U.S. Senator Shelley Moore Capito visited the Toyota West Virginia manufacturing plant in Buffalo on Wednesday, February 22, to inspect the new "garden" near the main entrance and receive an update on Toyota's renewable energy capabilities, overall operations, and the plant's 4T High School Work

The new garden consists of five SmartFlower solar arrays that help power the facility's employee services buildings. The solar flowers in 2019 by S.T.A.R.S., a also help power three EV charging stations.

SmartFlowers bloom at sunrise and follow the sun's path throughout the day, allowing them to effectively capture the sun's rays. Because they maintain a 90-degree angle to the sun, the power they produce is optimized over that of traditional solar panels. At sunset, the flowers fold back up and await sunrise the following morning. The petals are self-cleaning,

lined with tiny brushes that remove dirt and debris when they open and close.

Located just behind the plant, is the largest solar array in West Virginia. This array can generate state. I value the close 2.6 megawatts of power, enough to power over 400 homes. This solar power generation reduces the progress they continue the Buffalo plant's CO, emissions by an estimated

Members of the West Virginia House of Delegates met and passed 16 bills during a Saturday session this week as legislative deadlines approach.

which create would Road Optimization Assessment Data (ROAD) Pilot Program, overwhelmingly passed the House in a bipartisan vote Feb. 25. It would utilize Machine Learning and Artificial Intelligence, along with GPS and Geotagged positioning, as well as a laser measuring system with video. Those tools all would facilitate data collection such as road geometry, curvature, cracks, potholes, painted lines, canopy brush and drainage issues, all to serve as a baseline for road conditions. The Department Highways would implement the program on a combination of both urban and rural roads with Monongalia and Preston counties. Data collection would take place at regular intervals, at least twice during the pilot project, which would last five years, and the data would be used to compare changes in road conditions, as well as for regular reporting to the Legislature.

Members of the House unanimously passed House Bill 2538 this week, which would require the West Virginia Bureau of Social Services to implement a web-based communications system for foster care families. The portal would be required to facilitate communications such as foster parent requests and responses to requests of staff for the Bureau for Social Services, updates about foster child visitation, travel, scheduled court and multidisciplinary team hearings as well as other information.

"When you talk to any family within the foster care system, you find that the main complaint is a lack of communication throughout entire process,"

said Delegate Adam Burkhammer, R-Lewis, a sponsor of the bill. "This will help alleviate that issue with a technology-based portal where all the parties can openly communicate, thus providing the essential information to everyone involved and ultimately providing better care for the

House Bill 3055, which would create a vocational math class for students interested in the trades, completed the legislative process this week after passing the full Legislature by unanimous vote. The bill would establish a technical, transition math class geared toward students interested in careers in the trades for all publicschool curricula. The class would pertain to fractions, conversion from fractions to decimals, measurement, reading blueprints other math skills necessary to be successful in the trades. Instructors would be required to meet the same qualifications necessary to teach current trade classes and specific content in public schools. Students would be eligible for the class upon entering high school, and it could be taken as a personalized math credit to meet graduation requirements. The measure is awaiting action from the governor.

"I was proud to work with my fellow Delegates on this bill to try to create a class for students interested in a career in the trades," said Delegate Jimmy Willis, R-Brooke, lead sponsor of the bill who currently is a student at West Liberty University. "This give those students the opportunity to improve their math skills in a class specifically designed for them."

A total of 35 bills have completed legislative action as of Feb. 25, and 21 of those have been House bills. The 60-day, regular legislative session ends at midnight March 11.

For a while, Aunt Jenny and Lizzie lived together.

Attorney General Morrisey Co-Leads Brief in SCOTUS Case Impacting Protections for Americans' Religious Freedom

General Patrick Morrisey is co-leading a coalition of 22 states with Louisiana in an amicus brief to the U.S. Supreme Court in support of a broader right to religious accommodations in the workplace.

The Supreme Court will hear oral arguments in the case, Groff v. DeJoy, on April 18. The outcome of the case holds much significance the possible restoration of fuller protections for employee religious freedom in the workplace under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. A 1977 Supreme Court decision, World Airlines v. Hardison, narrowed protections for religious liberty in the workplace.

At the center of the case is Gerald Groff, an evangelical Christian who faithfully observes Sunday Sabbath. He was a mail carrier in Pennsylvania when the United States Postal Service signed an agreement with Amazon in 2013 to deliver packages on Sundays and holidays.

Rather than work on Sundays, Groff resigned in 2019 after USPS refused to grant him a blanket exemption from Sunday shifts. He then sued, alleging the Postal Service subjected him to discrimination for refusing to accommodate his religious beliefs and the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

A federal appeals court last May ruled against Groff, concluding that granting him an exemption would burden other postal workers.

The coalition argues in the brief that the courts have long applied the incorrect standing deciding for when an employer should accommodate an employee's religious practices—the current provides insufficient protection for employees.



1 medium onion, chopped

- 1 large sweet red pepper, cut into 1/4-inch strips
- 1 tablespoon salt 1 cu sugar
- 3/4 cup white vinegar
- 3/4 teaspoon mustard seed
- 3/4 teaspoon celery seed
- 1/4 teaspoon ground mustard

In a large bowl, combine the squash, onion, red pepper and salt. Cover and refrigerate for 1 hour; drain. In a large saucepan, combine the remaining ingredients. Bring to a boil. Add squash mixture; return to a boil. Remove from the heat; cool.

be as soon as Black trains up Queen in the way a mule should go. Queen arrived at the Black farm on February 19 and not quite ready to learn what it means to be a work animal.

Darrell's regimen for Queen will begin as soon as the bottom land at his Hurricane Creek homestead recovers from winter and spring rains. Queen will be hitched to a single tree and tasked with hauling an automobile tire. Black will gradually add weight to the tire until Queen is ready to team with Ace.

Darrell and wife, Tootie, have big plans for Ace and Queen. Come August of next year, Ace and Queen are slated to travel to the Loretta Lynn Ranch in Tennessee to participate in the Dixie Long Ear Wagon Train with Darrell and Tootie. The Dixie Long Ear Wagon Train is what it sounds to be. It involves daylong covered-wagon rides for the Blacks and 12-15 mile pulls for Ace and Queen. Darrell and Tootie will be living out the wagon in the manner of Nineteenth Century westward bound pioneers.

The wagon train adventure may be the first of many for Ace and Queen as mules are longlived, maybe 40 years. "I expect them to outlive me," Darrell said.

When working fulltime for the Department of Highways, it was necessary for Darrell to lend Ace to Amish friends in Sugar Creek, Ohio. The arrangement worked well as his friends enjoyed free use of a mule and Ace benefited from on-the-job training. Now that he is retired, Darrell will have more time to provide Queen with personal training.

Blessing of Spiritual Fruit

Jesus' Baptism Mark 1:4-13

The baptism of Jesus by John the Baptizer is recorded in all four gospels. Each account of John's ministry is different. All four gospels tell the story of Jesus. The differences in the gospels are differences in the manner which

Matthew cites Jesus' genealogy and His birth in the city of David prior to giving the account of Jesus' baptism. Luke gives a detailed account of both John's and Jesus' birth before telling of Jesus' baptism. Mark is different. Mark begins with the words of Malachi (Mal. 3:1) and Isaiah (Isa. 40:3) and immediately proceeds to tell of John's ministry and Jesus' baptism.

Matthew's initial words target the ears of Jews who might argue that Jesus could not be the Messiah because He was of Nazareth. Luke, in addressing Theophilus, makes it known that he desires to establish the certainty of those things which Theophilus has been told concerning Jesus. Mark's words shout out to all who have knowledge of that which the prophets had written pertaining to the coming of the Messiah. Mark addresses all who possessed knowledge of the scriptures and looked to the Messiah's coming.

"John did baptize in the wilderness . . ." (v. 4). Baptism was practiced by the followers of Judaism. It is called "mikveh." Followers made themselves ceremonially clean by immersing themselves in water. An individual would practice mikveh upon conversion to Judaism, after any time of impurity, and before holy feast days. Mikveh was practiced repeatedly throughout the course of one year. John's baptism was different.

John preached the baptism of repentance. His message was: "Repent and be baptized." One must repent before one's sins can be washed away. John preached this message in the wilderness, a place unsuitable for human habitat. He was a voice of one crying in the wilderness. He was a picture of Isaiah 40:3. John's apparel, camel's hair and girdle of skin, is a picture of the prophet Elijah. John's diet of locusts and wild honey is of the wilderness's meager offerings.

John met every qualification of "the voice crying in the wilderness" who was prophesied to prepare the people for the coming of Messiah. The people believed he was sent from God and they flocked to him (v. 5).

The Jews knew that God, and God alone, can forgive sin (see Lk. 5:21). They believed that John's baptism would cleanse them of sin because John was the promised voice of one crying in the wilderness. Their sins were forgiven by God because they believed the word of God and acted upon it. John did not preach that the baptism for the remission of sins was the full answer to sin. John's message was, "There cometh one mightier than I after me" (v. 7). The one who would follow John would baptize believers with the Holy Ghost. The one who would come after John would be God's full answer to sin.

"And it came to pass . . ." (v. 9). Jesus of Nazareth came to and was baptized by John. Jesus, who was without sin, came to be baptized by John. The people came to John because they sensed that the coming of the Messiah was near and that they needed one sent from God to make them ready to receive Him. Jesus came to John for a different reason. Jesus was the Messiah. Jesus came to John to fulfill all righteousness (see Matt. 3:15). Mark omits this detail. Mark jumps straight from Jesus' arrival at the Jordan to the scene following His baptism. As Jesus emerged from the water, the heavens opened and the Spirit descended upon Him. A voice rang out from heaven saying, "Thou art my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased" (v. 11).

Let's review the picture which Mark has placed before us. The Son, God manifest in the flesh, submitted Himself to the baptism of repentance for the remission of sins (v. 4) and then the Spirit visibly descended upon Him. This is a picture which is flashed before all who would ever read the words which the Holy Spirit directed Mark to pen.

Excepting Jesus, all who were baptized of John were sin stained before entering the water. Jesus had no sin, yet He was directed by the Father to submit His flesh to cleansing water. If the flesh of Him who was without sin was cleansed before the Spirit descended from heaven to dwell upon Him, how much more must we be cleansed? Those who were cleansed by John's baptism were cleansed by believing. One knows when one is cleansed because the Spirit descends quickly as a dove.

"And immediately the Spirit driveth him into the wilderness" (v. 12). Jesus was driven into the wilderness to be tempted by Satan. Jesus received the Spirit from God the Father and was then tempted by Satan. That which transpired is like that which befell Adam. The Lord God formed Adam from the dust of the earth and breathed into his nostrils and his flesh was given life (Gen. 2:7). The Lord God then placed Adam in the garden of Eden where he was tempted by Satan (Gen. 2:15, 3:1-6). The two stories have like

beginnings but far different endings. Mark was moved by the Holy Spirit to record these things such that men

might follow Christ and receive the gift of life.
