County Commission Freezin' For A Reason at Valdeacourt Farm

meeting was well attended for good reason. The individual, commission revisited a rezoning request which was originally scheduled to be addressed in October. The petition asked that 130 acres owned by Valdeacourt Farm Limited Partnership be rezoned from Rural-Residential to High Density Commercial. At the October meeting, some of the parties present stated that they did not receive notification of the proposed rezoning and learned of the action from a neighbor who had discovered a small sign along the roadside. The property is located on Hurricane Creek Road between U.S. 35 and State Route 817.

Residents of the area turned out en masse to make their opposition known to the request. Speaker after speaker stated that the rezoning would change the character of the area and result in loss of property value. Sherry Wells stated that families have chosen to buy homes in the rural area because revolving doors of Teays



Tuesday, January 31, Jim McDade, the commander of American Legion Post 187, asked the commission for permission to place a Gold Star Family Memorial Monument in the county. McDade stated that it would be a big undertaking in that initial costs would be \$50,000 to \$60,000. McDade said that infrastructure costs would be low if the monument were to be placed at War Memorial at the Winfield Bridge. The total cost of the project could be in the neighborhood of \$80,000. McDade emphasized

that he was not seeking financial support for the project at this time.

Mark White addressed commission regarding the failure of Harold Cathey to clean up property on Scary Creek as ordered by the county commission. Mr. White was informed that standard practice will be for the county to hire a contractor to clean up the property and then place a lien on the property for the cost. The county will act as soon as it is determined that proper notices have been given.

Bill unanimously passed the West Virginia House of Delegates Jan. 27. The measure would create the Adopt-A-Stream Program, modeled after the Adopt-A-Highway Program. It would allow individuals and organizations to apply for the program to adopt a waterway where they would be required to perform at least one cleanup per year. Supplies would be provided and adopted streams would be noted with signs.

instance, she was always known to family and neighbors as Aunt "Viney". We aren't sure what her real name was. On one record she is listed as Lavina, on another as Melvina Carrington. Family sources say that she married a man named Carrington, age 26, and that they went to housekeeping in the smokehouse. However, he eventually left. I suppose that is how she got the name Carrington. She lived with William and Lucinda and later with Grandpa John Matthews. Her age is also questionable. She thought she was 10 when sold at the auction, and about 15 when she came to Cabell (Putnam) County with the Matthews. In the 1870 Census she was listed as 51, in 1880 as 65. It is difficult to determine her birth year.

when the farm was being developed, it is said that Viney worked in the fields just as hard as the men as well as working in the house and helping with the children. It is not known of certainty when Viney was given her freedom, some think before the Civil War and some think after — but the circumstances would

fit either. When she was

told she was free and could

go where she pleased,

In the early days,

she replied, "Go where? This is my home." So, by choice, she stayed with the Matthews, in essence, as a family member.

The family made her welcome to sit at the table and eat with them, but she would not, not thinking it proper. Old ways die hard. But she had dignity, and this was her decision. She helped raise the Matthews children and my Dad said she kept them in line and had spanked him more often than his parents. In the tin-type picture I have of Aunty Viney and Daddy when he was a little boy she is wearing a very fancy dress. Daddy told us that her only request was to have a silk dress to wear to

Aunt Viney died in 1900 when she was about 85 years old. She was the very first person to be buried in the Sycamore Cemetery, and as far as is known, the only black person to be buried there. Her grave is marked by a concrete slab poured by Uncle Budge. He used a nail to etch her name in the concrete.

Aunt Viney was a definite part of the Matthews family history. It was because of her character, her dignity, and her loyalty, that she was held in the highest esteem, both by the family and those in the community.

Policy Makers Must Act to Stop Growing Drug Crisis

As the drug epidemic continues to plague our nation, policy struggle to implement real solutions to ending the crisis. Some lawmakers focus on funding law enforcement to combat drug dealers, while others want to provide social services to hit at the root of drug use. Regardless of where you are on the problem, much of the effort is focused on the extremely dangerous drugs such as fentanyl and methamphetamines. These drugs take priority over less harmful narcotics due to lack of resources, but they are not the only drug problem on the rise. There is a clear consensus from state departments of agriculture that the lack of guidance, as well as enforcement from the federal government, is making regulating legal and illegal hemp products a nightmare. Much of the confusion is leading to misuse by adults and abuse by children.

Legalized in West Virginia in 2018 and at the federal level in 2019, industrial hemp legislation intended to create a robust market for hemp products. Advocates have claimed the plant is extremely versatile with uses from rope and concrete to potential health benefits. Despite the utility

attention toward mobilizing the highly trained workforce that will be necessary to bring these types of projects to fruition.

"I'm confident all these moves are keeping the state in its position as a national energy leader well into the future as we continue making it even easier to choose West Virginia."

Members of the House also unanimously passed House Bill 2004 this week. The measure would prevent financial institutions from disclosing purchase of firearms, their accessories, components or ammunition. Tracking law enforcement purposes still would be permitted, along with other limited exceptions, but the merchant code for firearms and related sales would be considered protected financial information. It now goes to the state Senate for debate.

A total of 1,289 House bills have been introduced as of Feb. 3, and 37 of those have passed the House. The 60-day, regular legislative session ends at midnight March 11.

The problem is we still lack an understanding of the effects these products have on the body, as well as the best agricultural practices for production. Without clear direction it's paramount we figure out regulatory standards to ensure the health of our citizens and the future of the industry.

By law, a hemp product may only contain .3% total THC-Delta-9. The problem is the current regulation focuses on only this chemical derivative, leaving the rest wildly unregulated. Since the 2018 Farm Bill, we have seen the prominence of other products such as Delta-8 and 10. With no guidance from the federal government, these products face no scrutiny, as bad actors take the opportunity to pander illegal substances. The Department has found

to be hemp but, upon further responsibilities testing, are marijuana or synthetic substances. It is nearly impossible to go after these criminals as many use out-of-state shell companies that disappear once they are found out. These companies hide behind the confusion and lack of enforcement we government. Unfortunately, these

products continue to find their way into the hands of children. Current federal law sets no age limit on these products. The only thing required is a disclaimer stating, "not intended for those under 18," leaving much of the discretion to store owners. Despite our best efforts for awareness and education, the West Virginia Department of Agriculture is not a law enforcement agency. We don't wear badges or carry firearms, so we rely on voluntary compliance and orders. When situations turn hostile, we call on our law enforcement partners which

To protect the public and children, it will take a two-pronged approach. First, we must develop more encompassing guidelines to properly regulate all chemical compounds in the hemp plant, as well as put forth are seeing from the federal safe, agricultural practices for the industry. We can tackle this by working with our congressional members and other state departments of agriculture through the 2023 Farm Bill and FDA guidelines. At the same time, we need to step up funding for law enforcement agencies at all levels. Regardless of regulations, the WVDA will need law enforcement cooperation to protect the public. Stopping the drug blight is paramount to West Virginia's future. It should be a top priority for any state or local policy maker.







Blessing of God's Comfort

II Corinthians 1:3-11

There is a gap in time of approximately one year between Paul's two epistles to the church at Corinth. The two epistles were written from different cities. II Corinthians was written from somewhere in Macedonia while I Corinthians was written from Ephesus. It is apparent from the content and tone of the second epistle that the church had received and had responded to the issues that the apostle had addressed in his first epistle.

In the opening verse of the text before us, Paul praises God as the Father of mercies and as the God of all comfort. This is the only epistle of the thirteen which Paul is known to have written that opens with these descriptive terms of God. There is a reason that the Apostle Paul employed "Father of mercies" and "God of all comfort" in his opening address of the second epistle. That reason is found in verse 4 and in the 19th chapter of

The tribulation which the apostle cites in verse 4, and further elaborates upon in verses 8 and 9, is recorded in Acts 19. Paul and those with him were the focus of a major civil disturbance in Ephesus in which the worshippers of the goddess Diana were ready to do them harm because Paul taught that there were no gods that are made by the hands of men. Paul's reference to tribulation is rooted in that which occurred in Ephesus.

What happened to Paul and those in his company was life-threatening. What Paul experienced, however, was the comfort of God. He was moved by the Holy Spirit to praise God for His comfort and to state the reason that God had given it.

God gave His comfort to Paul and those with him for the express purpose that it be shared: "... that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble, by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are comforted of God" (v. 4). Paul knew what God wants all men to know. Paul knew that God wants believers to share all that which He gives to them. God has given His love to all believers such that we might declare it and share it.

In verse 5, Paul shares with the Corinthians (and us) the interaction between suffering and comfort that believers should know and understand. The apostle states that as the sufferings of Christ abounds in us, the consolation (comfort) which we have in Christ also abounds. Throughout His ministry, Christ suffered misunderstanding and rejection. On the cross, He suffered pain and physical death. He suffered all for the sake of others. The sufferings of Christ abound in believers when we suffer without cause as He suffered without cause. Christ gave comforting assurance to them whom suffer as He suffered that He has chosen us for His purposes (see Jn. 15:19). God gives comfort in a measure that exceeds all need.

The apostle makes what seems to be a counterintuitive statement in verse 6. He states that both the affliction and the comfort which he and others experience is for their benefit (the Corinthians). The affliction and the comfort of which the apostle speaks are poles apart. From a perspective common to the world, affliction is bad and comfort is good. Paul writes from God's perspective. With God all things are possible. "All things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose" (Rom. 8:28). The apostle explains how his suffering is beneficial: it is helpful to others who find themselves in similar

Paul's statement can be extended to those who suffer for the sake of Christ in every era, including today. Today, the Apostle Paul writes on behalf of suffering Christian minorities which live under the threat of death in nations dominated by Islamic jihad. Their suffering, like the suffering that Paul endured, is of benefit to fellow Christians. Their suffering is a testimony of strength that prepares all to be tested in like manner.

In verse 9, the apostle identifies God as the source of his comfort: "... that we should not trust in ourselves, but in God which raised the dead." Paul does not minimize the despair which he experienced (see v. 8). It was beyond his strength to overcome. Paul, in facing death, found comfort

because his trust was in Him who raised up the dead. The apostle makes it known in verse 10 that the God who delivered him and those with him from death "doth deliver" (present tense) and "will yet

deliver" (future tense). What God has done in the past is evidence of that which He does in the present and what that He shall do in the future. While Paul recognized that his delivery from death was of God whom

he (and those with him) trusted, the apostle also cites the power of the prayers that were offered on his behalf. God responds to our prayers. Paul's delivery from death is cause for many prayers of thanks.

The words of this epistle were preserved as scripture for the benefit of all who would ever read them. God is faithful to supply abounding comfort to them who trust in Him. God hears and answers the prayers of them who call upon Him.


