WV Cupcake Festival Makes Sweet Return to Valley Park

Once again cupcake mania swept over Teays Valley as the eighth annual West Virginia Cupcake Festival came to Valley Park in Hurricane. The event, held August 24 through 26, featured a multitude of cupcake confectioners from all over the state, as well as entertainment, contests, arts and crafts, and fun activities for all ages. In addition to offering a wide variety of tasty treats, the festival serves as a fundraiser for local charities, making it "the sweetest festival around."

An additional day was added to the festival this year, which has grown from a one-day event at its inception to a multi-day extravaganza. Once a month throughout the summer and fall, Valley Park has hosted a Night Market with vendors, food trucks, and entertainment, and a special theme which varies by month. The event for August fell upon Thursday, August 24, the day before the Cupcake Festival, so this month's Night Market featured both a cupcake theme in addition to a 1980's theme.

Friday's activities included Cupcake Classic Cruise-In/Car Show hosted by CLz Finest Car Club; the Pupcake & Friends Pageant

for pets; story time hosted by the Putnam County Library; games for children; and live music.

Saturday started out with the Cupcake Chase 5K Run/Walk. Adults and children lined up to compete in the cupcake eating contest, which featured cupcakes decorated by one of the festival pageant queens who had never decorated a cupcake before. Brandon Davis of Sod won the contest, finishing off four cupcakes before any of the other contestants.

The two main events of Saturday were the Amateur Cupcake Contest and the Vendor Cupcake Contest.

Barbara McKown of Orma won Best Tasting Amateur Cupcake, and Chika Yamaguchi of Japan won Best Decorated Amateur Cupcake. The Vendor Cupcake Contest, which featured multiple categories, pitted professional bakers against each other. People's Choice winners were Beeg's Bakes of South Charleston, First Place; These Cakes of Pocahontas County, Second Place; and Huntington High ProStart, Third Place. WVU College of Law Lawyers & Leaders 2023 Awards

Caroline Leadmon, WVU College of Law Class of 2023

Originally from Hurricane, WV, Caroline Leadmon grew up in a family of Mountaineers.

"Both my parents are West Virginia University (WVU) alumni, and because they fostered Mountaineer values in me, attending WVU was a family tradition that I was proud to carry on," Leadmon says. "I ultimately chose WVU for my undergraduate studies because of the support from the WVU Foundation Scholarship, but I chose to stay for my legal education because Morgantown and WVU were home."

In 2020, Leadmon graduated from WVU as a member of the Order of Augusta with bachelor's degrees in both biochemistry and animal and nutritional sciences. Because of her technical background, she found an interest in intellectual property law. Even though Leadmon couldn't imagine obtaining her legal degree anywhere else, she realized that law school comes with its own set of challenges, such as the harsh grading curve and appellate briefs.

"Despite the various struggles I have had during my law school education, I wouldn't trade it for the world," she says. "Every opportunity to cheer on the Mountaineers or to sing Country Roads with my classmates has truly been a highlight of my time at WVU."

Leadmon's class entered law school at the height of the COVID pandemic, so the experience was not typical.

Attorney General Morrissey Warns College Students to Watch Out for Employment Scams

Thousands of students in the state recently have returned to college or are getting their first crack at higher education and many are set to look for employment to supplement their allowances. College is the first time many young adults are in charge of their own personal affairs, which makes them susceptible to scammers.

West Virginia Attorney General Patrick Morrissey is urging job seekers to exercise caution when looking for employment opportunities.

"The job hunt can be very exciting, but don't take just any job offer," Attorney General Morrissey said. "Don't fall prey to those looking to rip you off. Research the employer, verify the intended recipient of personally identifiable information and never give money up front in hopes of landing a job."

Students looking for employment should also be wary of any unsolicited attempt to gain access to personal information and never divulge such information without verifying the authenticity of the recipient.

Consumers should be particularly cautious of work-at-home positions. Such opportunities may promise flexibility and

extra income but result in nothing more than lost time and money.

Additional tips include:

- Use extra caution when looking at job ads with generic titles such as administrative assistant or customer service representative.

- Check the business' legitimate website or call its verified phone number to make sure the job opening is authentic.

- Use caution when advertisements urge candidates to apply immediately and use phrases such as "Teleworking OK," "Immediate Start" and "No Experience Needed."

- Do internet searches for the position. If the same job posting appears in several cities, it may be a scam.

- Be very cautious of any job that asks for personal information or money. Scammers often use the guise of running a credit check, setting up a direct deposit or training costs.

Poll Workers Are a Critical Part of West Virginia's Safe and Secure Election Process

August 23rd was National Poll Worker Recruitment Day. As West Virginia's chief elections officer, I would like to encourage all eligible West Virginians to take an active role in democracy by being a poll worker in your county.

Foremost, thank you to those who serve, and have served, as poll workers. Thousands of our poll workers have participated in their local elections for years...some even for decades!

Poll workers are critical to a successful and accurate election. The West Virginia Secretary of State's Office works with our 55 county clerks to ensure that every county has enough trained poll workers for every polling place across the State. In each precinct, the workers represent a variety of political parties to ensure diversity, integrity, and fairness for all sides. There is no better way for a citizen to be part of our democracy than by participating in our election process as a poll worker and voter.

For the primary election scheduled in May of 2024, county clerks will train and employ more than 8,400 poll workers to staff more than 1,680 polling locations on that single day. These poll workers are on the front lines to facilitate eligible voters casting ballots privately and securely, and to ensure that every voter walks away with confidence in the integrity of the election.

It is easy to become a poll worker. Selection starts with the county executive committees, who nominate poll workers by providing a list to each county clerk. From there, the county clerk contacts the nominees to schedule

trainings and makes additional nominees for election day and any needed alternates. The requirements to be a poll worker include being a registered voter, having no immediate family member on the ballot in their assigned precinct, and attending poll worker training within 30 days before the election. Poll workers are paid for both attending training and working on Election Day.

In years past, my office has worked closely with the political parties, veterans organizations, the WV Realtors Association, and local high schools to recruit poll workers. In 2022, we helped recruit more than 5,000 poll workers. In 2024, those recruitment efforts will continue, so keep an eye out for advertisements to sign up or go ahead and contact your county executive committee and submit your name for potential nomination.

A poll worker's Election Day can be long, but it's a very rewarding experience. The day begins about an hour before polls open at 6:30 am, and they will work the poll until they close at 7:30 pm. Once polls close, the pre-selected poll chief or supply clerk (titles vary by county) will secure the equipment and ballots and transport them to their county clerk at the designated central counting center.

Even though her studies were demanding, Leadmon was able to give her time to other organizations outside of WVU.

She was a member of the U.S. Supreme Court Litigation Clinic, where she was afforded the opportunity to attend arguments at the U.S. Supreme Court.

“For me, the opportunity to have attended arguments at the U.S. Supreme Court is likely once-in-a-lifetime, so my time as a clinician at WVU College of Law was incredibly transformative on my career,” she says.

Leadmon was also involved with the WVU Alumni Association and served as the co-chair for the Mountaineer advisory Council. A figure skater herself, she worked as a figure skating coach at Morgantown Ice Arena.

Leadmon graduated with honors, including as a member of the Order of the Coif. After the bar exam, she plans to start her career as an associate attorney at Dority & Manning, P.A. in Greenville, SC.

“West Virginians are fiercely resilient and always fight for what is right, which are traits I hope to only build upon in my legal career,” Leadmon says. “I am incredibly proud to be a WVU alumna, and my time at WVU has forever left a mark on me. I will forever bleed gold and blue.”

in beginning a Bible Church. Twenty-eight people came to the first service.

The Church met for a year and a half at the Hurricane Woman's Club, and then was able to buy property, without any outside financial assistance, on the corner of Second Street in Hurricane.

Within two years, the Church bought the adjoining McGhee property and now occupies five buildings.

- 1/2 cup shredded carrots
- 1/2 cup shredded red cabbage
- 1 cup shredded green cabbage
- 4 tablespoons honey
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1 tablespoon mustard
- 1 tablespoon white vinegar
- salt, to taste
- pepper, to taste
- 12 tortillas
- 2 tablespoons sour cream
- 1 lime, cut into wedges

Slice half of one apple into thick wedges; reserve. Slice remaining half into thin sticks; reserve. Slice second apple into thin wedges; reserve.

Cut pork crosswise into 1-inch round medallions. Coat pork medallions with olive oil, salt and pepper then add to saucepan over medium heat. Add thick apple wedges to saucepan.

Add rosemary to saucepan and cook 2-3 minutes. Flip pork and cook 2-3 minutes until pork is slightly golden and cooked through.

Let pork rest 3 minutes then slice into strips.

In serving bowl, toss thin apple sticks, carrots, red cabbage and green cabbage. Mix honey, mayonnaise, mustard and vinegar. Add salt and pepper, to taste.

Mix dressing and cabbage; refrigerate at least 1 hour prior to serving.

Top tortillas with pork, slaw, sour cream and squeezes of lime. Top with thin apple wedges.

BASIC BIBLE

Be Strong and Courageous

Joshua 1:1-6; 11:16-23

Before us are the very words which God spoke to Joshua following the death of Moses. Joshua was in the presence of Moses on Mount Sinai when God spoke to Moses forty years earlier, but there is no record that God directed any instruction to Joshua at that time.

God chose Joshua as the successor of Moses long before Moses died (Deut. 1:38), but God did not speak to Joshua until after Moses died (v. 1).

In the text before us, God instructs Joshua to step up and lead the children of Israel into the promised land. God directs Joshua to arise and go over the Jordan River into the land which He has promised them (v. 2). God states that every place that the sole of his (Joshua's) foot shall tread shall be given to him (v. 3). This is the same promise given to Moses (See Deut. 11:24).

God specifies the boundaries of the land which is given (v. 4). The wilderness sets the desert areas as bounds to the south and to the east of Canaan. The northern and northeastern borders are set by Lebanon and the Euphrates River. The Great Sea (Mediterranean) shall be the western border. Again, this is the same promise given to Moses. And, it is the same promise given to Abraham (Gen. 15:18). The promise of the land was first given to Abraham, then to Isaac (Gen. 26:3), then to Jacob (Gen. 28:13), then to Moses, and, now, to Joshua. God's promises do not go away. They remain forever and shall be fulfilled according to His schedule.

The task that God has placed before Joshua was overwhelming. The same giants which caused Israel to refuse to go into the land almost forty years earlier were still in the land. In verse 5, Joshua hears comforting words. God tells him that no one will be able to stand before him. God states that He will be with him as He was with Moses. Joshua witnessed the closeness of God to Moses as had no other man. Joshua, and Joshua alone, was present when God gave Moses the law upon Sinai. The task before Joshua is great, but God's reassurance is greater. God gives His personal promise: "I will not fail thee, nor forsake thee." God charges Joshua to be strong and to be of good courage because he (Joshua) shall administer the giving of the land to the people. Joshua is to be the agent responsible for fulfilling God's promise to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

All New Testament believers have been given a like assurance. Jesus said, "Whatsoever ye shall ask the Father in my name, he will give it to you" (Jn. 16:23). We have the personal promise of the Son.

God gave Joshua a mission. It is not a mission which God intended Joshua to achieve independent of Him. God expected Joshua to rely upon Him. God made it possible for Joshua to succeed. God makes it possible for all believers to do His will.

Joshua's conquest of Canaan ends with the defeat of the king of Hazor and his allies (11:1-13). The closing verses of chapter 16 summarize the conquests which gave the children of Israel unchallenged control of the land that God had promised to the seed of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

Verse 18 states that Joshua made war with these kings a long time. What is a long time? Caleb was 85 years old when he asked that Hebron be made part of his inheritance. Caleb was 40 years old when he went to spy out the promised land (one year into the 40 years in the wilderness), making him 79 when the children of Israel crossed over the Jordan. It would appear that six years (85-79) was the long time of Joshua's conquest.

We note that all cities with the exception of Gibeon and Gaza, Gath and Ashdod (v. 19, 22) were destroyed. God caused all to come up against Israel in battle such that Joshua would destroy them and their land given to the seed of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

God moved the enemies of Israel to act in a manner that resulted in the keeping of His promise. The scriptures that God has given us contain unfulfilled prophecies (promises that God shall keep). The promise of Christ's return and the judgment that shall fall upon all the world will be hastened by the actions of the enemies of the present nation of Israel. Bible believing Christians have knowledge of the future — we have the written record of God's promises. God has given us knowledge and the instruction: "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world." Let us do as Joshua did. For He is with us even unto the end.
