Putnam 4-H Livestock Auction Produces More Than \$500,000

The 2023 Putnam County Fair 4-H Livestock held at the fairgrounds in Eleanor on Friday, July 14, produced more than \$524,000 in sales. After deducting expenses, county 4-H'ers took home \$510,773.26 — an increase of 36% over last year's sale.

More than one hundred businesses, organizations, and individuals purchased eggs, rabbits, lambs, goats, heifers, feeder calves, and steers at the auction.

The top four buyers were Putnam County Bank, Window World, Dutch Miller Auto, and Prim Law Firm. The highest single bid was \$13,200.00 by Rodney Loftis for Emilee Legg's Reserve Grand Champion Market Steer. The top Market Hog was purchased by Piggly Wiggly for \$10,460.00. The price of eggs was high with a single dozen going for \$1000. The Grand Champion Meat Goat bid was \$4,050.00. The top Market Lamb bid was \$3,840.00 (\$30 per pound, live weight). The highest bid for Heifers was \$8,520.00. The top Feeder Steer went for \$9,480.00. Market Rabbits sold for \$7,500.00 and \$1,600.00.

There were a total of 53 total participants from four

The Bethel Baptist Church, located on Big Hurricane Creek, approximately 3 1/2 miles north of the town of Hurricane, West Virginia, was organized July, 1869, having seventeen charter members, namely: Lucretia Gibson, Joe Sovine, George Leadman, Joe Smith, Edward Bailey, Asbury, Part Sovine, Harbour, Wiley, John Gibson, Bill Neal, Zan Neal, J.L. Foster, George Quarles, Mark Wooten, John Chapman, Thomas Gibson, and John Wooten.

Marshall Health Utilizes AI Tool To Prevent Vision Loss For Patients With Diabetes

Marshall Health is now using artificial intelligence (AI) to test patients with diabetes for diabetic retinopathy, a leading cause of blindness.

Using the AI system known as LumineticsCore™ (formerly IDx-DR), Marshall Health is working with patients with diabetes and their primary care providers to identify signs of eye disease and provide more opportunities for early intervention before vision loss occurs. Diabetic retinopathy is a serious complication of diabetes that can lead to blindness if not detected in its early stages, making regular eye exams essential to patients with diabetes.

"Marshall Health is committed to staying on the forefront of medical advances that improve patient outcomes," said Shannon L. Browning, R.Ph., M.D., chief medical information officer for Marshall Health and associate professor of medicine at the Marshall University Joan C. The AI system is now available in two

of Marshall Health's Huntington clinics thanks to generous grant support from The Huntington Foundation. The advanced system uses a special fundus camera to take pictures of the patient's retinas in the back part of the eye. The LumineticsCore exam is typically completed in minutes. The pictures are then evaluated by the AI's diagnostic software, which searches for signs of diabetic retinopathy. An immediate diagnostic report is produced at the

point-of-care, allowing providers to discuss the results with the patient while they are in the office.



The first church was a log building situated where the state road No. 19 is at this time.

The logs were cut and hauled by cattle and horse teams from the surrounding properties, by the residents.

The pews were made of large logs split into the middle, the logs were made by smaller pieces of wood. All of this was done

by hand.

The property for this building was given by James (Jim) Gibson, a brother of the two of the charter members, John Gibson and Thomas Gibson.

The earliest recorded date of the established organization was in July of 1892, the listing of a business meeting and those in attendance at that time.

building was built in 1903. This building was first erected parallel with Sleepy Creek, where it stood until 1953. As the population grew, it naturally became necessary to expand and improve the church facilities. It was the decision of the membership to move it to the back of the church property with the entrance facing the road where it now stands.

The doors have never been closed. It continues to provide a sacred sanctuary for the preaching of the Gospel and the furthering of the Lord's work.

All these years it has been a lamp unto our feet, and a light to our pathway, to this and surrounding communities, and extends a welcome to whosoever will enter.

The following events happened on these dates in West Virginia history. To read more, go to e-WV: The West Virginia Encyclopedia at www.wvencyclopedia.org.

July 27, 1896: Clark Kessinger was born near Charleston. He was among the most prolific and influential fiddlers of the 20th century, and one of West Virginia's most important traditional musicians.

July 27, 1909: Coach "Dyke" Raese was born in Davis. He directed West Virginia University to its

first major sports national championship, winning the 1942 National Invitation Tournament in basketball.

July 28, 1915: Frankie Yankovic was born in Davis, Tucker County. Yankovic did more to popularize polka music than any other performer.

July 29, 1873: Malcolm Malachi "Mack" Day was born. As sheriff of McDowell County, he claimed that God had called him to enforce Prohibition, even arresting an uncle and his own son.

July 29-31, 1915: Camp Good Luck, believed to be

the world's first 4-H club encampment, was held at Elkwater in southern Randolph County.

July 29, 1918: Novelist Mary Lee Settle was born in Charleston. Her literary reputation rests on the "Beulah Quintet," a sequence of five historical novels spanning four centuries.

July 30, 1973: The Frederick Hotel in downtown Huntington closed to transient trade. After it was built in 1905, it was touted as the most elegant hotel between Pittsburgh and Cincinnati.

July 31, 1932: Actor Theodore Crawford "Ted" Cassidy was born in Pittsburgh but was raised in Philippi. He was best known for his role as Lurch on "The Addams Family."

Aug. 1, 1921: Baldwin-Felts detectives shot and killed Sid Hatfield and Ed Chambers as they approached the McDowell County Courthouse in Welch. As Matewan's police chief, Hatfield had assisted the United Mine Workers campaign to organize Tug Fork miners.

Aug. 1, 1940: Justice Franklin Cleckley was born in Huntington. In 1994, he became the first Black justice to serve on the West Virginia Supreme Court. The Supreme Court once referred to Cleckley's handbooks on evidence and criminal procedure as "the bible for West Virginia's judges and attorneys."

Aug. 2, 2009: Golfers Sam Snead and Bill Campbell became the first two inductees into the West Virginia Golf Hall of Fame.



Ears to Hear

Matthew 13:9-17

"Who hath ears to hear, let him hear" (v. 9). Jesus spoke these words immediately after relating a parable to a great multitude which had gathered to hear Him teach. The parable which He spoke has been titled "The Parable of the Sower." It is apparent that no one had the ears to hear the parable, not even the disciples, because Jesus supplied an explanation to them in verses 18-32.

His disciples asked Jesus why He spoke to the people in parables (v. 10). Jesus stated, "Because it is given unto you to know the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven, but to them it is not given." At first glance, it appears that the disciples were chosen to be given hidden knowledge concerning the kingdom of heaven and the individuals which made up the multitude were not chosen to be given understanding. The gospels, including the text before us, are preserved as scripture for God's purposes. God would have all read His word and come to the saving knowledge of Christ Jesus. The reason that the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven is hidden is not because God wants anyone to perish.

In verse 12, Jesus states that those who have understanding shall be given more understanding and those who lack understanding shall lose the limited understanding which they possess. All New Testament believers know that which transpired at Pentecost. The Father sent the Comforter. The Comforter came and taught the disciples all things and brought to remembrance all that Jesus had said (Jn. 14:26). The Comforter imparted the increased understanding of which Jesus spoke.

What of those who lacked understanding? What was the understanding which they possessed concerning the kingdom of heaven? They believed that entry into the kingdom was dependent upon works which they could do. New Testament believers have been given hidden secrets. We know that entry into the kingdom of heaven is dependent upon the works which Jesus did. He fulfilled every requirement of the law and gave Himself as a ransom for all who would believe (Matt. 20:28). Those who lack the ears to hear must lose the understanding which they possess before they can receive the saving knowledge of Christ — He has paid it all. The lost become saved upon believing. The believing are given understanding.

Jesus answered why He spoke in parables in verse 13. Jesus wanted His listeners to realize that they did not possess correct understandings. One cannot understand God by power of intellect or by any other power that one may presume to possess. One's understanding of God is limited to that which God provides. The baskets of those who look to themselves are empty.

In verse 14, Jesus informed the disciples that the prophecy of Isaiah was fulfilled in them who lacked understanding. The specific prophecy which Jesus cited is Isaiah 6:9-10. The Lord told Isaiah that the people would not hear the words which He would speak through his (Isaiah's) lips. Isaiah was to prophesy of the judgment to come. That judgment was certain because the "people's heart is waxed gross," . . . they would not hear God speak; they would not turn from their ways; they would not be converted. The prophecy given to Isaiah was fulfilled in the multitude who heard, but did not understand. Their eyes could not see and their ears could not hear because they leaned upon their own understandings. They did not seek Him who is able to bring sight to the blind and hearing to the deaf.

The prophecy given to Isaiah did not apply to the disciples because they did not lean upon their own understandings. They came to and inquired of Him who is able to open the eyes of the blind and unplug the ears of those who hear not.

Jesus opened their eyes and unplugged their ears, saying, "But blessed are your eyes, for they see: and your ears, for they hear." Because they have been given eyes to see and ears to hear, they shall see mysteries (hidden things) which many prophets and many righteous have desired to see and to hear but have not heard or seen.

Today, the mysteries of the kingdom of God are revealed to all by the Son. The Father and the Son are one (Jn. 10:30). He who sees the Son, sees the father who sent Him (Jn. 12:45). "He that hath the Son hath life: and he that hath not the Son of God hath not life" (I Jn. 5:12).

The Father would have all men receive the ears to hear.
