## County Commission Approves \$292,000 for New Furniture

At its February 14 meeting, the Putnam County Commission opened bids from Capital Interiors of Charleston and Tri-State Office Furniture, also of Charleston, for furniture for the new Sheriff's facility and Day Report Office. The Commission approved Tri-State's bid of \$291,827.86 for the Sheriff's facility and \$20,326.74 for Day Report. Capital Interior submitted bids of \$410,355.09 and \$17,473.53.

In an unrelated bid submission, the Commission approved bids of \$132,199.00 for masonry restoration and \$20,166.00 for gutter work from Buckeye Construction Restoration. The commission identified Buckeye as the low bidder at its January 31 meeting but chose to review bid details before acting.

The Commission approved awarding \$30,000 to the Putnam County Gun Club. Club president Michael

Thompson informed the Commission that \$45,000 would be needed to raise the backstop at the Liberty Range by 15-20 additional feet. Thompson said that legal expenses had swallowed up funds that had been allocated for the project.


In other business, the Commission appointed Charity Fellure to the DAEA Board, Jeff Losh to the Community Criminal Justice Board, and William Craver to the Putnam County Development Authority.

Commissioner Steve Deweese reported that the Hurricane High School Honor Society will be assisting Putnam Parks and Recreation by supplying support at 8-10 events in the coming year.

Kelli Steele of the Putnam County Convention and Visitor's Bureau informed the commissioners that PCCVB anticipates to receive a 15% increase in revenue.

The next scheduled commission meeting will be Tuesday, February 28.

For reasons unknown, the peepers at the Ranch are always among the last in the area to join the chorus. March is usually half done before a Ranch peeper is heard.


We are hoping that this week's weather will cause peeper song to replace winter snores.

## High Water Results in Road Closures




Flood waters threatened a house on Hurricane Creek Road on Thursday, February 16.

## Bell Tells Hidden Tale of Buffalo Presbyterian History



Buffington Builders of Leon replaced the Buffalo Presbyterian Church belfry with new roofing on Saturday, February 18.



The Town of Buffalo, having been in existence since 1837, radiates history. Visitors to the town's Historic Square view three structures that were built more than 150 years ago — Buffalo Academy (1849), Buffalo Presbyterian Church (1857), and Buffalo Methodist Church (1870).

Those who eye the Presbyterian Church today (February 23, 2023) will not see a belfry. The belfry is gone; it has been claimed by weather and time.

Richard Howard and other members of the church did not learn that the belfry was beyond repair until about one year ago. Contractors informed Howard that removal was the only option. If no action were taken, the bell would eventually come crashing down. The bell and belfry were a safety issue.

The bell had announced worship time each and every Sunday, year in and year out. Howard first heard its call

thirty years ago when he and his family moved to Buffalo from Greenbrier County. On occasion, he had been the one who ascended into the 1857 slave loft that sets below the belfry to pull the rope.

The bell last welcomed worshipers in 2020. The pandemic and the issuance of a state of emergency caused unwanted silence. The last to ring the bell was Wayne McKeever in early 2020. In 2022, Presbyterian U.S.A.

transferred ownership (and liability) to Historical Square Community Church. Howard stated that the doctrine of Historical Square Community Church is more in keeping with the traditions that prompted the formation of the Buffalo Presbyterian Church than with present day Presbyterian U.S.A.

McKeever and Howard, acting as trustees, addressed the liability issue by employing Buffington Builders to remove the belfry and make needed repairs.

After Buffington removed the bell, it was discovered that it was manufactured in Cincinnati by VanDuzen/Buckeye in 1873, some 16 years after the founding of the church. The VanDuzen Bell Company is now the Verdin Company which continues to produce bells.

Wayne's wife Sue was able to obtain a copy of the

record of a May 26, 1873 transaction from Verdin in which Rev. W. E. Hill purchased a 202 lbs. bell for \$105.20 for Buffalo, W. Va. Presbyterian Church.

Howard reported that the area beneath the belfry reveals that the roof of original 1857 structure was cut into and removed for the construction of the belfry. Debris from the belfry includes wood shingles from the original roof.

Howard stated that there is no plan to rebuild and restore the belfry to its former dimensions. The

May 8, 1910. Sim died at an early age in 1923 and was buried in the Sycamore Cemetery. After his death, Jenny and

## THIS WEEK IN THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES

For the week ending Feb. 17, 2023

Members of the West Virginia House of Delegates passed a total of 45 House Bills to the Senate this week, including one that would reorganize the current Department of Health and Human Resources.

House Bill 2006 would divide DHHR into three separate departments, each with its own secretary: Health, Human Services and Health Facilities. The breakup would take effect Jan. 1, 2024.

"Hopefully it clears up some of this red tape so government can do the simple job it's supposed to do - the most important thing," said Delegate Mike Pushkin, D-Kanawha, before voting for HB2006. "To take care of those who cannot take care of themselves."

The bill passed the House Feb. 14 by a vote of 95-3.

Delegates unanimously approved House Bill 2515, which would require Workforce WV to coordinate with the Higher Education Policy Commission and the Bureau for Family Assistance to create an inventory of occupational and educational resources available to assist single parents who want to further their education, reenter the workforce or receive workforce training. The bill

would require the HEPC to maintain a copy of the document on its website and to provide it by mail when requested. The bill now is with the Senate for debate.

Another bill with the Senate this week, House Bill 3036, would expand on the BUILD WV program. The Legislature created the BUILD WV program last year with the intent to provide limited tax breaks that will spur housing for graduate, post-graduate and professional job holders, technical workers as well as entrepreneurs in key geographical regions of the state. BUILD WV districts may be designated by agreement among the Secretary of Economic Development, Secretary of the Department of Tourism and the Secretary of the Department of Commerce after meeting several other detailed criteria. HB3036 would increase the number of allowable certified BUILD WV districts to 12 and would increase the limit on approved costs for approved projects.

A total of 25 bills have completed legislative action and 14 of those have been House bills. The 60-day regular legislative session ends at midnight March 11.



future of the bell is certain in that it is destined to ring again but uncertain as to its supporting structure.


Buffalo Historical Square Community Church conducted a fundraiser in October which generated a portion of the revenue needed to preserve the original church and its furnishings. Future fundraisers include a dine in/take out spaghetti dinner at the church on March 11 and a craft fair featuring numerous vendors on April 1.

Visitors to the church step back into the Nineteenth Century. It was a time when women and children sat separately from men. The separate entrances speak to that tradition. The pews are original, having served generation after generation. In addition to the furniture, visitors may inspect a collection of 19th century hymn books and catechisms, church history books, original ledgers from 1856-1949 and a session book from 1856, Sunday school attendance from 1952-61, song books from 1867-1876, an 1858 Bible and book of order, and Minutes from 1896-1945.


worked in the local drug store.

Kathleen married Ronald Sumner March 24, 1926. Ronald's family was well known in Hurricane in the mercantile business. Ronald had the first radio I ever saw. It was quite a sensation. Ronald worked for the C&O Railroad and later managed the appliance and furniture department in the family store. They had one daughter, Vera Jeanette, born December 27, 1927. She became head majorette in the school band.

Budge and Effie lived for a time at the home place where their daughter, Tressie Lenore was born Sept. 25, 1915. Later, they moved into the old log home on the Matthew farm. In the course of time, Frank Thompson, a relative who made his home with John and Margaret Matthews, helped Budge build a small house across the creek from the homeplace. There, their other daughter, Virginia Dare was born Jan. 21, 1921.

Tressie married Sherman Beckett in May 1936 and they had four children: Jerry, Lester, Diane and Edward. Tressie died at a relative young age in 1951. Virginia married E. E. "Shorty" Oxley Nov. 14, 1937. They were the parents of four children: Regina, Rodney, Carolyn Sue, and Robert.

This is a good place to relate the mechanics of a long ago social custom. All of the neighbors were glad to hear of a wedding because it gave them an excuse to get together. After a wedding, they would gather at the home where the bride and groom were staying for what in some areas was called a "shivaree". Locally, it was known as a "bellōcrowd", or more simply, a "belling". I suspect it had its origin in some medieval superstition about driving away evil spirits or some such thing. In any event, it was supposed to get the newlyweds off to a good start. At the beginning, the

Feb. 23, 1867: Lincoln County was formed from Boone, Cabell, Kanawha, and Putnam counties. The county was named for Abraham Lincoln.

Feb. 23, 1905: The first USS West Virginia was commissioned. The armored cruiser was renamed the USS Huntington in 1916 to allow the transfer of the original name to a newly authorized battleship.

Feb. 23, 1945: Harrison County native "Woody" Williams distinguished himself during the Battle of Iwo Jima by neutralizing seven concrete pillboxes. This act of heroism earned Williams the Medal of Honor.

young couple would have to come out and stand on the porch. Then the neighbors would march around the house ringing cowbells, pounding on metal pans, or using any instrument that would make noise. Usually, a couple of men would be standing off to the side firing shotguns into the air. After circling the house several times, they would then converge on the young couple completely surrounding them with noise. The gallant groom would generally cover his wife's ears with his hands. When the din had subsided, the groom would "treat" the guests — cigars for the men, a dish pan of candy for the youngsters. The bride similarly treated the ladies in the house. There was a bonus at the "belling" of Virginia

Feb. 24, 1918: Judge Kenneth Keller "K. K." Hall was born at Greenview, Boone County. Hall spent 47 years on the state and federal benches.

Feb. 24, 1928: Doctor Donald L. Rasmussen was born in Colorado. After coming to work at Miners Memorial Hospital in Beckley, he became a driving force in the passage of state and federal black lung legislation.

Feb. 25, 1903: An armed posse ambushed striking miners in their homes in the village of Stanaford near Beckley. Six miners were killed; federal judge B. F. Keller exonerated the posse.

Feb. 25, 1911: Newspaperman Jim Comstock was born in Richwood. In 1957, he founded the West Virginia Hillbilly, a weekly newspaper that circulated inside and outside the state.

Matthews and Shorty Oxley. Some of the men had acquired some dynamite, which they circumspectly exploded at a safe distance on the hillside across from the house. Some still remember that "bellōcrowd" more than others because of the dynamite.

Budge and Effie lived at various addresses on Virginia Avenue in Hurricane but eventually returned to the farm and lived beside their daughter, Virginia. Budge died in 1962. Effie lived to be 88 years old and died Dec. 28, 1980. Shorty and Virginia later moved back to Hurricane.

Feb. 26, 1869: The legislature approved a bill moving the state capital to Charleston.

Feb. 26, 1972: One of the country's worst mining-related disasters occurred on Buffalo Creek in Logan County. A coal waste dam collapsed, sending 132 million gallons of water, coal refuse and silt into the valley. In the end, 125 people, including entire families, were killed, and 1,000 people were injured.

Feb. 27, 1867: Marshall College (now university) was established as a normal school for the training of teachers. The first term began June 15, 1868, with 25 students enrolled in three departments.

Feb. 27, 1871: Summers County was established from segments of Fayette, Greenbrier, Mercer, and Monroe counties. The county was named after George W. Summers, one of West Virginia's founders.

Feb. 27, 1871: The legislature approved an act incorporating the city of Huntington.

Feb. 28, 1858: McDowell County, the southernmost county in West Virginia,

was created from part of Tazewell County, Virginia. The new county was named after James McDowell, a governor of Virginia.

Feb. 28, 1875: Musician Edwin "Edden" Hammons was born in Pocahontas County. A subsistence farmer and hunter, he is remembered as one of West Virginia's finest traditional fiddlers.

Feb. 28, 1909: Athlete John Zontini was born. Nicknamed the "Sheik of Seth" for his outstanding football career at Sherman High School in Boone County, he still holds state high school and Marshall University rushing records.

March 1, 1831: Jackson County was created from parts of Wood, Mason and Kanawha counties and named in honor of Andrew Jackson, the seventh president.

March 1, 1870: The legislature passed an act to create a branch normal school at West Liberty. For the next 61 years, the school was a teacher preparatory institution. It is now a university.



2 teaspoons vanilla extract

Heat oven to 350°F.

Spray 9-inch round baking pan with nonstick cooking spray.

To make topping: In medium bowl, combine oats, flour, brown sugar, pecans, cinnamon and salt.

Using pastry blender, cut butter into mixture until blended.

To make cake: In small bowl, combine flour, baking powder, salt and baking soda.

In large bowl, mix cream cheese, butter and sugar. Beat mixture until smooth. Add egg, egg yolk, milk and vanilla extract. Beat mixture until smooth.


Combine flour mixture with cream cheese mixture. Spread mixture in pan.



### Blessing of Spiritual Fruit

Galatians 5:18-6:10

"But if ye be led of the Spirit, ye are not under the law" (v. 18). The law is a list of do's and don'ts — a list which no man is able to keep. The law specifies that which the flesh must do. One who is justified by the law has no need of Christ (see v. 4). One who seeks to justify himself by keeping the law is led of the flesh, not of the Spirit.

In verses 19-21, Paul lists the works of the flesh. Each and every work is contrary to that which the law requires. Fruits of the flesh are revealed in them who walk after the flesh. All of the works listed in these verses are found in them who seek to make themselves like God (Gen. 3:5).

Believers are to walk in the Spirit (v. 16). Walking in the Spirit is characterized by revealing the character of the Savior one has received. A tree is known by the fruit it yields. The Spirit, likewise, is characterized by its fruit. That fruit is listed in verses 22 and 23. Love, joy, peace, long-suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, and temperance, are words to which lexicographers have assigned definitions. But it is the Spirit that dwells in believers who gives these words their real meaning (see John 14:26). Paul calls for the Galatians (and us) to walk in the Spirit. We are to be Spirit directed.

In verse 24, Paul states what it means to belong to Christ. It means that one is linked to His death upon the cross. In Galatians 2:20, Paul describes the linkage with the words: "I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me." Every believer receives the same Spirit by which Paul was saved. All are made alive through faith but not all live in the flesh by the faith of Him who died for all who should believe.

One, in the flesh, can resolve to exhibit love, joy, peace, long-suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, and temperance, but the flesh fails. When one walks by the Spirit, one will exhibit the fruits of the Spirit. The Spirit produces love, joy, peace, long-suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, and temperance.

The quality of the fruit of the Spirit is consistent, but the volume of production is dependent upon one's walk. Walking in the Spirit entails acting upon the Spirit's prompting. Paul was moved by the Holy Spirit to issue specific instructions concerning how one should respond to fellow Christians who are doing wrong. Christians who are caught up in sin are to be corrected in meekness. Meekness is a fruit of the Spirit. Meekness is that attitude of mind that is not harsh or contentious. Meekness manifests gentleness and tenderness in dealing with others. Meekness has been shown to us in the person of Christ Jesus. He who was without sin refused to condemn one who was caught in the very act of adultery, but, instead said, "Go and sin no more" (John 8:11). Believers have been delivered from sin such that they might walk in the Spirit.

Walking in the Spirit is characterized by bearing one another's burdens. When one fulfills the law of Christ, one hears and heeds the command: "If ye love me, keep my commandments" (John 14:15). We are to love one another as He has loved us. One is to love his neighbor as one's self.

When one walks in the Spirit, one is to walk with proper attitude (v. 3, 4 and 6). The Apostle states that a man deceives himself if he thinks that he is something when he is nothing. In I Corinthians 4:7, Paul asks believers why they glory in themselves for gifts which were given to them. One cannot glory in himself unless he first honestly assesses what he has done with the gifts that have been given to him.

Walking in the Spirit involves sharing (v. 6). One who is taught in the word is blessed. He that is blessed is called to share that blessing with the one who has blessed him.

Walking in the Spirit is an expression of what one has received (v. 7, 8). God is not mocked. God knows true love, joy, peace, long-suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, and temperance; and God knows fake love, joy, peace, long-suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, and temperance. The fake is of the flesh and the flesh is dead. The true expression of the Spirit produces everlasting reward.

The sowing of love, joy, peace, long-suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, and temperance will produce a harvest in due time (v. 9). The seed of the fruit of the Spirit flourishes when it is sown in the fertile soil of the household of faith. Let us walk in faith and harvest the increase.



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

Martha was a beautiful person, outgoing, and easy to like. She will be fondly remembered, and sadly

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


