Baby's First Christmas to Be Published Dec. 21

The Hurricane Breeze special Christmas edition featuring Baby's First Christmas has been published every year since 1984. This year's Baby's First Christmas will be published on December 21st. Proud parents or grandparents or anyone else who wants to do something nice can enter baby by sending a photograph and some information about the baby such as birthday, parents, brothers, sisters, grandparents, favorite baby food, favorite toys, or just about any interesting material that you have about the baby or babies.

You may write up baby's Christmas message, but it is not necessary. We can do the write up if we have the information. This is a free service. There is no charge. It is our gift to the community.

The deadline to submit a write up or information and photograph is December 7. The photo may be submitted by email or by the USPS. If a physical photo is submitted and you wish to have baby's picture returned, you must do ALL of the following: (1) have baby's name on back of picture, (2) name and address of person to

whom the photograph is to be returned, and (3) a stamped, addressed envelope which matches the address on the back of the photograph. The picture should be of the baby alone unless it is baby posed with a pet. The only multiple person photos that we allow are for twins.

To be eligible for Baby's First Christmas, a baby must be born after December 25, 2022.

Some late November and December babies born in 2022 may not have entered last year's Baby's First Christmas because photographs were not available in time to meet the deadline. These babies and these babies only are eligible for Baby's Second Christmas. The deadline for Baby's Second Christmas is the same as for Baby's First Christmas, December 8.

Please try to enter early and avoid the last minute rush.

County Commission Expends \$289,500 for Putnam Public Service District Building

The last order of business on the agenda for the October 24 Putnam County Commission meeting was to finalize the purchase of the former Putnam PSD headquarters at 74 Scott Depot Road. The Commission unanimously

approved the payment of \$289,500 for the building and property.

Commission President Andy Skidmore said that 911 Director Mikyle White had identified the building as a location where OEM could provide supplemental services. The building will also provide space for other future needs that may arise.

"The purchase price, just under \$300,000. I think the appraised value was a little over \$500,000. It was a no-brainer business decision for us to take the building and

put it to good use," Skidmore stated.

In other business of note, the commission approved pay raises recommended by County Clerk Brian Wood for poll workers in next year's elections. Wood asked that Early Voting workers received an increase from \$10/hr to \$12/hr and Seasonal Workers be increased from \$10.50 to \$13/hr; Poll Worker Training increased to \$75 and Election Day Workers from \$175 to \$200.

Wood said that the

increases were justified based upon rates paid by other counties. The new rates will place Putnam poll worker pay above the statewide average and were needed to recruit new workers.

The commission recognized the Winfield High School Golf Team with a resolution. The team won the Class AA State Championship by 48 strokes and placed four on the All-State team.

Apocalypse, 1833 — the Night the Stars Fell

Editor's Note:

The 190th anniversary of the most spectacular meteor shower in recorded history is upcoming on November 12th. The meteor shower that produced "the Night the Stars Fell" will make an encore performance between November 5 and 18 with a peak sighting rate projected for the 18th. This issue of the Breeze seems the proper time to reprint an article submitted by the late Charles Ray Harper in 1994.

Mr. Harper's article follows:

At two o'clock of the morning of November 12, 1833, the farmers and plantation owners of the Kanawha Valley were aroused from their sleep by the cries of the slaves and free people. Mingled with the cries for mercy were the barking of dogs and sounds

of other farm animals.

When the people looked out they saw a chilling sight. From horizon to horizon the sky was filled with what appeared to be stars falling like a billion sky-rockets that burst and showered the earth in a fiery torrent. It was a sight never seen before or since.

A Boston writer wrote, "There were over 240,000 meteors which fell near the city." Another writer described his impression of the meteors from the Niagara Falls Gorge area, "The falling stars did not come down at random but appeared to emanate from a single point in the heavens, the star Leo, near Gamma, and fell in a sweeping arc. They were extinguished some 20 feet from the earth as a candle is snuffed out."

The people of the Kanawha Valley area were

terrified. People fell on their knees praying, and people repented everywhere.

A New York newspaperman said that the night was so bright that a person could read a newspaper at 3:00 A.M. in the morning.

The scene was truly awful with cries and moans everywhere, for never did the rain fall thicker than did the meteors fall towards earth, going to the east, west, north and south. In a word, the whole heavens seemed in motion.

The people thought it was a prophesy right out of the Book of Revelation. Prayer meetings were held daily for weeks, and church attendance increased enormously.

A quote from a story by Irene Ambler in The Hurricane Breeze - "My

the Old Beech Grove school house, had many conversions for Jesus Christ. This was in the early winter of 1886. Rev. Young visited the converts once a month during the winter and in March had a two week revival, at the close of which he organized the church, with Tom Howard as Clerk and Floyd Adkins as Deacon. In March 1887 it was, and in respect to the one that got the church organized, the church was called Young Chapel. They then elected Thompson Young as the first pastor. He served three years, and passed on to his reward. They then elected J .F. Roberts, who served faithfully for twelve years, having great success. Tarr also received special recognition at the commission meeting for his role in providing a new funding stream for fire departments throughout the state. Teays Valley Fire Department Chief John Smoot presented Tarr with a TVFD helmet bearing Tarr's name. Smoot said that Senator Tarr caused needed funding of \$12 million to become available to fire departments during the span of three weeks. Smoot said that the quick response to his request was unexpected.

great-grandfather Robert A. Forth was a very small child, little more than a baby, the night the 'stars fell.' Great-grandfather and his father, who was also named Robert A. Forth, were in a group going to a mill on Upper Falls. (My great-grandfather, Robert A. Forth, was called "Old Rob" when he grew up; my Dad, Robert F. Forth, was called "Young Rob," and my father's father was my Grandpa Philip Sheridan.)

take a lunch and head out for Upper Falls. They would leave home after supper in order to get to the mill early in the morning, trade their grain for the precious meal and flour and then come on back home. My Grandpa Phillip Sheridan's father, although such a small boy, was allowed to go to mill that night with his father and the other men.

"The wagon route taken in that long ago time was essentially the same as now - on Route 60 When the caravan of wagons came to the top of Coal Mountain, Grandpa said, 'All the stars fell from Heaven.; It would perhaps take an hour for Grandpa to tell the reactions of those farmers, who knew very little, if anything, about astronomy; but it is a pretty sure thing that they were totally terrified. Grandpa Phillip Sheridan said his father told him, 'We went

on to Upper Falls. We didn't know what to do. We were too afraid to turn back and too afraid to go on, but we thought it was the end of the world and it didn't make any difference."

Mrs. Ambler related that the phenomenon continued until daybreak. When the armers returned home, they found their families just as stunned as they were.

The mystery of the falling stars has been solved.

It was a meteor shower called the Lenoid Meteors which appear about two days around November 17 each year, the last good one being on November 17, 1966. The meteor shower in 1833 started the study of meteor showers. The next good one should be on November 18, 1999.

I have always thought that this was an Eastern phenomenon, but in my studies on Indians I came

across a fact that the Cheyannes, Comanches, Arapahoes and all the Plains Indians told time by "seven winters from the winter the stars fell." (In white man's time that was 1840, seven years from 1833.) As you can see, the Plains Indians also knew of the night the stars fell.

Anyway, it was many a day before Putnam County and the Kanawha Valley forgot that dreadful night of November 12, 1833.







BASIC BIBLE

Rebuke and Repentance

Judges 10:10-18

When men write a book of history, all pertinent information is recorded and most inconsequential happenings are omitted. The book of Judges is both history and scripture. It was written by men inspired by the Holy Spirit to give men knowledge of God and His ways. The details which are before us are there such that we might know His will and His being and respond in fitting manner.

The text before us focuses upon details which reveal the character of the children of Israel and the manner in which God chose to deal with their failings. To understand how this picture applies to believers of today, first consider what fell upon Israel.

"And the children of Israel cried unto the Lord, saying, We have sinned against thee, both because we have forsaken our God, and also served Baalim" (v. 10). Israel was guilty of turning away from God and breaking the commandments which they had promised to keep. Their guilt, however, was not why that they cried out to the Lord. Israel confessed to their failure to keep their promise because they were in distress. The Lord had delivered them into the hands of the Philistines and the into hands of Ammon (v. 7) because Israel had done evil and served others gods. Verse 6 lists Baalim, Ashtaroth, the gods of Syria, the gods of Zidon, the gods of Moab, the gods of the children of Ammon, and the gods of the Philistines. By count, there are no fewer than seven different gods. The number seven represents completion. Israel had completely turned away from the Lord God.

The Lord answered Israel's cry for help on seven different previous occasions. He had delivered Israel from the oppression of their enemies so that they might honor, not dishonor, Him. Israel had repeatedly dishonored Him by serving other gods.

Verse 11 begins with the words: "And the Lord said unto the children of Israel". Scripture does not reveal the manner in which God spoke the words that He spoke, only the words which He spoke. God told Israel that He had repeatedly delivered them from their enemies only to have them (Israel) repeatedly forsake Him and serve other gods. In verse 13, the Lord states that He will deliver them no more.

God had delivered Israel from its enemies such that they might serve Him and Him alone. In serving false gods, Israel had made its own bed — a bed in which it must now lie. The Lord said, "Go and cry unto the gods which ye have chosen; let them deliver you in the time of your tribulation" (v. 14).

Verses 15 and 16 reveal that the children of Israel heard what God had spoken. Their words, "... do thou unto us whatsoever seemeth good to thee," indicate that the children of Israel realized that they were to bear the consequences of their actions. Rather than to call upon the false gods of the land, they asked for unmerited mercy. This plea was also an open admission that they were unable to deliver themselves from the consequences of their sin. They put away their false gods and looked to God alone for deliverance.

The Lord did not respond immediately. The picture before us closes with a leaderless people gathered at Mizpeh (v. 17-18). God would later raise up Jephthah to deliver Israel from Ammon and Samson to deliver them from the Philistines.

America is not Israel and believers of today are not Israel. God, however, is unchanging. The Lord had delivered Israel from slavery and had given them His commandments. The Lord has delivered believers from sin and has given us the commandments to love one another and to broadcast the truth which He has revealed to us.

Israel was leaderless because they had turned from God. They had not done what God had told them to do. We, too, fail when we do not do as the Lord has commanded. The Lord has given us the Comforter who reveals all truth to us but we do as Israel did. We do not hear. We become leaderless.

Let us back up and review the sequence of interactions between God and His people again. Israel turned from God. God delivered Israel into the hands of its enemies. Israel cried out to God. God delivered Israel from its enemies. Israel served and honored God for a period of time. This sequence repeated and repeated again until God ended the sequence. God did not deliver Israel. God told Israel to seek help elsewhere. Israel had tried false gods; they needed to try something different. They did; they put away false gods and served God, their Lord. God had not delivered them but Israel chose to serve and honor God. They served God because God is God.

Could believers experience a similar scenario? When we fail to love one another and fail to proclaim the truth which we have received, the Holy Spirit is grieved and we are without a leader. If we return to serve and worship God because He is, He shall surely do what "seemeth good." His Spirit shall lead us in all times in all places.

It "seemeth good" to God to raise up of Jephthah and Samson to judge Israel. The closing words of verse 16 state that God's soul was "grieved for the misery of Israel." The Holy Spirit of God has moved human authors to reveal God's grief to us. God wants us to know that He is grieved when we suffer for reason of our doing as He has said to do.

Let us strive to do as He has commanded, knowing that He will surely correct all injustice.

The following events happened on these dates in West Virginia history. To read more, go to e-WV: The West Virginia Encyclopedia at www.wvencyclopedia.org.

Nov. 2, 1859: John Brown was convicted of murder, treason, and insurrection, in the Jefferson County Courthouse at Charles Town. Brown's raid on Harpers Ferry galvanized the nation, further alienating North and South

and drastically reducing any possible middle ground for compromise.

Nov. 2, 1952: Tri-State Airport in Wayne County was dedicated, with the first official landing made at 11 a.m. by Piedmont Airlines.

Nov. 2, 1996: Baseball player Toni Stone died. Born in Bluefield, she joined the Negro American League in 1953, becoming the first woman to play pro baseball in a previously all-male major league.

Nov. 3, 1947: Kanawha Airport (now Yeager International Airport) was dedicated. World War I ace Capt. Eddie Rickenbacker was among the dignitaries present.

Nov. 4-5, 1985: Heavy rains led to devastating floods in parts of West Virginia. Forty-seven people were killed, and several towns were severely damaged.

Nov. 5, 1891: Alfred Earle "Greasy" Neale was born in Parkersburg. He was one of West Virginia's greatest all-around athletes.

Nov. 5, 1922: Cecil Underwood was born at Josephs Mills in Tyler County. Underwood, West Virginia's 25th and 32nd governor, served as the state's youngest and oldest chief executive.

Nov. 6, 1863: Confederate troops led

by Brig. Gen. John Echols were defeated at Droop Mountain by a larger federal force led by Brig. Gen. William W. Averell. This was one of the most important Civil War battles fought on West Virginia soil.

Nov. 6, 1923: A methane gas explosion killed 27 men inside the Glen Rogers coal mine in Wyoming County. The mine, which opened in 1921, became one of the state's largest. A total of 160 fatalities over a 31-year period occurred at the mine before it was closed.

Nov. 7, 1775: The historic Forks-of-Cheat Baptist Church was organized about six miles north of Morgantown. It is the oldest church with continuous records west of the Alleghenies in West Virginia.


