Former Winfield Police Chief to Head WV School Safety and Security

Ron Arthur, former Winfield Police Chief and retired West Virginia State Trooper, has officially been named the School Safety and Security Administrator for the Division of Protective Services, School Safety and Security Division.

Pursuant to the Governor's School Safety Initiative, developed through the West Virginia Department of Homeland Security earlier this year, the Division of Protective Services (Capitol Police) will now house the West Virginia School Safety and Security Division. As Administrator for the School Safety and Security Division, Ron Arthur brings over 20 years of law enforcement experience and leadership skills to assist in the program's development.

"My goal is to make the program the best it can possibly be," Arthur said. "I want it to be so good that other states want to copy it, and parents thank God their kids go to school in West Virginia."

As a lifelong resident of West Virginia, Arthur has a vested interest in the

safety and security of the state. He has dedicated most of his life to serving West Virginia and the United States. After he graduated from Concord University in 1992, Arthur became a Paratrooper for the United States Army National Guard.

In 1995, Arthur graduated from the West Virginia Police Academy. He was subsequently stationed at the Logan Detachment, where he served until he retired in 2020 as the West Virginia State Police Special Operations Commander.

On May 16th, 2020, Arthur was named Chief of the Winfield Police Department, where he served until he took the position of Administrator of the School Safety and Security Division.

"Ron Arthur is exactly who West Virginia needs to ensure this program is implemented successfully," says Kevin Foreman, Director of the Division of Protective Services. "We are so fortunate to have him on our team, and I am excited for the future of" (Continued to Page 3)

'Yuletide in the Park' — Preview of Christmas Joy





Former Putnam County Bank Head John 'Jack' Wilson, Sr. Passes

On December 3, 2022, John "Jack" Wilson, former President, Chief Executive Officer and Chairman of the Board of Putnam County Bank and Putnam Bancshares, Inc. passed away.

Jack and Putnam County Bank were one and the same. He was the go-to person when one had a financial need. Like many in the community, I knew Jack in a business capacity. He helped me time and time again.

I knew Jack in other ways, too. He shared some of his experiences as a youth with the Breeze. Jack responded to an article which Irene Ambler wrote in 1981 in which she recounted wearing worn out shoes with flapping soles during the years of the Great Depression. Jack said that he had the same problem (Jack was 12 years younger than Irene). Irene was surprised to learn that Jack coped with his flapping soles by wearing rubber jar rings around his worn-out shoes. Irene was not aware

of the jar ring method. I was. I employed the same anti-flapping technology to my shoes in the late 1940's and early '50's.

I was the son of an unemployed factory worker during the difficult economic times that immediately followed World War II. Jack was the son of a banker. I marveled that we both had need of jar rings.

Later, I learned from Jack that he and I shared a somewhat similar experience relating to dairy cows. During my pre-teen years, I was tasked, twice daily, with milking two or three of my grandfather's cows by hand. Jack milked two Jersey cows and sold milk to customers during his high school years in Hurricane.

Jack was no ordinary banker. He understood what others experience and was always ready to enable them to help themselves and to make Hurricane and Putnam County a better place.

Hurricane Mayor Scott Edwards posted the following tribute on his Facebook page:

"Without Jack Wilson, I'm really not sure where I'd be today. I owe an awful lot to this man and his bank, the Putnam County Bank. At a lower point in my life, in my 20's, I needed a loan for a car, which was provided without question. Later on, and soon after I started Netranom, I quickly realized I was undercapitalized (didn't have enough money) and needed help quick. I had 2 options (1) close down and give up or (2) ask for help. I went to see Clara

Carmichael at PCB, told her my situation, she walked over to Mr. Wilson and, within minutes, the help I needed was on the way. I paid him back within 6 months and started growing the company. Throughout the years, he and PCB have helped me continue to grow Netranom, start and grow Teays Properties and continue hiring employees. Without Mr. Wilson's trust in me (and ultimately trust in my father), I'm really not sure where I'd be or what I would be doing today. Personally, I am forever grateful to him and the Putnam County Bank.

"Jack Wilson gave good advice and helped so many people and families. He believed in the people of Hurricane and surrounding areas and always wanted to see it grow and prosper.

"There are hundreds and probably thousands of stories just like mine. Mr. Wilson and Putnam County Bank have helped so many individuals, so many non-profits, so many kids groups and so many others throughout Putnam County and the entire region, including helping the town of Hurricane when needed over the years. We should all be thankful for all he and the bank have done. Mr. Wilson will be missed by many.

"Rest in peace Jack Wilson"

Senator Glenn Jeffries Announces Switch to Republican Party

that he has switched his Party affiliation. Jeffries will join the Republican caucus in the state senate.

"I have the greatest respect for the many friends and supporters I have been blessed with during my time in public office," Jeffries said. "I hope to continue and strengthen those relationships going forward."

Senator Jeffries said that when he was first running for election in 2016, he pledged to work in a bipartisan way to find solutions for our biggest problems in West Virginia. He plans to continue those efforts.

"Our politics have gotten so personal and difficult," said Senator Jeffries. "I want to make sure that I serve constituents and our state in a respectful, thoughtful way that leads to a better life for all West Virginians."

Last year, Senator Jeffries wrote a letter to Berkshire Hathaway (BH) Chairman Warren Buffett inviting him

to visit West Virginia. During the past year, Jeffries has hosted BH executives in West Virginia dozens of times. His persistence led the company to bring two BH subsidiaries, Precision Castparts Corporation (PCC) and BHE Renewables into West Virginia. The companies agreed to purchase from the state 2,000 acres in Jackson County, the site of the former Century Aluminum Plant. PCC will build a state-of-the-art titanium melt facility that manufactures products for the aerospace and other industries. The PCC plant will be powered by BHE Renewables with a first of its kind 100% renewable energy microgrid that utilizes solar power and battery storage. The project represents a \$500 million investment in West Virginia.

Senator Glenn Jeffries is the owner and President of Cornerstone Interiors of Eleanor, which specializes

CHARLES J. S. KIRTLEY (1845-1876) MAGGIE E. ROWAN KIRTLEY (1843-1877)

Her name was Margaret E. Rowan, but she was called "Maggie" because her mother was also a Margaret. Stewart Rowan, her father was an innkeeper in a section of western Virginia which was a part of Botocourt County in the Census of 1850, but later became a portion of Giles County. We lived with her most of my life, my growing up years at 2612 Virginia Avenue, Hurricane, WV. Oh my... I remember her words, "Brenda Joyce, don't run up and down those steps." If she could see me now, one step is difficult for me to go up and down... I have now lived ten years longer than she did.

Our old black dial up phone sat at the bottom of those steps. I was on it often despite the party line. The front room was cold in the winter, to conserve heat... I didn't mind, and I just added an extra sweater. I had to

talk to my besties. Those were the days... I will take the beautiful warm weather here in Florida...

I remember coming in from sleigh riding, Mama took our gloves and ice covered clothes to the kitchen to thaw... delicious hot chocolate and homemade cake or cookies awaited. She made the best pinto beans and corn bread, and her soups were delicious. No one can make her chocolate cake and white icing and her chocolate fudge... I have never been able to duplicate it.

Remembering Mama Coyner... she loved her gospel music. One song that she played loudly, "What Heaven Means to Me..." I love that song, and I did have her actual album. In my moves, it has gone missing... I wish... I had it... oh alas...

Walking to the grocery with Mama was a delight; she never let me carry too much. When I started to drive, to work, and bought a little Mustang... I took her to get her groceries and run her errands. Wednesday afternoon or Saturday every week... whichever day I had off work... she had fun... I did too... I remember my high school graduation... the lovely card with two one dollar bills... that was a treasure to me, knowing she saved it for me...

There are too many memories... too many to mention... but the most important one is that my Mama Coyner was a woman of faith, and despite her health problems, she maintained her Christianity stance forever. She was always there... from my birth until her death in June 1974... I remember...

We had just bought our first home in Ohio; Mother called me to tell me Mama had died suddenly. I hung up on her because I could not believe that would happen, and I was in shock. She called me back and when she said, "Allen's took Mama," I knew it was real. Allen Funeral Home was our salvation back then... not just when someone died, but they often did ambulance service also... if I remember correctly... don't quote me on that... but Tony Allen was our helper...

Mama's funeral was at the Nazarene Church in Hurricane... she could walk there readily, and she did every time the doors were opened. Her nephew, Ray Hager, and his group sang... you guessed it, "What Heaven Means to Me," among other hymns. I remember Ray telling us that they would sing it the way "Aunt Opal" liked it... lively... Susan Henson and her dad did the music also. Thanks to all of them... beautiful and lovely and gorgeous service... meaningful to my Mama Coyner, Opal Francis Depriest Coyner... I remember her... I loved her like a second mother... because the way we were is the way we are... a part of our ancestors... I had the best... I am the Nana I am partly because of her.

If you have a grandmother living... a grandfather... spend time with them... listen... if you have grandchildren... do the same... you will make a difference in ways that you might never know. We have one life... we are put here to help others... prayers to all of my readers.

of the Shenandoah Valley, the winters were harsh and the Blue Ridge brooding.

The "good" land was claimed early in the settlement of the area, so Stewart Rowan sought other means to provide for his family. The route westward provided the answer; his land faced a frequently traveled road. The Census of 1850 titled him a hotel keeper.

The Civil War brought a different kind of guest to Stewart Rowan's inn. Depending upon the fortunes of war, guests were tailored in blue or gray uniforms. The Rowans favored the Confederate gray.

Probably sometime in 1862, a company of cavalry was quartered at the inn. A young lieutenant caught Maggie's fancy, a Lt. Charles J. S. Kirtley from Hurricane Bridge in western Virginia (Putnam County). Lt. Kirtley wore his uniform well and was ably served by his black servant, Jeff Maghee. Jeff had been with C.J.S. from boyhood and had accompanied his master when he rode from Hurricane Bridge to Buffalo Creek to be mustered into the 36 Batt'n Virginia Cavalry of the Provisional Army of the Confederate States on 1 November, 1862.

They were brothers of time and place. When C.J.S. was elected lieutenant, Jeff was filled with pride. But the brilliant autumn days yielded to the cold rains of December, which in turn yielded to the sleet and snow of January. The festivities of the musteringóin gave way to the harsh reality of skirmishes, the wounded and the dead. With relief, they paused at the Rowan Inn, to rest their mounts and their weary bodies.

Here it was that C.J.S. vowed his enduring love to promising to return to marry her and take her home to Hurricane Bridge. He described the Kanawha Valley in the most gentle terms. It held promises untold.

Return he did in 1863 to marry her on the 6th day of May. Pastor John Repass of the Evangelical Lutheran Church found them a handsome couple and prayed that peace would soon bless their union. Charles J.S. soon rejoined his company and Maggie's happiness dulled, tarnished by the despair of separation. She longed to escape the valley, the inn, the war!

The tides of war turned against the Confederacy, and the bright promise of a November day at Buffalo Creek was swept away. Instead there was hunger and dysentery, unquenchable thirst or gnawing hunger, amputation and mutilation. Death marched before them.

Death marched, as well in Tennessee, where the half-brother of C.J.S., Frank Kirtley fell at the Battle of Morristown, 12 December, 1863. Six years younger than Frank, C.J.S. held his brother in the highest esteem.

Overcome by his personal sorrow, his yearning for Maggie, his horror of the sick and dying, Charles J.S. fled to Giles County, where he reclaimed Maggie. Together they set out for the comparative safety of Charleys Creek and Hurricane Bridge. He was dropped from the Confederate rolls on 24

April, 1864.

Time passed...The heroes returned, like cousins, Mahlon and Morris Kirtley, while the one hero, Frank, continued to haunt them all. A pocketful of tears became a flood of despair when a stillborn male child was born to Maggie in 1867.

Sorrow heaped on sorrow! The grandfather, Joseph Kirtley, died "of old age" in December of that year. A few months later Frank's young sons succumbed to the flux. More despair.

Offsetting these losses in 1871 was the birth of Stewart Simms Kirtley on 25 April. C.J.S. and Maggie rejoiced in this son. Virginia B. was born two years later, but pneumonia claimed her at age six months.

Then, on a stifling day in August of 1875, double triumph and celebration...

TWIN sons, John and Mahlon Oak ("Oakie") were born. Charles J.S. was Exuberant! Then, suddenly, his health faltered, righted itself briefly, but abruptly worsened. At age 31, he died "paralyzed". Maggie's horror and emptiness was magnified when baby John fell to diphtheria. One year old and taken from her!

She never really recovered from the multiple losses. Her "sometimes" ill health became a gradual but steady decline, the cough a chronic racking one. She died of consumption on 9 September, 1877.

Out of his grief, Jeremiah Kirtley took up his pen, writing sadly to the inn in Giles County, "Our Maggie is dead this day." ... The Blue Ridge brooded even more darkly that year; the waters in Charleys Creek were frozen white, empty of any image.

The regional officers will assist schools in their

respective regions as they establish and maintain unified emergency response plans. The Officers will collect and compile all required school safety information, which will be recorded in the School Safety Officer Program Report.

"I am very excited to see such a strong start to the School Safety and Security Division within Capitol Police," says Rob

Cunningham, Deputy Cabinet Secretary of the WV Department of Homeland Security. "This program is the first step to safer schools for our children, and I know Ron Arthur will serve the Safety and Security Division with the same passion that he had while he served the citizens of West Virginia as a trooper."

in commercial interior finishing. With his partners, he purchased and renovated the Four Points by Sheraton Charleston into a multi-use residential and commercial facility, anchoring the city riverfront. Before starting Cornerstone in 1997, he worked as a union carpenter

for fifteen years. He maintains his membership in the Carpenters union.

In the upcoming 2023 Legislative Session, Republicans would have enjoyed a very large majority in the State Senate occupying 30 out of 34 seats. With the addition of Jeffries, that majority will grow to 31 senators.

Attorney General Morrissey Urges Consumers to Use Caution with Holiday Credit Card Offers

West Virginia Attorney General Patrick Morrissey is urging consumers to exercise caution when evaluating credit card offers this holiday season.

The advice comes as part of the Attorney General's Holiday Consumer Protection Week.

Consumers may see an uptick in credit card offers with the Christmas shopping season now in full swing. While it may be tempting to take advantage of the "buy now, pay later" option, the Attorney General urges

consumers to verify the credit card offer is legitimate.

"It's always a good idea to verify any sort of offer you may receive," Attorney General Morrissey said. "Credit cards can be attractive as they offer consumers the option to pay off purchases over time, but credit card fraud can wreak havoc on finances, so it's important to be vigilant."

Holiday credit card offers require a close reading of the contract. Deferred interest promotions may promise zero-percent interest through

December 2023, but failure to pay off the entire balance by the promotion period's end could stick the consumer with an interest charge dating back to the item's original purchase date.

Before responding to a credit card offer, keep these things in mind:

Do an online search if the offering company looks unfamiliar. Include the word "scam" after the company's name to see if it triggers additional results.

Call the offering company directly if an offer to increase a

line of credit looks suspicious. The phone number is often printed on the back of the card.

Do not provide personal information or click on any link in an email warning of a problem with the card.

Anyone who believes they have been the victim of a fraudulent credit card offer should contact the Attorney General's Consumer Protection Division at 800-368-8808 or visit the office online at www.ago.wv.gov.

God's Promise to David

II Samuel 7:4-16

God's ways are different from the ways of men. The text before us is given such that we may know and understand His ways and know Him.

The text opens with the words: "And it came to pass that night" (v. 4). These words introduce God's response to the events recorded in verses 2 and 3. In verse 2, King David is troubled by what he perceived as an inequality. David dwelt in a house of cedar—a house of luxury—while the ark of God dwelt in the tabernacle (a tent). It is apparent that David's sense of fairness prompted him to call upon the prophet Nathan for advice. Nathan reasoned that God had been with David and that David would do well to do what was in his heart. Nathan knew that it was in David's heart to honor God. There is little doubt that the manner in which David intended to honor God was by building a structure that would house the ark.

It was not the Lord's will that David should build a house to honor Him. God intervened such that future generations might know and understand His grace.

God spoke to Nathan on that very night and said: "Go tell my servant David . . ." In the message that followed, God presented a synopsis of Israel's history from the time of Israel's coming out of Egypt to David's rise from a shepherd boy to become king of all Israel.

Why did God answer in this manner? God gave David (and us) a history lesson because the history of Israel and the tabernacle is representative of spiritual things that God would have us know and understand. It was God's will that Israel should come out of Egypt with great gain (see Gen. 15:13-14). The Lord caused the Egyptians to heap jewels of gold and silver, and raiment upon the departing people whom they had held in bondage (Ex. 12:35). Israel was delivered from Egypt by God's grace, and His grace alone. David, likewise, was elevated from tending sheep to become ruler of Israel by God's grace alone.

Consider the tabernacle—a tent, a nonpermanent structure. In its innermost part was the Holy of Holies which contained the Ark of the Covenant. The ark contained the testimony of God. The ark held the ten commandments (God's law), Aaron's rod (symbolic of God's power), and a container of manna (symbolic of God's provision). The only light within the Holy of Holies was the Shekinah which is of God. The tabernacle (a temporary dwelling place) was the house of God by God's choosing; it was not the house of God by an accident of history or by will of man. The tabernacle was fashioned from the abundance which Israel took from Egypt and all of it furnishings testified of that which God performed.

David's rise from a lowly shepherd boy to king of Israel, like the dwelling place of God, was of God's choosing—a choosing that illustrates spiritual things that God would have us know and understand. God told David that the day would come when He (God) would establish the kingdom of David's seed, and, he (David's seed) would build a house for my (God's) name (v. 13). God also stated that this kingdom which He (God) would establish would be forever (v. 16).

God stated that these things would come to pass after David died. David's son, Solomon, ruled from the throne of his father and Solomon constructed the temple. These things took place after David died. Solomon most certainly was the seed of David, and, Solomon most certainly built a house for God's name (the temple), but Solomon's kingdom was not the kingdom that God promised to establish. The promised kingdom would endure forever. Solomon's kingdom did not last. It was immediately divided following Solomon's death and ceased to exist in any form 2,600 years ago.

When God stated that He would establish the kingdom of one who would proceed from the bowels of David, was he speaking of Solomon or of Christ Jesus? Bible believing Christians are now (present tense) members of the spiritual kingdom established by God. We await the day of Christ's return when He physically shall sit upon the physical throne of David in Jerusalem. That physical throne is the throne of which God speaks in verses 13 and 16. God states that the throne upon which the promised seed shall sit shall be established forever. The everlasting throne and the physical throne will be one when Christ returns. The physical throne upon which Solomon sat when he built the temple was established before Solomon's birth.

"I will be his father, and he shall be my son. If he commit iniquity, I will chasten him with the rod of men, and with the stripes of the children of men" (v. 14). These words of God the Father are not directed to the preincarnate Son who was with God and who was God from the beginning (see John 1:1). They are words which were for the ears of all who would follow David—a father-son relationship with the Lord awaited every king who would sit upon David's throne.

A similar relationship is promised to New Testament believers (see Jn. 1:12-13). Let us claim the promise which He has given.
