form 2,600 years ago.

When God stated that He would establish the kingdom of one who would proceed from the bowels of David, was he speaking of Solomon or of Christ Jesus? Was God speaking of a spiritual kingdom or a physical kingdom? Bible believing Christians are now (present tense) members of the spiritual kingdom established by God. We await the day of Christ's return when He physically shall sit upon the physical throne of David in Jerusalem. That physical throne is the throne of which God speaks in verses 13 and 16. God states that the throne upon which the promised seed shall sit shall be established forever. The everlasting throne and the physical throne will be one when Christ returns. The physical throne upon which Solomon sat when he built the temple was established before Solomon's birth.

"I will be his father, and he shall be my son. If he commit iniquity, I will chasten him with the rod of men, and with the stripes of the children of men" (v. 14). These words of God the Father are not directed to the

preincarnate Son who was with God and who was God from the beginning (see John 1:1). They are words which were for the ears of all who would follow David — a father-son relationship with the Lord awaited every king who would sit upon David's throne. A similar relationship is promised to New Testament believers (see Jn.

1:12-13). Let us claim the promise which He has given.
